UPDATE: March 9, 2026

Phoenix Police Detectives have arrested Michael Abel Dominguez in connection with the incident that occurred on March 7, 2026, at 2:31 a.m. Following the initial response, detectives worked with members of the Street Crimes Unit to review surveillance video, analyze evidence, and conduct follow-up, which led to the identification of the vehicle involved and its registered owner, Michael.

On March 9, 2026, officers located Michael and took him into custody with the assistance of the Fugitive Apprehension and Investigations Detail. During the arrest and subsequent search warrants, detectives located pellet-style firearms consistent with those used in the incident, along with additional evidence.

Michael was booked on multiple charges, including an outstanding felony warrant.

Aggravated Assault Investigation

On March 7, 2026, at approximately 2:30 a.m., Phoenix Police officers responded to a report of a man firing a BB gun towards their direction at a mosque near 23rd Avenue and Joan De Arc Avenue. Upon arrival, officers learned that several community members had seen a suspicious vehicle approach the mosque's gate. A man exited the vehicle and pointed what initially appeared to be a firearm. The witnesses heard several popping sounds and retreated to safety.

The victims later determined the sounds were consistent with a pellet or paintball gun, not a firearm. The suspect returned to the vehicle and continued firing paintballs toward the group, striking several parked vehicles before fleeing the area. No injuries were reported. Officers conducted a search of the surrounding neighborhood, but the suspect was not located.

Detectives have taken over the investigation and are seeking any information that may assist in identifying the individual involved. Community members with information are encouraged to contact SILENT WITNESS at (480) WITNESS or (480) TESTIGO for Spanish.

The Phoenix Police Department recognizes that incidents of this nature can cause concern, especially for those who gather at places of worship and other community spaces. As a precaution, officers will continue increased patrols in the area while the investigation continues. We remain committed to supporting the safety and wellbeing of all who live, work, and worship in our city, and we thank the community for working with us to keep one another safe
