### 31st Street, Future Booster Pump Station to Greenway Road

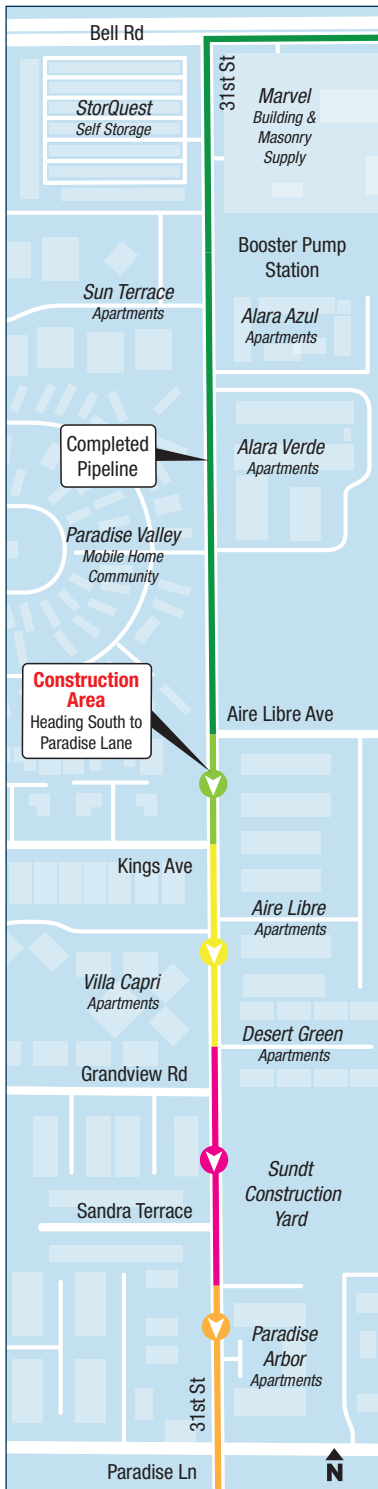
- 66" pipeline construction will start at the future booster pump station on 31st Street south of Bell Road. The pipeline will head south on 31st Street to Greenway Road.
- Each closure is expected to last one to two weeks.
- Sections of 31st Street will be closed as construction moves from north to south.
- Working hours will primarily be  
 October 1 - April 30: 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday through Saturday.  
 May 1 - September 30: 6:00 AM to 4:00 PM, Monday through Saturday.  
 Some construction may require night or weekend work.
- No on-street parking in the construction area.
- Water service interruptions are not expected.
