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INFORMATION ABOUT THIS PUBLICITY PAMPHLET

GENERAL INFORMATION

This pamphlet contains election and voting information for the November 3, 2026, Council Election for Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8. This pamphlet is mailed to each household in Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8 in which an active registered voter resides, unless all voters in the household requested to obtain the pamphlet electronically. Please make the pamphlet available to all registered voters in the household.

CANDIDATES

Information about the candidates is on page 8 of this pamphlet. Candidate names may appear in a different order on the official ballot because candidate names are rotated in each precinct.

SPANISH TRANSLATION

The Spanish translation of this pamphlet is required by the Federal Voting Rights Act. The translation is an accurate interpretation of the material appearing in English but is provided only as an aid to voters.

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ELECTION INFORMATION

GENERAL INFORMATION

On Tuesday, November 3, 2026, the regularly scheduled Council Election will be held for registered voters residing in City of Phoenix Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8.

In this election, voters residing in City Council Districts 2, 4, 6, and 8 will elect Council Members.

If a candidate receives a majority of the votes cast (50% +1) for an office in the November 3, 2026, election, the candidate is elected and will take office on April 19, 2027; if not, the two candidates receiving the most votes cast will advance to a Runoff Election which will be held for that office on March 9, 2027. The candidate with the highest number of votes for that office in the Runoff Election will be elected and take office on April 19, 2027.

There is no election for Mayor and Council Members in Districts 1, 3, 5, and 7 this year because the terms of the City Council Members are staggered. The next regularly scheduled election for these Districts and Mayor will be in 2028.

CONSOLIDATED COUNTY-CONDUCTED ELECTION

This election will be conducted by the Maricopa County Elections Department. All City of Phoenix candidate races will appear on the County's November 3, 2026, General Election ballot.

COUNTY MAILED EARLY BALLOTS & SAMPLE BALLOTS

Beginning October 7, 2026, the Maricopa County Elections Department will mail early ballots to all registered voters that are on the Active Early Voting List (AEVL). Voters who are not on the AEVL must either request an early ballot by mail from the Maricopa County Elections Department or vote in person.

Households with registered voters who are not on the AEVL will receive a sample ballot. The sample ballot will display the names of candidates as they will appear on the official ballot. However, the sample ballot is not an official ballot and cannot be used to vote. The sample ballot can also be accessed online at BeBallotReady.Vote. Sample ballots will be mailed no later than 11 days prior to the election.

If you do not receive your early ballot or your sample ballot, please contact the Maricopa County Elections Department for a replacement at 602-506-1511.

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EARLY VOTING

BY MAIL

Voters on the Active Early Voting List (AEVL) will automatically receive an early ballot by mail unless they submit a request to not receive a ballot by mail. Early ballots for the November 3, 2026, election will be mailed by the Maricopa County Elections Department beginning Wednesday, October 7, 2026.

Voters not on the AEVL who wish to receive an early ballot by mail may submit a request online for an early ballot to the Maricopa County Elections Department at BeBallotReady.Vote or by calling 602-506-1511.

Early ballots are available in alternative formats including Braille and large print, upon request. To request an alternative format of the early ballot, please call the Maricopa County Elections Department at 602-506-1511.

Requests for an early ballot by mail must be received by the Maricopa County Elections Department no later than 5 p.m. on Friday, October 23, 2026.

RETURNING VOTED EARLY BALLOTS

An early ballot must be returned in the ballot affidavit envelope that was provided with the ballot and the envelope must be signed by the voter. **Voted early ballots must be received by the Maricopa County Elections Department no later than 7 p.m. on Election Day.** If you return your voted early ballot by mail, be sure to allow sufficient time for delivery. It is recommended you mail your ballot at least 7 days before Election Day. Voted early ballots may also be dropped off at in-person voting locations during voting hours. Voters should take the time they need to consider their choices and mark their ballot. However, voters who complete their ballots early are encouraged to return the ballot as soon as it is voted. Returning voted ballots as early as possible provides more time for signature verification and processing so that final results are available sooner.

HOW CAN I CHECK THE STATUS OF MY EARLY BALLOT?

Information about the status of your early ballot is available online at BeBallotReady.Vote or scan the QR code on page 1. You can obtain detailed information, such as the date your early ballot was mailed, received, or processed for tabulation. To check the status of your early ballot, you will need to provide basic information along with either your voter registration number, driver license number or non-operating identification card number, or the last four digits of your Social Security Number. This information is required in order to positively identify you as the voter and the information you enter must match the information on your voter registration record.

IN-PERSON VOTING

Individuals who wish to vote in person rather than by mail, can visit any voting site. Voting sites will be designated by the Maricopa County Elections Department and will be available beginning 27 days before the election from Wednesday, October 7, 2026, through Tuesday, November 3, 2026. Hours of operation may vary by location. On Election Day, Tuesday, November 3, 2026, voting sites will be open to voters from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. Locations are designated throughout the county and can be found by visiting BeBallotReady.Vote, by calling 602-506-1511 or scan the QR code on page 1. Voters are required to provide identification at in-person voting locations before receiving a ballot.

ACCESSIBLE VOTING

Accessible voting devices that allow voters with disabilities to vote independently will be available for this election at all in-person voting locations.

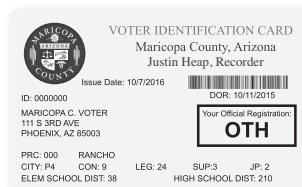
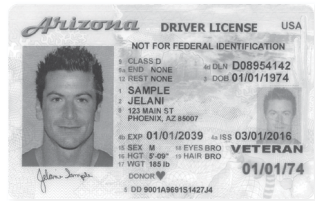
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IN-PERSON VOTING IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Arizona Revised Statutes § 16-579(A)



1 Photo ID From This List: (Must contain current name & address)

Valid AZ Driver License

Valid AZ Non-operating ID

Tribal Enrollment Card or Other Form of Tribal ID

Valid U.S. Federal, State or Local Government-issued ID

If the voter presents acceptable identification but the voter's name and address does not match the voter's registration record, the voter may cast a Provisional Ballot. The voter does not need to take any further action.
