EARLY VOTING BEGINS

Early voting for the City of Phoenix Mayor and Council Election starts on Oct. 13. In this election, registered voters who reside in the city of Phoenix will elect a mayor and voters in Districts 1 and 5 will elect a council member. This election is required by the City Charter because no candidate for these offices received a majority of the votes cast in the August Election.

The deadline to register to vote in this election is Monday, Oct. 10. County and State offices will be closed on Oct. 10 for the Columbus Day Holiday; therefore, voters are encouraged to register prior to Oct. 10, or to use servicearizona.com to register on Oct. 10.

Concurrent Elections on November 8

Maricopa County will also be conducting an election for several school districts within the City of Phoenix on November 8. There will be separate ballots for the two elections. Voters may vote by mail, or at the polls, in either election.

Early Voting by Mail

Phoenix voters who are on the permanent early voting list will be mailed an early ballot unless they have elected not to receive one for this election. Voters who received a ballot by mail for the August 2011 Mayor and Council Election will receive a ballot by mail for the Runoff Election. Any voters not on the permanent early voting list who wish to receive an early ballot by mail may submit a request for an early ballot to the City, or to Maricopa County, or to both, but must ensure that the signed, written request is **received** by either the City Clerk or by the County Elections office no later than 5 p.m. on Friday, October 28, 2011. Request forms for a county ballot are available at recorder.maricopa.gov or by calling the County Elections Department at 602-506-1511.

Early Voting Locations and Accessible Voting Equipment

Several early voting sites will be available throughout the city for voters to cast an early ballot or exchange a damaged or spoiled early ballot received by mail. Accessible voting devices that permit voters with disabilities to vote independently will be available at these sites. The list of locations, with the dates and times each are open, can be found in the Sample Ballot Pamphlet, by calling the City Clerk Department at the number below or at phoenix.gov/election.
