

## 3<sup>rd</sup> Street to 7<sup>th</sup> Street 16<sup>th</sup> Street to 20<sup>th</sup> Street Advisory Bike Lane

- A preferred space for bicyclists and motorists to accommodate two-way vehicular traffic and provide a prioritized space for bicyclists.
- Advisory bike lanes have been installed in multiple locations in the US and Canada.
- Proposed to accommodate two-way traffic, bicycles and parking on both sides within the existing pavement.





# 14<sup>th</sup> Street to 16<sup>th</sup> Street Green Alley Concept

- > Appropriate for low volume facilities with narrow right-of-way.
- Green alleys use sustainable materials to create an inviting public space and manage stormwater runoff.
- Concept is being proposed between 14<sup>th</sup> Street and 16<sup>th</sup> Street to maintain alley character.





# 20<sup>th</sup> Place Cycle Track

- An exclusive bike facility separated from vehicular traffic.
- Proposed along 20<sup>th</sup>
  Place between Oak
  Street and Sheridan Street
  to provide connection
  between existing
  pedestrian bridge and
  shared use path along
  the east side of SR 51.







# Thomas Road/SR-51 NB Ramps Intersection Bike/Pedestrian Crossing

- > High traffic volume and speed area.
- Proposed to narrow right turn lane from two lanes to one lane and provide a shorter crossing.
- Install high visibility cross walks.
- > Coordination with ADOT.
