Donations will benefit local Phoenix non-profit organizations and support individuals in need. Thank you to everyone who contributed!




Summer Safety

Parks Maintenance Mechanic Parks and Recreation Dept.

The Parks Maintenance Mechanic will perform skilled tasks in the repair and maintenance of plumbing and mechanical equipment in multiple Park facilities throughout the city.

Responsibilities include performing large and/or complex plumbing jobs which require the installation of new potable water lines, hot water heaters, hot water boilers, water mains, drinking water purification systems, back flow preventers, sewer lines, swimming pool equipment, chemical injection systems, irrigation systems, and plumbing fixtures.


