Limited Time Only!

Before bringing your tree...

- Remove all decorations, lights and tinsel. Remove the tree stand, metal stakes and nails.
- To transport your tree, tie it down with material that can be untied or cut easily.
- Leave the unbagged tree only at the specified location within the park. Look for specially marked drop-off bins.
- Sites accept single trees from City of Phoenix residents. Multiple tree loads should go directly to disposal facilities.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Many common household materials are considered hazardous, or need special disposal. Phoenix holds regular household hazardous waste (HHW) collection events throughout the city every year.

Acceptable HHW Materials at Collection Events

- Computers/printers
- Antifreeze, paint, oil, and car batteries
- Pool chemicals
- Brake-transmission-power steering fluid/degreasers
- Gasoline/diesel fuel/additives
- 5 tires per household (rims OK) *No oversized tires*
- Air conditioners/heat pumps
- Varnish/turpentine/linseed oil/solvents/adhesives
- Pesticides/herbicides
- Fire extinguishers/propane gas tanks 5 gallons or less
- Refrigerators/freezers

Acceptable Non-HHW Materials at Collection Events

- Washers/dryers/water heaters
- Evaporative coolers
- Plastic bags
- Televisions (no console TVs)
- Stoves/dishwashers
- Shredded paper

Unacceptable Materials at Collection Events

- Regular refuse and bulk trash
- Commercial waste
- Bio-medical waste
- Residential appliances. Small metal appliances, such as toasters, irons, pots and pans, can be placed in your blue Phoenix Recycles container.
- Ammunition, explosives, or fireworks. These items may be taken to the Police Property Management Bureau, Special Window, at 100 E. Elwood St., 1/2 mile north of Broadway Rd., M-F, 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. except on city-observed holidays. Closed at 12 p.m. on Wednesdays. You may also take them to your nearest police precinct station 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. For more information, please call the Bureau at 602-261-8371. - Large quantities of residential or commercial wastes will not be accepted. Contact private disposal companies for disposal of both commercial wastes and large quantities of residential wastes.

When bringing your HHW don't forget to...

- Bring your current Phoenix water bill as proof of City of Phoenix residency. Residents of other cities, please call your local solid waste service provider.
- Seal items in their original containers or CLEARLY label all items not in their original containers. Place items in a cardboard box.
- Place the cardboard box in the trunk of your car or in the bed of your pickup truck. Keep items away from passengers.
- Follow directions on signs and from event staff, once you reach the event site. Drive carefully and watch for others.
- Event staff will unload materials from your vehicle. Please stay inside your vehicle!

Between HHW collection events...

Motor oil and car batteries can be taken to some local auto parts stores for free. Call first – materials accepted and hours of operation are subject to change.

Allow small amounts of latex paint (1/3 gallon or less) to dry and harden. Place open can of dried paint in refuse container.

Use or burn up liquid propane in small (1 lb.) canisters. Place empty canister in refuse container. Bring BBQ cylinders/tanks to HHW collection events.

City Disposal Facilities

City disposal facilities accept car batteries, up to 5 gallons of motor oil per residence, appliances that use refrigerants, and up to 5 tires (no oversized tires) per residence per year. Bring your current Phoenix water bill as proof of City of Phoenix residency.

Batteries

Alkaline and carbon-zinc batteries, typically flashlight batteries in sizes A, AA, AAA, C, and D, should be bagged and tied, and placed in the garbage container.

Rechargeable batteries that are nickel-cadmium (Ni-Cd), nickel-metal hydride (Ni-MH), lithium ion (Li-ion), or small, sealed lead batteries, weighing less than 2 lbs., may be disposed for free at companies that belong to Call2Recycle. To find the nearest one, visit www.rbc.org

Special Needs Pickup Service

If you have a physical condition that prevents you from going to an event, and you do not have a friend, neighbor, or relative who can go for you, send an e-mail to pwsolve@phoenix.gov or call Customer Service at 602-262-7251 at least one week before the event. Special needs pickups will be scheduled the last Thursday and Friday before the event.

Paint Distribution

On the second Tuesday after each HHW event, latex paint will be available for distribution to Phoenix residents. Up to 15 gallons per household will be given on a first-come first-served basis. Please call 602-262-7251 for availability.

