

Summer Jobs for Phoenix Youth Now Open for Applications



Paid employment opportunities are now open for youth and young adults ages 16 to 24 located within the city through the Phoenix Youth RISE Summer Youth Employment program. Interested youth and young adults looking to gain real-world work experience with employers in the city of Phoenix can apply online at [Phoenix.gov/HR](https://phoenix.gov/hr). Phoenix Youth RISE provides work experience and paid employment for up to 20 hours over four weeks for a total of 80 hours in the summer. Applications will be accepted until May 15, 2021.

As an intern, the work experience helps participating employers use skills to complete lagging projects, jump-start new ones or catch up on work that may have been set aside during the long days of the pandemic.

Phoenix Youth RISE covers 80 summer intern hours for four weeks through the months of June and July. The program connects employers with youth and young adults who have undergone skills training and work-readiness preparing them to work up to 20 hours per week.

There are still opportunities for employers to offer internships through the program. The city pays all training and wage costs for employers.

Phoenix Public Library to Resume Limited In-Building Visits

On April 7, the Phoenix City Council approved Phoenix Public Library's [plan to restore in-building visits](#). Restoration of in-building visits will roll out in three separate library location groupings with the first group of eight locations – Burton Barr Central Library, Agave Library, Desert Broom Library, Cesar Chavez Library, Cholla Library, Ironwood Library, Mesquite Library and Palo Verde Library – offering in-building visits beginning Monday, April 19th.

All in-building visits will require a 45-minute reservation, face coverings and social distancing. Beginning Friday, April 16, advance reservations can be made at select locations up to three days prior via [phoenixpubliclibrary.org](#) or through the Library's call center at 602-262-4636.


Beginning Monday, April 19, drop-in customers may request a reservation at the door as available. Each facility's occupancy allowance will have a designated number dedicated to accommodating drop-in customers.

Customers making a reservation will be able to access services inside a library facility such as:

- Use a computer or the internet.
- Browse the library collection.
- Use a printer, scanner or copier.
- Pick up items on hold.
- Check out laptop and/or use Wi-Fi hotspot.

The second and third library location groups will continue with the current Curbside Service and hours until they transition to the In-Building visits service model (Monday, May 3 and then Monday, May 17, respectively).

COMMUNITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The [U.S. Small Business Administration](#) officially opened the [Shuttered Venue Operators Grant](#) application portal on April 8, 2021, for operators of live venues, live performing arts organizations, museums and movie theatres, as well as live venue promoters, theatrical producers and talent representatives to apply for critical economic relief, as those eligible entities are some of the first that had to shutter their doors a year ago in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.



The SBA is accepting SVOG applications on a first-in, first-out basis and allocating applicants to respective priority periods as it receives applications. The first 14 days of SVOG awards, which are expected to begin in late April, will be dedicated to entities that suffered a 90 percent or greater revenue loss between April and December 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The second 14 days (days 15-28) will include entities that suffered a 70 percent or greater revenue loss between April and December 2020. Following those periods, SVOG awards will include entities that suffered a 25 percent or greater revenue loss between one quarter of 2019 and the corresponding quarter of 2020.

The SBA has posted a [national informational webinar](#) to highlight the application process for potential eligible entities. The agency also provided recurrent program updates and information via [frequently asked questions](#), additional [video tutorials](#), an [application checklist](#), and [eligibility requirements](#) through SBA's dedicated SVOG website - sba.gov/svogrant - and targeted outreach to potential applicants.

In addition, SBA's resource partners, including SCORE Mentors, Small Business Development Centers, Women's Business Centers and Veterans Business Outreach Centers, are available to provide entities with individual guidance on their applications. Applicants can find a local resource partner via SBA's website at [SBA Local Assistance](#) or via a [zip code](#). (Per federal grant program guidelines that the same and equal information needs to be provided to each applicant, SBA's team members are limited on responses they can provide to individual, specific questions regarding [SVOG eligibility](#), potential grant amount, or other detailed information.)

