Crime Suppression Efforts (Violent and Property

Burglary

10/06: The 81X squad worked a Silent Witness tip where a suspect who is allegedly committing burglaries was also attempting to sell stolen guns. The officer verified that the subject was staying at the Legacy Suites and contacted the tipster for additional information. This was the same subject that Det. Piña had investigated for theft of hay bails. The 81X officer forwarded the information to the 83X squad to work over the weekend. The 83X squad stopped and contacted the suspect who was a prohibited possessor. He was found to have drugs and a firearm with a defaced derail number in the vehicle and was booked.

10/06: While working an unrelated surveillance, officers from 81X contacted a suspicious person at 3900 N 61st Avenue. They were advised by a citizen that the subject was taking mail from mail boxes the day prior. Officers recovered two items of mail that did not belong to the subject and he was determined to have a file stop out of Scottsdale. The subject was transported to the precinct where postal authorities were notified and responded. The subject also had a cell phone on his possession and the officer was able to determine that it was taken in a burglary from vehicle earlier that day. Although a true victim could not be located for the mail, the suspect was positively identified in a photo line up from the burglary from vehicle incident and booked into jail.

10/10: The 83X squad assisted the 82X squad with a burglary investigation at 20** N. 57th Avenue, writing the search warrant for 82X. Two of the suspects were arrested in a stolen vehicle with items taken in a burglary. Additional items of evidence were recovered from the home, two suspects booked and two additional suspects identified.

10/15: The Precinct's Property Crimes Liaison received information about 35** W. Coronado being involved in the pirating of DVDs. On this date, the officers went to the location with a probation officer and conducted a search of the residence. They saw evidence of pirating so they stopped their search, contacted Sgt. Dave Lake of 700 and wrote a search warrant. A total of 3,486 DVDs and 300 plus music DVDs, as well as a DVD burning device, were found. The suspect was booked for Unlawful Copying of Sale of Sounds or Images, a C3F.

10/20: The Property Crimes Liaisons assisted Property Crimes with the follow-up of a burglary suspect. While there, the suspect was found hiding in a closet under clothes and arrested for aggravated assault, resisting arrest and the father was arrested for hindering prosecution.

10/22: The Precinct's Property Crimes and Auto Theft Detectives, as well as officers of the 82X squad, responded to a burglary in progress call at 43** N. 48th Drive where a suspect was stripping a vacant house of copper wiring. The suspect was located at 43** N. 48th Drive and was booked on numerous charges. The suspect was ROP'd as well.

10/28: Officer Walsh of the 82X squad assisted patrol with the apprehension of a burglary suspect who broke into an apartment at 40** N. 44th Ave.

Auto Theft

10/01: The 83X squad recovered a stolen vehicle and arrested one suspect.

10/03: The 83X squad assisted the Auto Theft Liaisons in looking for a suspect in a stolen vehicle ring. The suspect was located and Det. Green, Auto Theft Liaison, responded to interview him.

10/08: The Auto Theft Liaisons responded to priority traffic of a stolen vehicle being followed by the air unit. The detectives took over the investigation from patrol who caught the suspects.

10/29: The Auto Theft Liaisons conducted surveillance in the area of 5400 W. Indian School Rd. for a female that an auto theft detective has probable cause to arrest. The suspect was located and arrested.

10/29: Officers from the 81X squad located and recovered an unoccupied stolen vehicle at 7400 W. Cypress.

Robbery

10/13: The 81X Squad responded on two related armed robberies of Cricket Wireless Stores at 5900 W. McDowell and 3500 W. Van Buren. The suspects are involved in the Grillo Bandito series where a total of 18 armed robberies have occurred.

10/15: Robbery Liaisons responded to a call where students at the high school located at 67th Avenue had information on a street robbery that took place a day prior at 7200 W. McDowell. They interviewed several students who are investigative leads and developed information on a suspect.

10/19: A vehicle equipped with LOJAK was taken at gunpoint by two suspects at 33^{**} W. Polk. A short time later South Mountain Precinct officers received a LOJAK activation at 35th Avenue and Southern. The squad and patrol units responded to assist. The vehicle was located unoccupied in front of a barber shop on the northeast corner. 81X squad officers located the suspects inside the barber shop matching the suspect descriptions. The suspects had property belonging to the victim on their possession and were identified by the victim. The handgun was recovered inside the vehicle and the suspects were booked.

10/29: The Robbery Liaisons received information that there was probable cause on a female suspect wanted for an armed robbery at the Circle K located at 35th Avenue and Roosevelt. The suspect severely beat the clerk causing permanent damage. Det. Piña provided patrol officers with the information and they were able to locate and arrest the suspect. Det. White returned to the precinct that evening where he conducted an interview and booking.

