## City of Phoenix Reserve-A-Ride 602-262-4400 [www.phoenix.gov/seniorcenters](http://www.phoenix.gov/seniorcenters)

Reserve A Ride (RAR) provides specialized transportation to and from City of Phoenix senior centers for older adults, age 60 and over; and certified disabled individuals, age 18 and over. A voluntary recommended contribution of \$1.25 per one-way trip is requested. All vehicles are wheelchair accessible.

Join a senior center near you for special activities and trips including group shopping trips to grocery stores, malls, restaurants, and big box stores; center and special events such as holiday celebrations, trips to sporting events, live theater, State Fair, picnics, and much more.

## City of Phoenix Senior Cab Program 602-801-1164 / 602-801-1163

20 coupons for \$6  
40 coupons for \$12

For Phoenix residents 65 years of age or older. Limited to 40 vouchers a month. Most taxi cab companies in Phoenix accept vouchers. Vouchers can be used for tips. Call to request an application packet, then mail the application and order form. Allow a week from mailing your order to receive the tickets. Call before re-ordering to verify tickets are available. Submit all re-orders with a check or money order by mail.

ADA-certified one-way fee/\$3.50  
ADA monthly pass/\$65.00

ADA-certified individuals can place calls 1-14 days in advance and will be picked up within 30 minutes of the scheduled trip time. ADA certification required. Call 602-253-4000 to begin certification process.

## Veterans Medical Center 602-277-5551 ext. 6272 [www.va.gov](http://www.va.gov)

Free medical appointment transportation to the Veteran's Medical Center.

Eligibility:

- An individual cannot earn more than \$12,000 a year.
- Married couples cannot earn more than \$15,000 a year.
- Persons that have a 30 percent service-connected disability are automatically eligible.

If income and disability criteria are not met, a financial "hardship" application can be submitted to determine eligibility.

## AHCCCS

Free taxi transportation for medical appointments if receiving AHCCCS. Call the number located on your AHCCCS card for more information.

## DUET 602-274-5022 [www.duetaz.org](http://www.duetaz.org)

Matches volunteers to provide free transportation to the homebound and disabled.

Transportation, by volunteers, available once a week for doctor appointments and once a week for grocery shopping.

Four-day notice is needed for medical appointments.

Some local grocery stores offer their own shuttle services to and from your home to their store. Others will allow you to order online and will deliver your groceries to your home.
