19th Avenue & Cave Creek Wash Pedestrian Trail

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q1: What is the history of this project?

The Cave Creek Wash Trail is part of the City of Phoenix trail system. This 18-mile-long recreational trail along the Cave Creek wash currently ends on the east side of 19th Avenue south of Greenway Road, and begins again south of the Cave Creek Municipal Golf Course driveway.

The purpose of this project is to connect the approximately 2,000-foot gap in the Cave Creek Wash Trail on the west side of 19th Avenue, providing better connectivity to the regional Sun Circle Trail, a 10-foot wide trail that is ultimately planned to be a 140-mile-long multi-use path, which is part of the Maricopa County Regional Trail System.

Q2: What type of crossing delineation will there be on 19th Avenue?

The project will include a standard mid-block crossing with access ramps on both sides of 19th Avenue at the Cave Creek Wash Trail alignment. Trail users will also have the option of crossing at the intersection of 19th Avenue and Greenway Road. Once the project is complete, City of Phoenix Traffic Operations will evaluate the need for future crossing delineation. Possibilities include signage, crosswalk, and hawk-signal.

Q3: What will the trail surface be?

This section of the trail will be constructed with an asphalt surface which will match portions of the existing trail.

Q4: Will the existing trail to the east of 19th Avenue (Cave Creek Wash Trail) be improved with this project?

The Cave Creek Wash Trail beyond the tie-in point is not included in this project.