Aggravated Assault / Homicide

10/19: Information was broadcast on a suspect who had assaulted and escaped from a DPS Officer earlier in the morning at I-17 and McDowell. An 81X officer located the suspect at 3400 W. Roosevelt attempting to conceal the handcuffs attached to his left wrist. As additional officers approached the suspect he fled westbound across 35th Avenue jumping fences. The suspect was taken into custody after a brief struggle. The suspect was booked on numerous charges.

10/19: Officers from 81X assisted the Homicide Detail with the surveillance and arrest of a suspect who had severely beat the victim while at the Cross Roads Bar earlier this morning.

Drugs

10/02: The Precinct's Drug Crimes Liaisons investigated a complaint at 38** N. 87th Avenue. They stopped a vehicle leaving there and located an ounce of methamphetamine. Both suspects were booked and the vehicle seized.

10/06: The Precinct's Drug Crimes Liaisons investigated a drug complaint at 71** W. Cambridge Avenue. Four (4) suspects ended up being arrested and an ounce of marijuana, drug paraphernalia and a weapon were found.

10/09: The Precinct's Drug Crimes Liaisons conducted an investigation on 18** N. 38th Place. The homeowner was found to have a felony warrant for his arrest and another subject was later arrested. The seizures at the house were: 1.5 ounces of methamphetamine located in a hidden compartment in the wall, a small quantity of marijuana, \$1000 cash, and several narcotic pills.

10/11: The 83X squad worked two neighborhood narcotic complaints, 51** W. Granada and 38** W. Latham. Although no drug arrests were made, two subjects who had misdemeanor warrants were arrested, 15 traffic citations were written and several vehicles towed.

10/13: The Precinct's Drug Crimes Liaisons conducted a knock and talk at 38** N. 87th Avenue. One suspect was arrested and both narcotic and dangerous drugs located.

10/15: The Precinct's Drug Crimes Liaisons conducted a traffic stop and found 11 bags of methamphetamine and crack cocaine. The vehicle was seized as well as \$346.00 cash.

10/20: The Precinct's Drug Crimes Liaisons wrote a search warrant for 64** W. Van Buren Street. One person was arrested and the following items were seized: 7 ounces of methamphetamine, cutting agents, 15 grams of crack cocaine, 20 gauge shot gun, 22 caliber handgun, and a 25 automatic handgun; the vehicle was seized. The suspect had her 10 year old daughter place the drugs in the daughter's underwear.

10/22: The Precinct's Drug Crimes Liaisons investigated a drug complaint at 31** N. 90th Avenue and ended up writing a search warrant. One arrest was made and the following items seized: ½ gram of heroin, small amount of methamphetamine, 2 grams of marijuana, narcotic pills and drug paraphernalia.

10/22: The 82X Squad worked a narcotics complaints at 43** N. 103rd Ave related to a suspect selling marijuana to residents of the complex and juveniles as they come home from school. They conducted a stop of a vehicle leaving the residence and arrested the driver. Officers found a baggy of marijuana in his possession. A consent search was conducted at the apartment and an additional pound of marijuana was recovered.

10/23: The 83X squad arrested a subject with a forged driver's license from Washington State who had \$12,000 cash on his person. The suspect ended up being deported.

10/24: The 83X squad served a search warrant for the 81K squad at 88** W. Palm Lane. The original suspect arrested was in possession of a concealed weapon and crack cocaine. Eight (8) ounces of cocaine (powder and crack) and methamphetamine was located inside the garage. Two handguns were also located.

10/25: The 83X squad assisted the 83K squad with a search warrant at a location where patrol officers smelled marijuana. The search warrant yielded one pound of marijuana and one pound of methamphetamine.

10/30: The 82X squad conducted surveillance at the Phoenix West Hotel. The vehicle was connected with room #200 where officers contacted two subjects. Twenty grams of methamphetamine were located inside the room.

Street Racing

10/23: The 86Z squad observed 8 vehicles taking part in street racing activities in the area of 47th Avenue and Buckeye. Through their enforcement efforts resulted in: 1 felony arrest, 32 criminal and civil citations, 1 curfew and street racing arrest, 1 street racing arrest and 4 vehicles towed.

Prostitution

10/08: The 81X squad conducted a C.A.P. in cooperation with the V61 Vice squad. Six males were arrested for prostitution related charges and five cars were impounded. One pimp / sex trafficker was arrested after attempting to recruit one of the decoys to work for him. The C.A.P. was conducted in the area of 2700 W. McDowell Rd.

