Significant Events

Urban Search and Rescue: In October 2006, AZ-TF1 hosted the FEMA Type 1 Mobilization Exercise and 80 members participated in the two-day event.

Drowning Prevention Efforts: The summer of 2006 was the first "drowning free summer" in Phoenix for the period from Memorial Day through Labor Day.

Civic Plaza Structural Collapse Rescue: Unified Command was successfully used at this seven hour rescue operation.
