

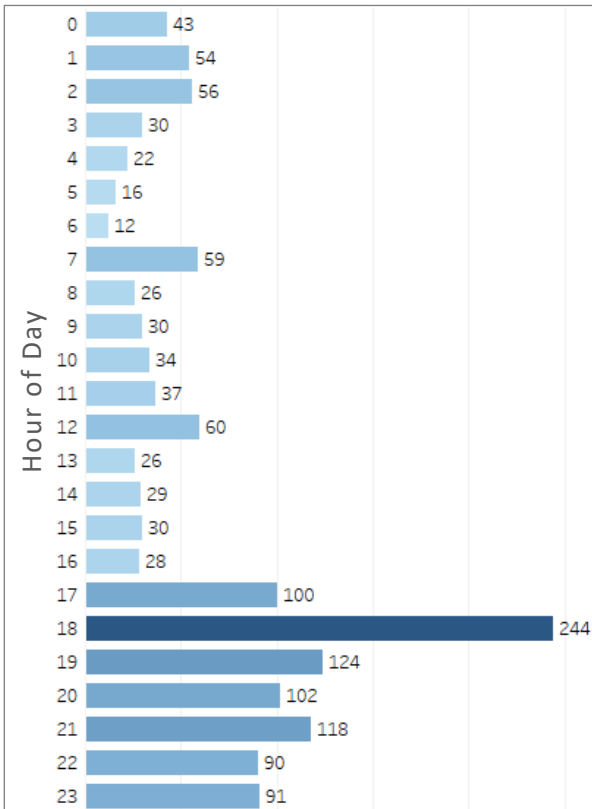
# Summer Safety Weekly Recap: 6/20/24 – 6/26/24

## Respite/Extended Hour Cooling Center Visitors: 6/20/24 – 6/26/24

### Intake Time



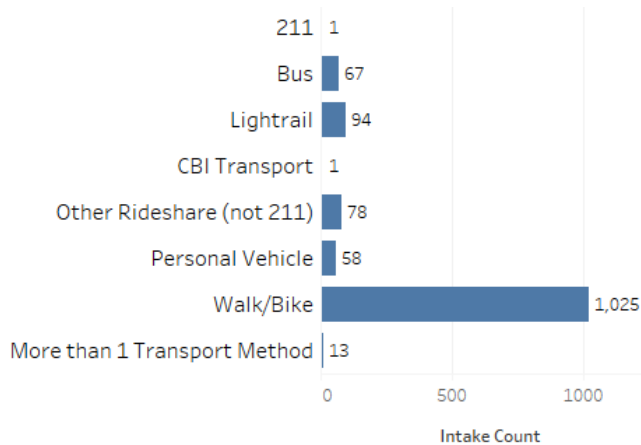
### Phoenix Summer Safety Operation Totals 5/1/24 – 6/26/24:

- **424 heat related** calls for service (Source: Phoenix FD). Of those calls, only 43 were within a mile of a cooling or respite center during extended operating hours.
- **8,602 visits** in respite and extended hour cooling centers (based on intake forms received).
- Burton Barr Respite Center was closed for plumbing repairs from approximately 4pm June 24<sup>th</sup> through approximately 3pm June 25<sup>th</sup>. Visitors were able to get hydration but were redirected to Senior Opportunities West if they were seeking heat relief
- Overall, **6 and 7pm** have seen the highest number of people arriving.
- **Walk/Bike** (72%) has been the most popular method of getting to the cooling center.
- **Returning visitors account for 39%** of intake forms, followed by word of mouth (32%) for how visitors hear about cooling centers.
- **7,266 visitors (85%)** indicated they are experiencing homelessness.
- **7,060 visitors (82%)** indicated they just want to get cool and don't need any additional services or referrals.
- **557 visitors** received direct onsite assistance from CBI with various shelter or homeless solutions referrals. **25 visitors** required additional follow up for their referral, which was submitted by the Office of Emergency Management on their behalf.