On this date, the 83X squad received a phone call from Vice requesting their assistance with the apprehension of a child prostitution suspect. The suspect was located, followed and then stopped. The suspect fled on foot and was apprehended a short time later, the driver was arrested for minor traffic offenses. Vice responded to interview their suspect.

10/09: The 83X squad worked the McDowell corridor and made two prostitution arrests.

10/10: The 83X squad worked the McDowell corridor, making one prostitution arrest.

10/14: Officer Davidson from 81X observed a known prostitute get into a vehicle at 37th Avenue and Van Buren. The "customer" was later stopped and admitted to the prostitution deal. The subject was on probation and a registered sex offender for molesting his 14 year old step daughter.

10/15: The 82X, 83X and 86Z squads assisted VICE who served 4 search warrants related to houses of prostitution. Seven (7) suspects were booked for a variety of charges, to include illegal control of an enterprise, pandering, money laundering, receiving the earnings of a prostitute, and residing in a house of prostitution.

10/15: The 83X squad worked the prostitution corridors, making one arrest for manifesting prostitution and identifying several others.

10/18: The 86Z squad arrested a prostitute.

10/22: The 83X squad worked the prostitution corridors and made one arrest.

10/23: The 83X squad worked the prostitution corridors, making one arrest for manifesting prostitution and identifying several others.

10/25: The 83X squad conducted a mini prostitution sweep and arrested three female prostitutes. One female decided to provide information on her pimp; this was her sixth prostitution arrest. She later decided not to cooperate.

10/2009: Officer Carter of the 81X squad conducted extensive follow-up on an investigation wherein the prostitute was located but unwilling to flip on her pimp / sex trafficker. Pertinent information was learned and the investigation might be linked to other prostitution investigations.

Per the Crime Analysis and Research Unit, 17 arrests were made in October in the Maryvale Precinct for prostitution related charges and 38 prostitution related contacts were made and field interrogations were completed.

Weed and Seed / General –

Officers Kriplean and London patrolled the Weed and Seed area and wrote 226 traffic citations, made 14 arrests and towed 28 vehicles; all this while spending approximately 90 hours in Weed and Seed.

10/26: Officers from 81X stopped a vehicle at 4800 W. Thomas where the driver was found to have 7 misdemeanor warrants and was booked.

Party Crews

10/02: The 86Z squad found a subject selling ecstasy pills on one of the party crew websites. Through an investigation that was conducted, the suspect was located and arrested, at which time 22 tablets of ecstasy were found.

10/03: The 86Z squad responded to 17** W. Pecan Road reference a party crew party. The following arrests were made: 40 underage drinking, 28 curfew and underage drinking, 6 curfew and 1 misdemeanor arrest warrant. Two packages containing 44 tablets of ecstasy were found as well.

10/09: The 86Z squad responded to 64** S. 12th Street reference a party crew party. Five (5) party crews were identified and 2 gangs identified. Fifty-eight (58) persons were detained, 10 were arrested for underage drinking, 7 arrested for curfew and underage drinking, 9 for curfew and 1 for a felony warrant.

10/18: The 86Z squad received information from another officer reference a party crew meet-up. The squad responded to the location and made 14 arrests, 1 for prohibited possession/CCW/underage drinking, 1 for minor in possession and 12 for curfew.

10/18: The 86Z squad responded to 38** W. Oregon reference a shots fired / party crew party. It was discovered that a neighboring house was struck by 4 bullets that passed through the house just over the heads of the sleeping occupants. The following arrests were made: 4 underage drinking, 5 cufew & underage drinking, and 6 curfew.

10/23: The 86Z squad received information about a party at a social hall at 28** W. Van Buren Street. While riding bicycles in the area, they rode up to a group of people and one subject had a concealed weapon on him. Some of the same suspects had been arrested in April, 2009 when they committed a mass beer run in preparation of a party crew house party. The arrests for this enforcement were: 1 for possession of a stolen firearm/concealed weapon, 1 underage drinking/urinating in public and 1 underage drinking.

10/25: The 86Z squad followed a party crew caravan from 27th Avenue and Van Buren to 6300 W. Georgia (city of Glendale). Over 100 kids were seen at the party and Glendale PD was notified. This was a vacant house utilized for the party.

The squad also assisted the 41K squad of the South Mountain Precinct reference a fight from a non-party crew related party. About 35 people were already detained upon their arrival. The arrests were 3 underage drinking and 9 curfew arrests.