NORTHWEST EXTENSION PHASE II CONSTRUCTION UPDATE Week of April 5



The Northwest Extension Phase II (NWEII) project will extend light rail west on Dunlap Avenue from 19th Avenue, then north on 25th Avenue and across I-17 on Mountain View Road with a terminus on the west side of the freeway near Metrocenter Mall. Northwest Extension Phase II light rail project construction is underway by the project contractor, Kiewit-McCarthy, A Joint Venture (KMJV) and third-party utility companies, such as Salt River Project (SRP). Dunlap Avenue:

- **Dunlap Avenue between 19th and 25th avenues:** KMJV and SRP are performing underground utility relocation and roadway construction on Dunlap Avenue between 19th and 25th avenues during day and nighttime hours. Traffic lanes will be located on the south side of Dunlap Avenue and restricted to one west- and one eastbound lane. Traffic restrictions will be in place 24/7 through 5 a.m. Saturday, June 12, 2021. Click [here](#) for construction notice.
- **Dunlap Avenue: 24th Avenue closure:** KMJV is performing underground utility relocation and roadway construction on 24th Avenue, just north of Dunlap Avenue. This work will require a closure at the location. In addition, left turns will not be available for eastbound traffic at Dunlap and 24th avenues. Traffic restrictions will be in place 24/7 through 7 a.m. Saturday, June 12, 2021. Click [here](#) for construction notice.
- **Dunlap Avenue: 22nd Avenue closure:** KMJV is performing underground utility relocation and roadway construction on 22nd Avenue, just north of Dunlap Avenue. This work will require a closure at the location. In addition, left turns will not be available for eastbound traffic at Dunlap and 22nd avenues. Traffic restrictions will be in place 24/7 through 5 p.m. Saturday, June 12, 2021. Click [here](#) for construction notice.

25th Avenue:

- **25th Avenue between Dunlap Avenue and Mountain View Road:** KMJV is reconstructing the Arizona Canal bridge on 25th Avenue between Dunlap Avenue and Mountain View Road during day and nighttime hours. North and southbound traffic lanes will be closed on 25th Avenue at the Arizona Canal Bridge. Traffic restrictions will be in place 24/7 through 7:00 a.m. Saturday, July 31, 2021. Click [here](#) for construction notice.
- **Rose Mofford Sports Complex and Dog Park:** KMJV is replacing drainage infrastructure in and adjacent to Rose Mofford Sports Complex and Dog Park. The work will involve removing fencing on the southwest corner of the dog park. Temporary fencing will be placed, allowing continued use of the park during construction. In addition, available parking areas will change throughout the process. The Rose Mofford Sports Complex and Dog Park will remain open during this work. The work will be completed in late spring 2021. Click [here](#) for construction notice.

Mountain View Road:

- **Mountain View Road between I-17 Frontage Road and 25th Avenue:** KMJV is installing a retaining wall on the north side of Mountain View Road between the I-17 frontage road and 25th Avenue during daytime hours. Traffic lanes will be located on the south side of Mountain View Road and restricted to one east- and one westbound lane. Traffic restrictions will be in place 24/7 through 7 a.m. Friday, June 18, 2021. Click [here](#) for construction notice.

Plan ahead for warmer weather travel on Arizona's highways

Having an emergency prep kit in the vehicle is a year-round smart idea. Just like ADOT reminds travelers each fall to prepare an emergency preparation kit in case of winter weather conditions, the same recommendation holds true for the rest of the year. Especially when temperatures will continue that inevitable climb in the coming weeks.

Many of the items in a kit will remain the same year-round. You should pack items that help keep you comfortable and safer in case your vehicle breaks down or an unscheduled closure happens and traffic is stopped due to crashes, disabled vehicles or even wildfires.



It's important to follow health and safety protocols during the current health situation. Don't forget to bring face coverings and use when appropriate while traveling.

Some of the items you'll want to pack for warmer weather travel:

- Extra drinking water in case an unscheduled stop in traffic occurs. Packing water on ice in a cooler also is a good idea.
- Fully charged mobile device and charger.
- An extra blanket or two. Maybe not for keeping warm but possibly for kneeling on if changing a tire. (A blanket also is a good component of overall first aid supplies).
- A well-stocked first aid kit.
- Hats, sunglasses, sunscreen and an extra set of loose-fitting cotton clothing.
- An umbrella for use in sun or rain.
- Bring a paper map in case cellular service is not available.
- In case of travel delays, bring an adequate amount of prescription medications.
- Healthy snack foods.
- Other items you may be glad you packed include a flashlight, extra batteries and extra diapers.

