
Oak Street Improvements - Bicycle and Pedestrian Facilities

How can we create an improved "low-stress" bicycle and pedestrian facilities along Oak Street?

The Plan calls for two-way protected cycle track, bi-directional bike lanes, green paint at conflict points, and new sidewalks/ sidewalk improvements throughout;



- Existing crossings of major roadways will be utilized and enhanced for safe crossings;
- Roadway geometry at intersections, and textured asphalt applications will be applied at key locations to slow traffic and alert drivers to cyclists and pedestrians;



- Additional wayfinding signs, lighting and drought tolerant landscaping will be installed at select locations;
- More detailed work and community input on the specifics of the project would occur in the final phases of the project.









Oak Street Improvements Project (Recommended Plan)

Process

- Completed plans and identified "preferred alternatives" utilizing the MAG Design Assistance program.
- One public meeting in the corridor to gather final input from the community on the Recommended Plan before it goes to Transportation and Infrastructure Subcommittee for final approval.
