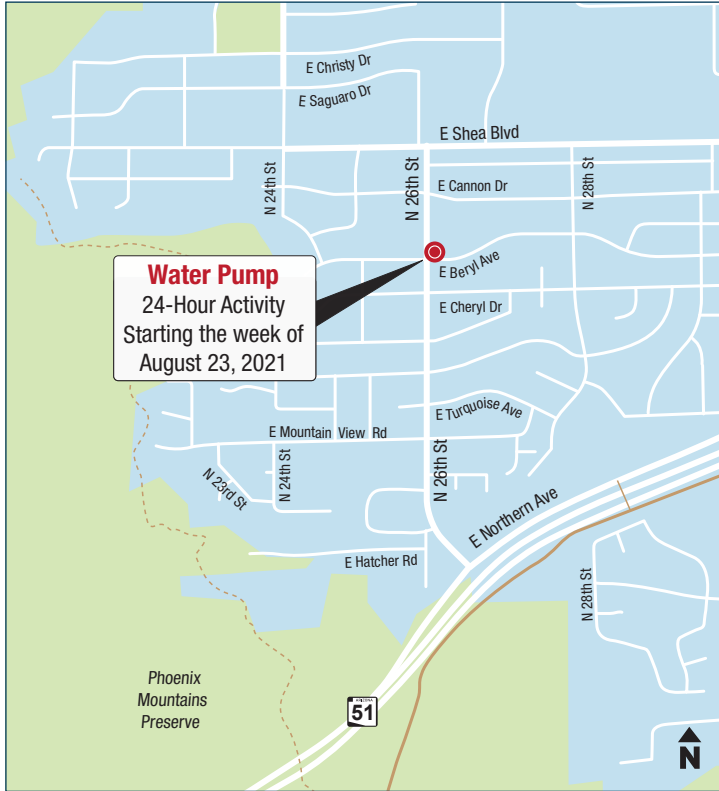


The City of Phoenix has contracted with Kiewit Construction to rehabilitate an existing pipeline in the Phoenix Mountains Preserve in coordination with the Drought Pipeline Project.

Pipeline Rehabilitation 24-hour Activity: 26th Street and Beryl Avenue



Kiewit Construction will be operating a water pump in the area of 26th Street and Beryl Avenue to remove excess water during rehabilitation of an existing water main in the Phoenix Mountains Preserve. Starting the week of August 23, 2021 a pump will run 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for approximately 4 months in the area of 26th Street and Beryl Avenue. Every effort is being made to mitigate any noise disturbance.

Drought Pipeline Project:

Phoenix Water is building new pipelines and pump stations to ensure all customers will have access to safe, clean and reliable drinking water for generations to come. With shortages looming on the Colorado River, these improvements will provide a way to move water supplies to those areas at risk for shortage.

- Business, residential and pedestrian access will be maintained.
- No on-street parking will be allowed in the construction area.

Construction schedules are subject to change for a variety of reasons, including weather and personnel/material availability. City of Phoenix and its contractors recognize the inconvenience of construction and we thank you for your patience and support!
