Street View features updates and information on district specific and citywide initiatives from the Street Transportation Department. This report covers the period from October 1 through October 28.

Council District 1 Initiatives

Traffic Signal Updates

Street Transportation installed, upgraded or repaired the following traffic signal:

1. 35th Ave. and Cholla St. – This signal was rebuilt to include flashing yellow arrows and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant audible pedestrian push buttons. ADA ramps were also installed at all four corners of the intersection.



Street Right-of-Way Landscape Maintenance

Crews maintained the landscaped areas within the street right-of-way listed below. This work typically includes weed and trash removal and landscape pruning. This helps provide a safe environment for the public and enhances the image of the city's streets. North West Valley Transportation Project

The Northwest Valley Transportation Project includes design and construction of approximately three miles of arterial streets, including asphalt, curb, gutter, sidewalk, drainage facilities, streetlights and landscaping to support ingress and egress to the future semiconductor manufacturing site. The project site is in the general vicinity of the area bounded by 51st Avenue to Interstate 17, Loop 303 to State Route 74. Construction is expected to be completed by April 2022. 5. 51st Ave. to I-17, Loop 303 to SR 74 (Carefree Highway)



Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Alley Dust Proofing

This project will provide dust proofing measures to 26 miles of alleys within the city limits. The work will include spraying pre-herbicide, grubbing, grading, installing binder and pre-coated aggregates, adjusting existing sanitary sewer manholes and minor drainage improvements.

Citywide Updates

Road Safety Action Plan

The Street Transportation Department has launched a comprehensive Road Safety Action Plan (RSAP) for Phoenix that will further the city's current efforts and provide a framework and key strategies for safety enhancements citywide. The RSAP will be completed in five work phases, with anticipated completion in winter 2022.

The Street Transportation Department has been proactively investing in the Four E's of Traffic Safety: Evaluation, Engineering, Enforcement and Education. The Phoenix RSAP will further integrate the Four E's and provide a road map for the city to hone a "safety first" proactive stance in reducing roadway-related fatalities and injuries.

- Evaluation is benchmarking efforts to measure effectiveness of implemented initiatives.
- Engineering identifies tools and resources needed to successfully address roadway safety items that include roadway design, traffic engineering, maintenance, operation and planning.
- Enforcement is ensuring users of the roadway are following the rules.
- Education is conducting communication campaigns and initiatives that promote and teach safe roadway user behavior, including people driving, riding transit, walking and bicycling.

Community engagement is integral to the formation of an actionable plan. The input of those who travel Phoenix's roadways, whether driving, walking or biking, will be key to making streets safer for everyone. To facilitate meaningful input, two points of engagement will be conducted during fall/winter 2021 and winter/spring 2022 to include:

- Virtual and in-person meetings (citywide and council district level)
- An online and printed survey
- Community events
- Other opportunities

The first phase of community engagement will begin with a citywide virtual public meeting on November 16 at 6 p.m. to explain the intent of the plan and gather resident input and comments.
