All items below are also recommended by the City Manager.

1. Consideration of City Council approval of the projects recommended for the City's \$15.2 million EECBG formula funding as outlined in the attached report. Additionally, request approval to apply for the following discretionary/competitive grants is requested: 1) Transportation Electrification, 2) Clean Diesel Program, and 3) Alternative Fueled Vehicles Pilot Grant Program.

2. Consideration of City Council approval to proceed with the issuance of a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a utility-scale solar plant development at the SR-85 Landfill.

3. Consideration of City Council approval to submit applications for federal stimulus funding that will be distributed by the Water Infrastructure Finance Authority of Arizona (WIFA) for various water and wastewater projects.  
**APPROVED: Cavazos, Seelhammer**
4. The Economy, Commerce and Sustainability (ECS) Subcommittee reviewed this item at their April 16, 2009 meeting and recommends the City Council:
  - 1) Endorse the 17-point *Green Phoenix* Plan.

- 2) Direct staff to focus initial efforts to implement *Green Phoenix* on the following six areas: Greener Neighborhoods, Solar City, Greening Homes and Businesses, Public Buildings LEED Retrofit, Renewable Energy, and Efficient City Lights.
- 3) Direct staff to work in partnership with Arizona State University to identify a major focus project or target area that would be the centerpiece for Phase I implementation of *Green Phoenix*. This focus project or area would be brought back for review at a future ECS Subcommittee and should form the basis of a substantial discretionary/competitive federal stimulus grant request.
