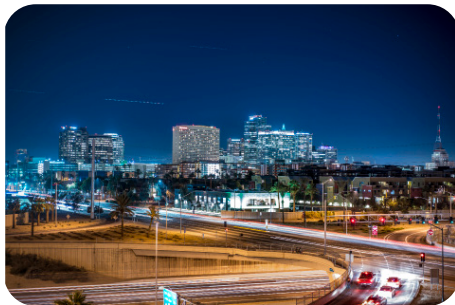

New Signage at Phoenix Sky Harbor

The Aviation Department Operations Division and Public Safety and Security Division installed additional signs enforcing "no parking, stopping, or standing" in the ADOT access ramps and roads leading into the terminals at Phoenix Sky Harbor International Airport. Drivers are encouraged to use the PHX Sky Train® stations at 44th St. and 24th St. as pick-up and drop-off spots, as well as the 24-hour cell phone waiting lots, which are located East of Terminal 4, West of the West Economy Garage, and South of the 44th St. PHX Sky Train® Station.

Heat Warnings



Heat watches and warnings are issued by the National Weather Service @NWSPhoenix.

Flood Barriers



Instead of sandbags, residents should consider innovative water barrier options like self-activating flood barriers. These products are reusable and can be found online or at local hardware stores.

Rain in the Drain



Don't place any materials in the street that may wash into a storm drain causing blockages or pollution.

Flash Floods



Pay attention to signs that warn of flood areas.

Never cross a flooded wash or road. Just six

inches of water can wash away most vehicles.

Driving Tips



When driving in a severe storm, pull over if possible and wait it out. In a dust storm, park off the road shoulder and turn your vehicle **lights off**.

Prepare a Go Kit



Prepare a portable pack that allows you to be self-sufficient for 72 hours. Include food, water, cash, flashlight, batteries, first aid supplies, and medicine.

Phoenix experiences a variety of extreme weather conditions, including dust storms (haboobs), high winds, severe downpours, flash floods, lightning storms, and brush fires. Always be prepared.

Storm Cleanup



If your yard is damaged during a storm, take your branches and debris to a City Transfer Station to be composted. Residents can drop off up to one ton of waste for free each month.