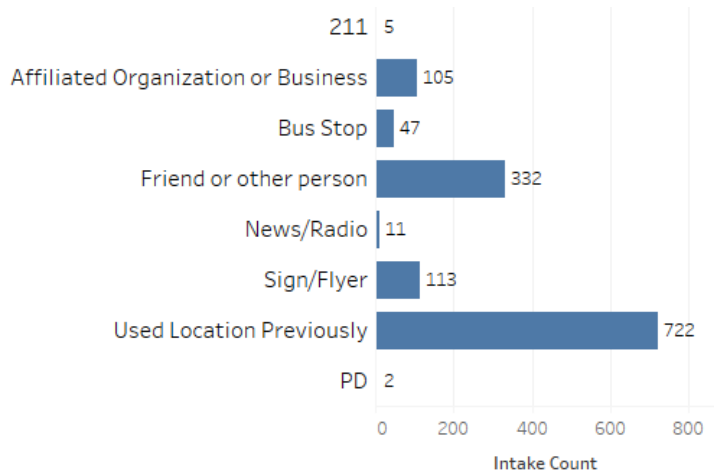
### Referrals

**21 referrals** were processed and received direct onsite assistance from CBI. **1 referral** self-reported that they were in need of additional follow-up from the City of Phoenix and the Office of Emergency Management initiated that referral on their behalf.

### Transportation Method



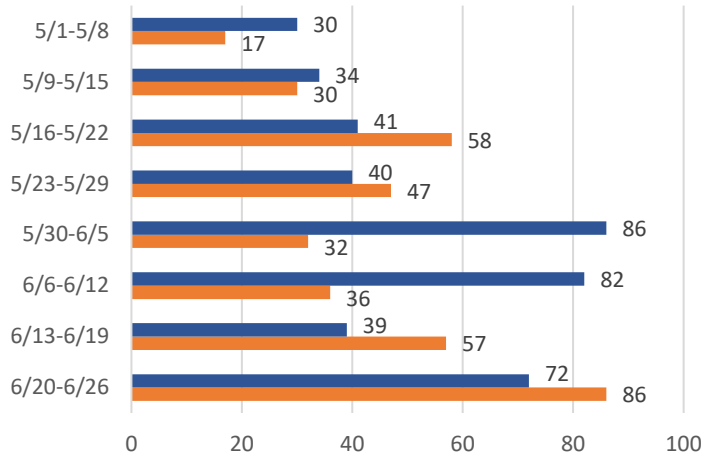

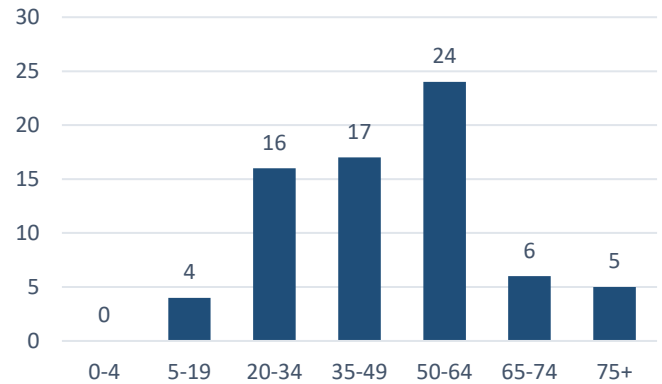

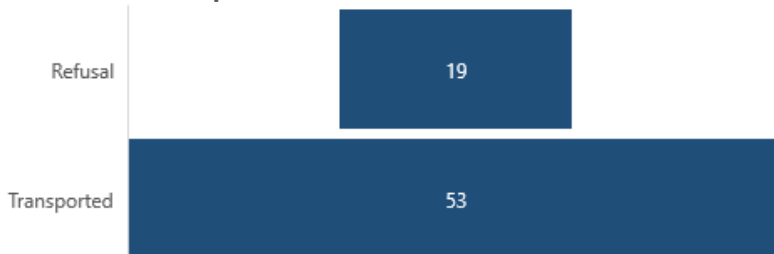

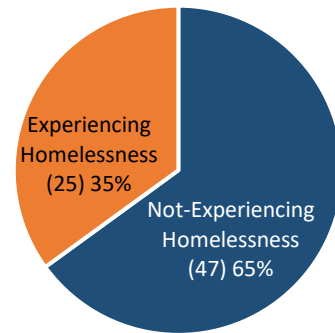

The Maricopa County Department of Health has reported the following statistics on heat related deaths:

	2024 (4/14-6/22)	2023 (4/23-6/26)
Heat Caused Deaths	2 (1 in Phoenix)	26 (Phoenix specific not available)
Heat Contributed Deaths	4 (2 in Phoenix)	19 (Phoenix specific not available)
