Phoenix Awarded Grant Funds to Promote Affordable Connectivity Program

The City of Phoenix Community and Economic Development Department is launching a program to educate residents about the Affordable Connectivity Program, a federal program that helps ensure households can afford internet access. Along with education, city staff will also assist eligible residents in completing their applications. The benefit provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward internet service for eligible households. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.



Arizona Humane Society Launched a New Anti-Tethering Campaign

Chaining your dog outside is dangerous, and the Valley's scorching summer temperatures can even make it deadly. Tethered dogs can become tangled, trapping them without water or shelter. As temperatures rise, we are working with the Arizona Humane Society to raise awareness as our City law prohibits tethering a dog if the temperature is above 100 degrees. Break the chain. Drowning Zero is our vision to reduce the number of both adult and pediatric drownings in our city to zero. We can achieve this through community education,

rapid emergency response, and preventative action. Please follow these tips and help us achieve #DrowningZero!

Use an approved barrier to separate the pool from the house.

NEVER allow children to be alone near a pool or any water source. This includes bathtubs, buckets, toilets, ponds and canals.

Have life-saving devices near the pool, such as a hook, pole, or flotation device. Keep large objects such as tables, chairs, tricycles or ladders away from pool fences.

NEVER leave children unattended in or around a pool. ALWAYS have a designated child watcher.

Do not allow children to play in the pool area. Store all toys outside the pool area. If you leave the pool area, take the child (children) with you.




FIT PHX 2023 FITLOT

This new online data map shows all the emergency incidents dispatched in the Phoenix Fire Department service area, which is the City of Phoenix, Town of Paradise Valley and Laveen.

The map has a 30-day rolling window and has filters for Neighborhood and Council District. Incident locations are displayed based on their Category and all incidents are geo-coded down to the street level, so that there should not be any incidents shown on someone's home. <u>Launch the Map</u>.


Proposed Rate Increase for Phoenix Water Services and Stormwater Excise Tax

The Phoenix Water Services Department is proposing a rate increase to address rising costs for water and wastewater services. While the increase is necessary to meet inflationary pressures affecting utilities across the nation, Phoenix will still have some of the most affordable water services compared to other large cities, and customers who conserve water will be able to lessen the impact of the higher

rates. There is also a request to increase the Stormwater Excise Tax to fund the City's compliance with new requirements for preventing pollution from entering waterways.
