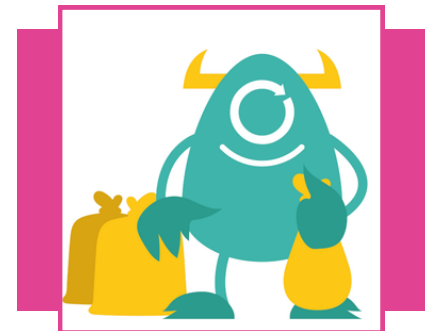

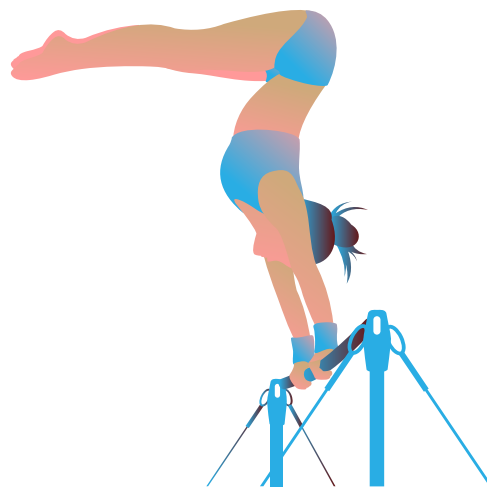

Public Works is seeking dedicated employees for a Transfer Station Utilities Service Specialist opening. These team members are responsible for weighing vehicles entering the City's transfer stations and landfills, accurately recording commodities, assessing fees, receiving payments, and documenting all associated charges. This role requires a high level of accuracy in cash handling, charge systems, and daily balance reporting, as well as ensuring that all customers comply with City rules and regulations regarding waste disposal.

Hiring Range: \$21.54 - \$27.49/HR.

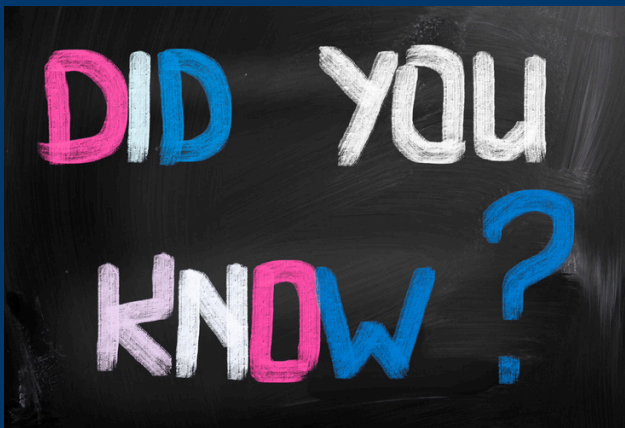

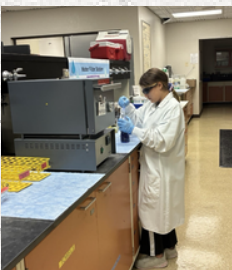

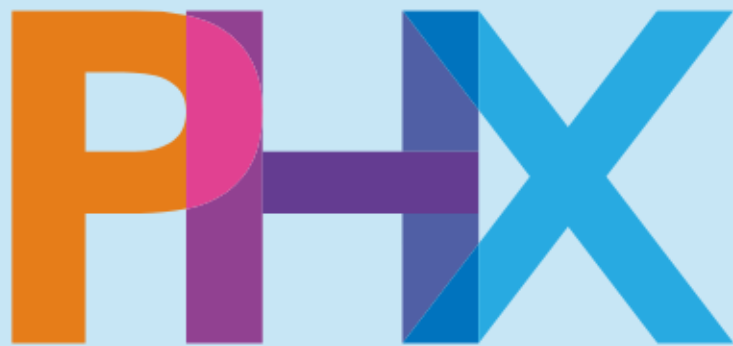
