New Traffic Signal Activation on 91st Ave.



On December 10th, we celebrated the activation of a brand-new traffic signal at 91st Ave & Campbell Ave — marking the 1,233rd signalized intersection in the City of Phoenix! This new signal is a commitment to safety and progress through our [Vision Zero Road Safety Action Plan](#), ensuring safer commutes for students, families, and everyone traveling through our neighborhoods. And another traffic signal on 91st Ave. and Osborn Rd. will be activated by the end of February.

A huge thank you to the Western Enclave Block Watch for their advocacy for being the voice of our community and helping us identify what's truly needed to keep our families safe. And, of course, thanks to our Street Transportation Department Director, Briiana Velez and staff for prioritizing this long-overdue project. Together, we're building safer, stronger, and more connected neighborhoods across the City of Phoenix.

1,000 Gates**

As a champion of the Gated Alley Program since it started as a pilot in 2020, I was happy to celebrate on March 22nd, the 1,000 gated alley, with many more installed since then. The alley gates have enhanced security and cleanliness, as the volume of calls for service has decreased dramatically in these neighborhoods. This program is only successful when residents collect the signatures, talk to their neighbors, and join or form block watches to improve communication and safety in their area. - **Grand Canalscape Phase 3**

Phase 3 of the Grand Canalscape project transformed the dirt path between 75th and 47th Ave. along the Grand Canal into an improved concrete pathway with lighting, exercise equipment, and a new pedestrian bridge. The new route for pedestrians and cyclists has safe signalized crossings (HAWK lights) where the trail crosses city streets. [Learn more here.](#)

Since 2021, this Cool Corridor along 55th Ave. from Camelback Rd. to Indian School Rd. includes: over 300 trees planted, new walking paths for residents and students, trash cans, recycle bins, and dog waste stations, circular flashing beacons to increase driver awareness and encourage yielding at pedestrian school crossings, speed tables (raised crosswalks) on 55th Ave. to slow
