### Wier Avenue, 43rd Avenue to 35th Avenue Closed mid-March to mid-June 2009\*

- Wier Avenue will be closed between 43rd Avenue and 35th Avenue. Access to local residents and emergency vehicles will be available at all times.
- The crew will be working from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. until April 30th and 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. from May 1 to September 30th Monday through Thursday. Additional or extended work may occur Friday – Sunday.
- Watch message boards and signage for actual closure dates and updates.
- Wier Avenue will be repaved in sections following the sewer line installation.
- Work areas will be fenced during non-working hours.