10/31: The 86Z squad responded to 36** N. 89th Drive at the request of the 83H squad reference a party crew party. Most of the youth had not started drinking as the alcohol had just arrived; 7 underage drinking arrests were made.

Eight (8) different party crew parties were investigated at different locations and over 168 related arrests were made.

Loud Music / Party Response

10/11: The 86Z squad assisted the Desert Horizon Precinct with a non-party crew party.

10/31: The 86Z squad responded to 48** E. Van Buren Street to assist 500 with a non-party crew party. There appeared to be over 200 attendees present. The following arrests were made: 54 underage drinking arrests and 1 aggravated assault on a police officer/resisting arrest/allowing underage consumption of alcohol.

In October, dispatch received 392 loud party calls of which 293 were dispatched. 20 loud party notices were served and totaled \$2562.86 in fines. In comparison, the South Mountain Precinct received 212 loud party calls of which of which 184 were dispatched.

Bicycle Enforcement

10/21: The 86Z squad conducted bicycle enforcement in the 831 beat and made 4 arrests of subjects with misdemeanor warrants.

10/22: The 86Z squad conducted bicycle patrol in the area of 2700 W. Indian School Road.

10/23: The 86Z squad received information about a party at a social hall at 28** W. Van Buren Street. General Traffic Enforcement Efforts

10/03: The 86Z squad conducted traffic enforcement in the precinct and made 8 arrests, towed 7 vehicles and wrote 43 traffic citations.

10/08: The Traffic Education Safety Unit (TESU) conducted an aggressive driver program on 10/8/2009 from 1100-1300 hours. The target area was Thomas Rd, 27 Ave to 67 Ave. The results are as follows:

A total of 93 citations were issued during this program.

Miscellaneous

10/1: Officers Rudd and Knueppel from the 82X squad conducted street level enforcement for the majority of their shift. They issued 11 citations and impounded two vehicles, along with booking a subject for his three misdemeanor warrants and answered for several radios calls.

10/01: Officers Rathjen and Cusson of the 82X Squad stopped a vehicle and found that the driver had a deported felon hit. The officers transported the suspect to ICE who confirmed the warrant and added additional charges for the subject lying about his identity.

10/01: The 83X squad assisted the Special Assignments Unit with the service of a search warrant at 3** N. 39 Avenue.

10/3: The 83X squad worked a silent witness tip that a suspect was driving on a suspended license and was a prohibited possessor. The suspect was located and upon stopping the vehicle, he was found in possession of a hand gun.

10/07: The 81X squad was working the ** Inn and watched suspects leave in a vehicle. After contacting them, one of the occupants was found to be in possession of marijuana, one subject had a misdemeanor warrant and the driver was issued several traffic citations.

10/09: Officers Gonzalez, Sarager and Cusson of the 82X squad assisted Property Crime Detective Berry with the investigation of a cruelty to animal case. Officer Gonzalez teamed up with the detective and a representative from the Humane Society to pose as a buyer of cats the suspect was selling. Upon gaining access to the residence at 38** N. 84th Ln., a determination was made as to the cats' conditions, they were found to be in poor health and with consent of the owner approximately 18 cats were removed from the house.

10/17: The 83X squad developed information that a suspect was claiming to be a police officer and pulling over individuals in Phoenix. The suspect was located at 136** N. 44th Street and arrested. A search warrant on the residence yielded blue and red lights, gun belt and handcuffs. The suspect also admitted to the crimes.

10/17: Several members of the 83X squad assisted patrol with clearing a house and arresting multiple undocumented aliens from the residence at 50** W. Meadowbrook.

10/20: Officers Cusson and Sarager of the 82X Squad assisted Sex Crimes Detectives and SAU with the pick-up of a sexual assault suspect at 300th Ave. and Portland St. The suspect was taken into custody without incident. The officers transported the suspect to the 4th Ave. Jail where Sex Crimes Detectives took custody of him.

10/21: Officer Reed of 81X followed in with patrol on a hot call of a subject who broke out a window on a city bus. He located the subject several minutes later at 5900 W. Encanto. The suspect was positively identified and booked into jail.

10/29: Office Davidson on 81X received information form Detective Micensky reference two subjects that the Secret Service had felony indictments on. The suspects were located and arrested.

Curfew:

Graffiti enforcement / Maryvale Precinct Graffiti and Gang Crimes Liaisons:

They have also contacted the Transit Bureau and informed them of the issues at the bus stops at the intersection. Transit has provided more patrols in the area and has made several arrests for liquor violations at the bus stops.
