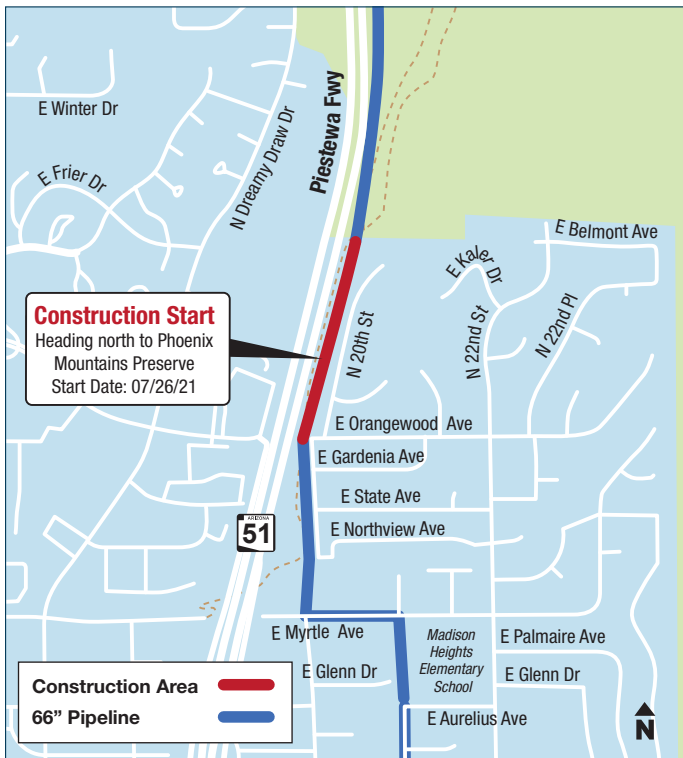


The City of Phoenix has contracted with Kiewit Corporation and Garney Construction to install the Drought Pipeline between 20th Street and Orangewood Avenue and 32nd Street and Shea Boulevard. Construction began in June 2021.

### Current Construction Activities:

- Construction of the 66" pipeline along the Perl Charles Memorial Trail (1A) is scheduled to start in this area on **July 26, 2021** and is scheduled to take 3-4 months.
- Construction will start in the area of 20th Street and Orangewood Avenue and proceed north toward the Phoenix Mountains Preserve.
- Water service interruptions are not expected.



### Drought Pipeline Project:

Phoenix Water is building new pipelines and pump stations to ensure all customers will have access to safe, clean and reliable drinking water for generations to come. With shortages looming on the Colorado River, these improvements will provide a way to move water supplies to those areas at risk for shortage.

- Working hours will primarily be 6:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Monday through Saturday. Some construction may require night or Sunday work.
- Business, residential and pedestrian access will be maintained.
- No on-street parking will be allowed in the construction area.