Take steps to limit problems with your vehicle. Having engine fluid levels, fan belts and tire pressure checked ahead of time could save you risky time spent along a busy or lonely stretch of highway. Proper tire pressure is important for reducing the risk of a blowout in hot weather.

Now is also a good time to check the condition of your windshield wipers and not let your gas tank level drop too low.

Real-time highway conditions are available on ADOT's Arizona Traveler Information site at az511.gov, or by calling 511. When a freeway closure or other major traffic event occurs, the free app for ADOT Alerts, available at ADOTAlerts.com, will send critical information directly to app users in affected areas and, when possible, in advance of alternate routes.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Economic Development & Education

Arts and Culture Community Arts Grants Program applications for fiscal years 2021-22 closed on April 1. Arts and Culture staff held four online grants workshops, posted a set of FAQs, and held over 60 one-on-one meetings with potential grantees. Arts and Culture staff received over 100 applications, a substantial increase from last year. Staff is reviewing applications for completeness and eligibility to prepare for virtual grants panels next month.

Arts and Culture along with Streets Transportation, Neighborhood Services and Communications staff partnered to coordinate a socially distanced dedication of the new Loop 202 Pedestrian bridge by artist Jody Pinto on March 29. Staff was joined by Dr. Jaime Rivera, Superintendent of Riverside School District and Arts and Culture Commission Vice Chair Crys Waddell. The dedication can be found on youtu.be/YpeM50PSpBw.

Between March 24 – 30, Aviation staff distributed 9,990 FEMA masks to the traveling public.

Nightly testing shutdowns of the PHX Sky Train between the 44th St. Station and the Terminal 3 Station will take place from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m., April 5 - 25. The airport shuttle will be in operation to transport passengers and employees through the area. Signage is in place with information regarding the shutdowns and alternative transportation.

Communications staff completed budget videos in English and Spanish for the 2021-2022 fiscal year Budget Tabloid. Advertisements for budget hearings ran in the Arizona Republic, Prensa Hispana and Arizona Informant newspapers and websites. Other promotions include budget hearing content on the downtown Legends billboards, social media campaigns in English and Spanish and Grocery TV point-of-sale displays at 21 Food City and Bashas' locations in Phoenix. In the first week of the Grocery TV campaign, the budget ads have been played approximately 170,000 times.

Communications, along with the Human Services Department, partnered in a media event to promote the 2021 Emergency Rental Assistance Program. The new program will distribute \$51 million in assistance to residents who need help making rent payments and covering the costs of home utilities and will be administered by Human Services staff and the non-profit Wildfire.

The Convention Center had three notable bookings, 2023 AZ Rock N Roll Marathon Health and Wellness Expo, KeHE Distributors and 2024 International Spa Association (ISPA) Conference & Expo. The 2023 AZ Rock N Roll Marathon Health and Wellness Expo is scheduled for January 2023 and estimates having 16,000 attendees, equating to 6,120 total room nights. The KeHE Distributors event is scheduled for January 2024 and estimates having 3,900 attendees, equating to 5,680 total room nights. The 2024 ISPA Conference and Expo is scheduled for April 2024 and estimates having 2,600 attendees, equating to 4,608 total room nights.

On March 30, the Phoenix Biomedical Campus (PBC) welcomed its newest building at 850 N. 5th St. The virtual grand opening and ribbon cutting event celebrated the partnership between Arizona State University, Wexford Science + Technology and the City of Phoenix. This innovative partnership brings together clinical trials, academic research and entrepreneurial activity on the PBC. The event showcased

the building's 227,000 square feet across seven floors of cutting-edge laboratory and research space. A virtual 360-degree self-guided tour is available [here](#).

Water Services staff kicked off Water Awareness Month on April 1. The campaign brings awareness to water conservation and how customers can save in and around their home.

Public Safety

Seventy-seven applicants have been invited to the Police Recruit written exam on April 10. Police recruitment remains open for applicants to register for a written exam scheduled for April 24 and May 7, as well as the ongoing online option.

