**Request to Speak**

Individuals wishing to speak or submit their position on an item should arrive and submit a card by the beginning of the meeting, before action is taken on the item. Cards will not be accepted after action has been taken on an item.

**Call to the Public**

Citizen comments are heard at the start of the meeting and before adjournment, as necessary, provided a quorum of the Subcommittee is present. Any member of the public will be given up to three minutes to address the Subcommittee on issues of interest or concern to them. Speakers will be called in the order in which requests to speak are received. As mandated by the Arizona Open Meeting Law, officials will not discuss matters raised during the Call to the Public, but may respond to personal criticism, and may direct staff to follow up with the citizen.