2008 HHW COLLECTION EVENTS

All collections are conducted from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. except the June and September events. Hours of collection for June and September are 7 a.m. to 12 p.m. All collections are held on Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

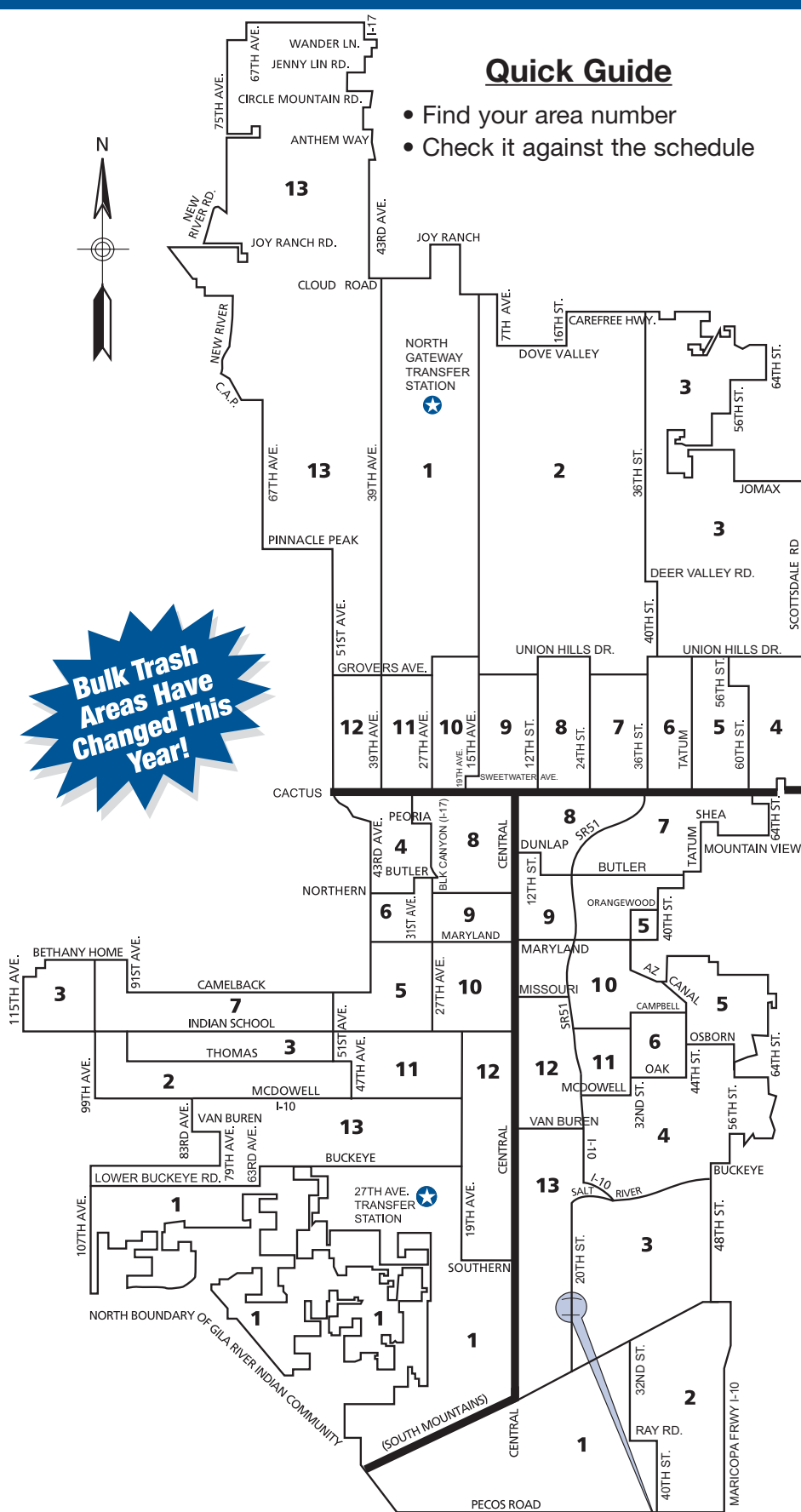

WHERE TO PLACE BULK TRASH

Bulk trash must be placed at least 5 feet from any object such as fence, utility pole, cable box, water meter, mailbox, vehicle, garbage container, basketball hoop etc. All material must be neatly stacked.

Alley Collection

Place bulk trash only behind your own property. Do not place trash behind a neighbor's property, or on the opposite side of the alley, or in utility easements.

Curbside Collection

Place bulk trash at the front edge of your property behind and parallel to the sidewalk or curb. Do not place trash on the sidewalk or in the street.

ONE WEEK RULE

City ordinance allows only 9 days prior to the scheduled collection week to put bulk trash out for collection. It is a violation of City ordinance to place bulk trash out before the listed 'Placement Can Begin Only On' date.

BULK TRASH CREWS DO NOT PICK UP...

