<u>FundPHX</u> is an online tool that was launched in January 2020 designed to educate and engage the public in the City's annual budget process. The tool is available with the 2023-24 adopted budget in both English and Spanish, giving residents an opportunity to try their hand at balancing the City's General Fund operating budget. It also allows residents to provide feedback on current funding levels and share community priorities with staff. Information collected in the

tool from residents will be shared regularly with City Council, so it can help guide development for the upcoming 2024-25 operating budget.