Neighborhoods and Livability

On April 6, Office of Environmental Programs staff facilitated a meeting and site visit between City of Phoenix and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers South Pacific Division. The event began with Brigadier General Owen who discussed Rio Reimagined and the Phoenix-USACE Civil Works projects along the Salt and Gila rivers (such as Rio Salado Oeste and Tres Rios). Following the meeting, City of Phoenix staff took the USACE representatives on a windshield tour of Rio Salado Phoenix and Rio Salado Oeste and a tour of Tres Rios flow regulating wetlands and overbank wetlands. This visit provided City staff the opportunity to advocate for additional USACE funding to complete Tres Rios and restart Rio Salado Oeste.

TSG Constructors LLC and Planning staff conducted a final walk-through at an apartment complex at 5330 N. 21st Ave. The facility will provide assisted living for high functioning adults with autism. Staff inspected placement of two new fire lines, a sewer tap and line, a new driveway, curb and gutter, sidewalk, ADA parking stalls, landscaping, and resurfacing of 21st Avenue along the project's frontage.

Planning staff are working with the developer to approve a covenant agreement over the property line to meet fire separation requirements for a high rise at 200 W. Monroe Street. The first phase of the X Phoenix development includes 253 dwelling units and amenities with over 730,000 square feet.

Social Services Delivery

As of March 25, Housing staff have completed the tablet distribution for seniors with the last event taking place at Aeroterra Community Center. Seventy-six tablets were distributed along with masks and hand sanitizers.

During the week of March 29, Housing staff at Sunnyslope Manor assisted 28 Sunnyslope and LaCascada residents with signing up to receive the COVID-19 vaccination scheduled to be given at Sunnyslope Manor on April 12. The residents were very appreciative that the vaccine will be given at the Sunnyslope site because some of them are unable to get to other sites due to transportation issues.

On April 1, Housing staff and Native American Connections submitted a Low-Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC) application to the Arizona Department of Housing. LIHTC will help finance the first redevelopment phase at Deck Park Vista called The Moreland I. This phase will include 132 apartment homes with 131 Project Based Vouchers (PBV). Fifty-Six PBVs will be set aside to provide existing Deck Park Vista residents with the right to return once construction is complete and 75 PBVs will provide public housing residents living in the Edison-Eastlake Choice Neighborhoods Community with an

affordable housing option in another area of opportunity. If LIHTC reservation is secured for this project, then demolition and construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in late 2021.

During the week of March 29, Human Services staff conducted 2,043 wellness checks and delivered 2,645 meals for senior center members.

On March 30, the IRS reported the City of Phoenix's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance program electronically filed 785 tax returns for a total refund amount of \$1,022,618. A total of 21 families were assisted during the week of March 29.

This week, the Library College Depot staff hosted 35 individuals through several virtual events and programs. Additionally, staff assisted 52 individuals with one-on-one college planning and re-engagement appointments via phone or video conferencing.

Last week, in partnership with St. Mary's Food Bank Alliance, Library staff served 485 meals to children and teens, ages 18 and under. The Kid's Café program is the result of a grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture administered by the Arizona Department of Education. Meals are being provided Monday through Saturday during curbside pickup hours at select library branches.

To date, Library staff has provided curbside pickup services to more than 272,000 customers, with approximately 2,458,000 physical library materials circulated by library cardholders. Library staff assisted 905 customers over the phone as well as 2,097 customers who submitted an online form, with various inquiries related to library card registration, customer accounts, online databases, research and resources.

Infrastructure

On April 6, the State Selection Board approved a request from the Arizona State Land Department (ASLD) to transfer 3,900 acre-feet of its Municipal and Industrial subcontract to the City of Phoenix for use in the Biscuit Flats area on the TSMC project. This action begins the transfer process which will then go through several additional state and federal agencies, as well as the Maricopa County Superior Court, before the water can be included in Phoenix's subcontract. The process is anticipated to take approximately a year and will be repeated three times over consecutive years in order to complete the transfer of 12,000 acre-feet from ASLD to Phoenix.

Information Technology Services announced the city's Wi-Fi mapping application is live on the Open Data portal phoenixopendata.com. The featured showcase is a downloadable dataset of outdoor public Wi-Fi sites across Phoenix. The public can download the facility location data or connect to data services for their own use or application development.