- Loose debris and litter. Please sweep or rake after collection if necessary.
- Loose grass, leaves, weeds, twigs, and hedge clippings. It must be bagged or boxed and securely tied to be collected.
- Household hazardous waste (HHW), such as antifreeze, pool chemicals, oil, batteries, and paint. See the HHW section for proper disposal.
- More than 20 cubic yards in volume per residence. 20 cubic yards is a pile approximately 10 X 9 X 6 ft.
- Materials such as bricks, concrete, dirt, rocks, asphalt, and roofing shingles/tiles.
- Construction materials in excess of 25 lbs. or over 4 feet long generated by a residence.
- Any construction material generated by a contractor.
- Metal or car parts in excess of 20 lbs. or over 4 feet long.
- Any type or size of tire.
- Glass such as windows, shower doors, patio doors, mirrors, fluorescent tubes etc.
- Appliances that use refrigerants such as freezers, refrigerators, and air conditioners.

FAILURE TO COMPLY MAY RESULT IN ENFORCEMENT ACTION.

BULK TRASH QUESTIONS? PLEASE ASK! The City's bulk trash service is a great way to keep your property clean. It is a popular service, but can be misused. If something is unclear, it is best to contact the Public Works Department prior to placing material out for collection. Errors will require correction, often by the customer. Any other solid waste questions? Please Ask!

WEEKLY GARBAGE & RECYCLABLES COLLECTION

To ensure your container is collected:

- Bag and securely tie garbage and grass.
- Curbside containers must be placed at the front edge of the curb no later than 5:30 a.m. on collection days AND removed from the curb by 5:30 a.m. the day after collection.
- Curbside containers must not be blocked.
- Place container handles to face the residence.
- Do not place or stack any material around or on top of containers. Material not in a container will not be collected.
- The lid must be closed.
- Do not place household hazardous waste in a container. See schedule of hazardous waste collections.

SPECIAL RECYCLING COLLECTIONS

Appliance and Electronics Recycling

For a nominal fee, five appliances can be picked up at the front of your property just behind the sidewalk, or behind the curb if there is no sidewalk. To verify cost and availability, please contact Solid Waste Customer Service.

Plastic Bag and Shredded Paper

Phoenix residents may recycle their plastic bags and shredded paper at household hazardous waste collection events or the two transfer stations. See hours of operation and maps below.

Cardboard Recycling Program

If you have a large number of boxes, flatten and stack them, then call Solid Waste Customer Service to arrange a special free collection. For a small number of cardboard boxes, flatten and place them in your blue recycling container.

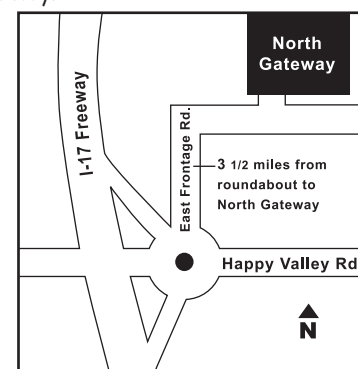

CITY DISPOSAL INFORMATION AND FACILITIES

Saturdays and Sundays are free dumping days for Phoenix residents with proper ID, and who bring in non-commercial loads of 12,500 lbs. gross vehicle weight or less, properly covered (GVW = vehicle + load + occupants). On weekdays, Phoenix residents must present the bottom half of their most recent water bill, along with matching ID with the same address, for free disposal of one load of 12,500 lbs. or less GVW. All loads NOT properly covered from the point of origin are subject to additional uncovered load fees that are based on the GVW. All fees/rates are subject to change. *CASH ONLY* For more information see our web site, or contact Customer Service by e-mail or telephone.

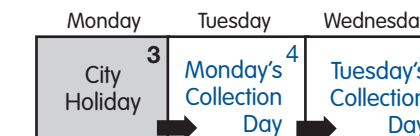

GARBAGE & RECYCLABLES HOLIDAY COLLECTION SCHEDULE

The City of Phoenix follows a special holiday collection schedule when a City holiday falls on a collection day. For example: Residents who normally have garbage or recyclables collection on Monday have collection on Tuesday. This moves Tuesday's collection to Wednesday.

TO USE THIS SCHEDULE

- Locate your numbered area on the map.
- Find the area number on the schedule.
- Bulk trash must be placed out by 6 a.m. on the 'Collection Begins On' date.
- Bulk trash placement is allowed only between your area's listed dates.

WHAT BULK TRASH IS

Bulk trash is material that must not be placed in the garbage or recycling container such as furniture, large appliances and large amounts of vegetation. Vegetation must be less than 4 feet long and 12 inches in diameter, except for palm fronds. Small amounts of vegetation should be bagged and tied, and placed in the garbage container.
