Ground-based fireworks are allowed; anything that explodes or launches is not.

Sparklers, fountains, and smoke devices are legal. Anything that explodes, shoots into the air, or flies is not and can result in a fine. Please celebrate safely and legally!



REMEMBER: follow and share the best practices for fireworks disposal:

- 1. Soak in water overnight
- 2. Double-bag
- 3. Trash them—not your yard!

#### **New Senior Village Affordable Housing**



During the formal meeting on June 18th, the City Council and I approved a federal grant for construction funds for 80 new affordable housing for seniors at the Helen Drake Senior Center site on 27th Ave. south of Northern Ave! This project will convert empty city land into safe, high-quality affordable housing for seniors with lower to median income — close to the services they count on, like enrichment programs, social activities, transportation and meals.

It's part of our citywide goal to build more affordable housing in Phoenix by 2030. In addition, we're excited that this new project will be within walking distance of the Haven, a new transitional housing for seniors experiencing homelessness, on Northern Ave. and the I-17. We're building housing to integrate seniors into the community that will improve the stability and safety of this neighborhood. Special thanks to Deputy City Manager Gina Montes, the Housing Dept. Director Titus Mathew, and TRG Arizona.



Resident Highlight: New Speed Humps & Gated Alley



My office outreach team is constantly out in the neighborhoods talking to residents door by door to support requests for speed humps and gated alleys. This month, Patricia, a new neighborhood leader in Maryvale, was excited to announce her speed humps and alley gates were installed near 47th Ave. and Indian School Rd. She told us how multiple cars crashed into her property and people used to illegally dump in her alley. After talking to me and my office staff, we helped her begin the application process.



She was willing to go out and talk to her neighbors and collect signatures for both the speed hump and gated alley programs. Our office staff helped her collect the final signatures for both programs and find funding to support the speed hump installation. Now, she and her neighbors see how working with our office and the City can transform a neighborhood highway into a residential street, and a dumping ground into a safe and clean alleyway.
