WHAT'S HAPPENING

Required Training Due March 31

As part of our commitment to fostering a respectful and inclusive workplace, and to ensure we all contribute to the City's Equal Opportunity Plan, Street Transportation Department employees are **required** to complete the following trainings by March 31:

Course Name: Discrimination/Retaliation Training (EOD102)

- Total Time Required: Approximately 49 minutes (four sections)
- This course does not need to be retaken if you took it between July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025. Please review your transcript in PHXYOU to verify.

Course Name: Autism Training (EOD132)

- Total Time Required: Approximately 30 minutes

Steps to Enroll:

1. Log in to your PHXYOU account.
2. Search for "Discrimination/Retaliation Training (EOD102)" or "Autism Training (EOD132)" in the course catalog.
3. Enroll in the course and complete all sections to receive credit.

For field staff: Supervisors are responsible for arranging a presentation of these trainings during one of your regularly scheduled staff meetings. After the training, please submit a roster to Sasha.Perez@Phoenix.gov

The roster should include:

- Date of training
- Employee names
- Employee IDs



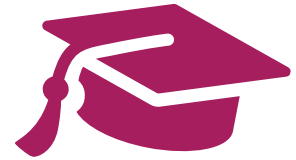

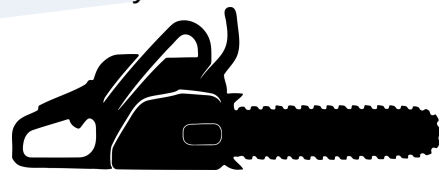

The Engaging Leader Program is a five-month course that helps broaden participants' leadership awareness, accountability, and actions using a blend of in-person and virtual sessions.

Street Maintenance Holds Valuable End-of-Year Training

As part of the Street Maintenance Division's annual end of year gathering for the maintenance teams, they begin the day with up to three training sessions designed to enhance skills and knowledge. One of the most consistently valuable sessions is conducted in partnership with the Parks and Recreation Department, where one of their forestry specialists provides a hands-on demonstration of proper chainsaw operations and best practices for cutting both large and small trees and branches.



These skills are critical for maintenance work during the monsoon when high winds often cause trees to fall, as well as wash maintenance, where our crews manage trees and branches within city washes and conveyance channels.

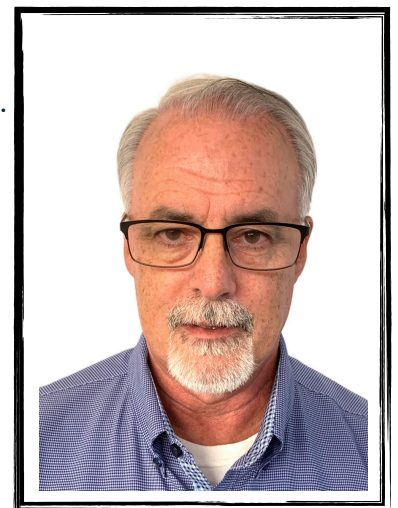

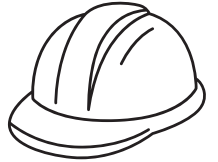

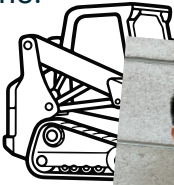
Welcome Street Maintenance Worker Apprentices!
