



## ELECTRONIC PROSECUTOR RECORDS ORGANIZATION (ePRO PHASE III)

Subcommittee: Commerce, Justice, Science and Related Agencies

**Request:** Appropriate \$120,000 for Electronic Records Organization (ePRO Phase III)

### Community Value:

The purpose of this three-phase project is to develop an electronic file application with new electronic processes to manage all case-related work, Web-based disclosure of evidence, automated subpoena processes and replace the out-of-date existing case management application. This project will greatly enhance the efficiency of the City Prosecutor's Office by reducing the amount of staff, time and cost required to manage case work for the approximately 40,000 cases submitted each year.

### Background:

The City Prosecutor's Office handles all criminal misdemeanor offenses occurring within the 516 square miles of the city, which consists of approximately 1.5 million people. Around 40,000 cases are submitted each year with the majority of these cases



from the Phoenix Police Department. In addition, the Office's Community Prosecution Bureau files more than 350 civil drug forfeitures in Maricopa County Superior Court.

The City Prosecutor's Office is developing, from the ground up, a large-scale electronic file application entitled ePRO (Electronic Prosecutor Records Organization). Phase I of the project is nearing final testing and implementation and consists of electronically storing all case-related evidence. ePRO Phase II will develop a new document generation process for motions, complaints, letters and memorandums and develop the electronic management, distribution and tracking of case work to attorneys, victim advocates and legal assistants.

Phase III of the ePRO project will cover developing modules to manage all defendant, victim, witness and police officer information.
