Strategic Initiatives Fast-Track Cities Funding Opportunity
Fiscal Year 2026-2027**

The Phoenix Fast-Track Cities initiative offers funding opportunities to support HIV/AIDS awareness, testing, education, and support services.

The new City of Phoenix Fast-Track Cities application aligns with the priorities identified in the Phoenix Fast-Track Cities HIV Stakeholder Summit 2025: Insights on Essential HIV Prevention and Care Services report (available online at phoenix.gov/hivphx).

This document outlines the guidelines, requirements, and information that will be needed to complete the online application form when the quarterly application window opens.

Requests for funding will be prioritized as follows:

Priority 1 - Testing

- Purchasing testing kits, funding testing (lab supplies, etc.)
- Prevention (PrEP & PEP, including samples, etc.)
- Paying for lab visits
- HIV medical care

Priority 2 – Wraparound Services

- Transportation
- Connection to nutrition services
- Other SDOH
- Psychosocial groups

Priority 3 – Traditional Awards

- Testing and prevention events
- Table sponsorships

The Fast-Track Cities Subcommittee Chairs and Human Services Department leadership will review all applications.

Requests for funding will be reviewed and considered on a quarterly basis.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Event/activity/project must advance the mission of 95-95-95-0.
 - 95% of people living with HIV (PLHIV) knowing their HIV status

- 95% of PLHIV who know their HIV-positive status on antiretroviral therapy (ART)
 - 95% of PLHIV on ART achieving viral suppression
 - ZERO stigma
- Event/activity/project must meet Fast-Track Cities funding ordinance requirements:
 - Funding should be used to support HIV/AIDS awareness, testing, education, and support services.
- Budget breakdown for the requested amount of funds as well as total event/activity/project budget must be submitted.
- Post-event/activity/project metrics, impact, etc. must be reported within 60 days of event.
- Event should not fall under the same quarter in which the application is submitted (some exceptions on a case-by-case basis may apply).
 - For example, if your event is in January 2027 (Quarter 3), your application should be received by the October 16, 2026, deadline (Quarter 2) for a decision by October 30, 2026.
 - If you have a project with multiple dates (e.g., monthly events), submit the application in the quarter before your project begins.
- Applications are accepted only from non-profits, fiscally sponsored organizations, and government agencies. Applications from for-profit agencies are ineligible.
- Applications requesting \$10,000+ must reach more than 200 people.
