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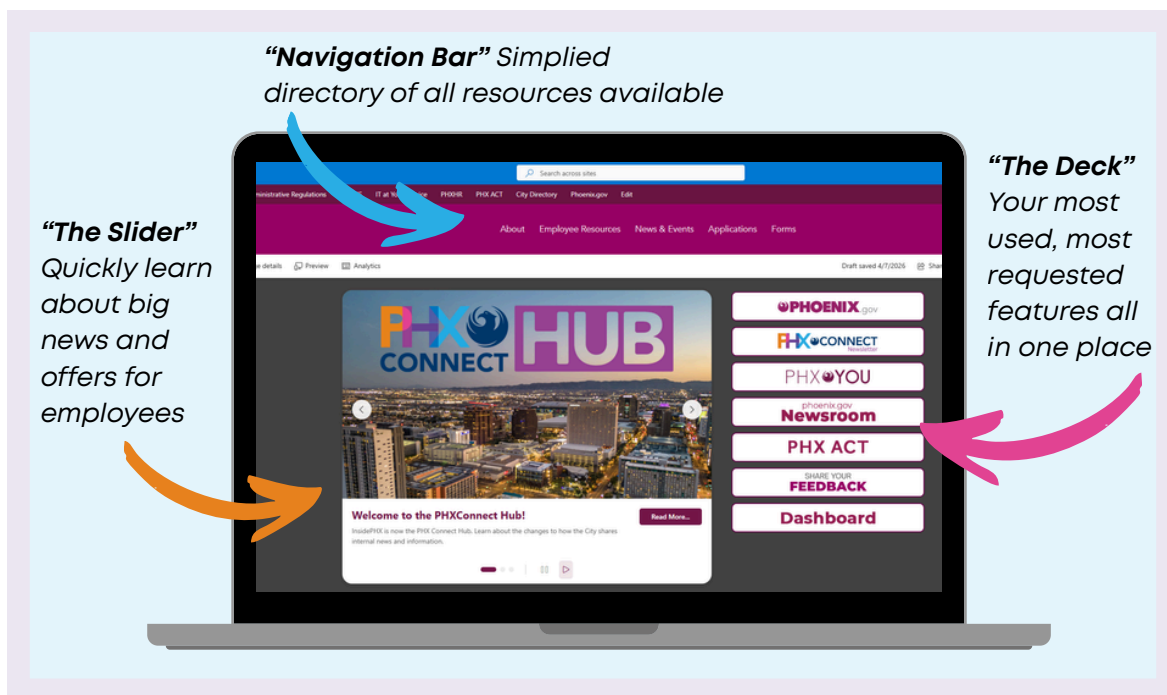
Discover the new PHXCONNECT

Fewer Emails and More Streamlined Updates

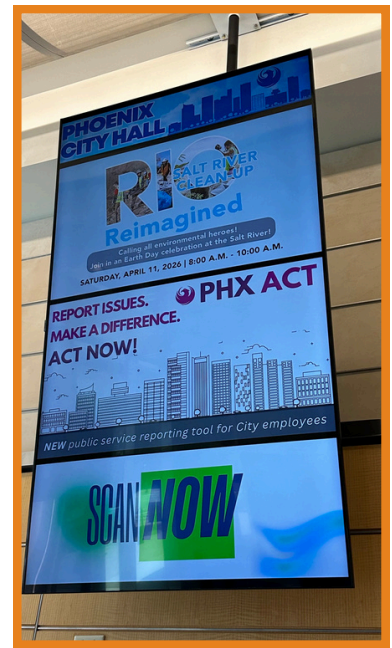

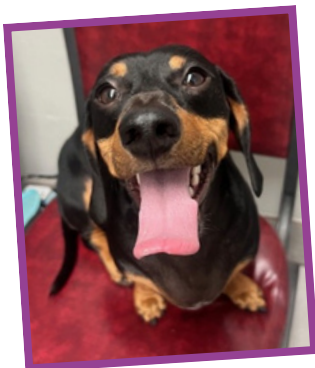
