### NOTICE OF ELECTION

#### COUNCIL ELECTION SEPTEMBER 1, 2009

The City of Phoenix will hold the regularly scheduled City Council Election on Tuesday, September 1, 2009. In this election, voters in Council Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8 will elect council members. There is no election in Districts 1, 3, 5 or 7 this year because the terms for council members are staggered and there is no election for mayor or propositions this year.

A Runoff Election will be held on Tuesday, November 3, 2009 if no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast for an office in the September election.

#### Early Voting

Early voting begins on Monday, August 3. Voters on the permanent early voting list were mailed a notice of the election the week of May 4. Voters on this list will receive a ballot by mail unless the voter returns the notice or notifies the City Clerk not to send the ballot by Saturday, July 18. Voters not on the permanent list may submit a signed, written request for an early ballot by mail. Forms will be available at [http://phoenix.gov/ELECTION/ebr\\_form.pdf](http://phoenix.gov/ELECTION/ebr_form.pdf) and at city public service counters and city libraries. The City Clerk must receive a voter's signed request for a ballot by mail no later than Friday, August 21.

#### Voting at the Polls

Polling places will be open from 6 a.m. until 7 p.m. on Election Day, Tuesday, September 1. A voter's polling place will be identified on the back cover of the Sample Ballot Pamphlet. This Pamphlet will be mailed in late July to each residence in Districts 2, 4, 6 and 8 where a registered voter resides. Voters can also use a polling place locator application on [phoenix.gov](http://phoenix.gov) to identify their district, precinct and polling place, and see a map of the location.
