February flew by with many community events and outreach programs. Free Neighborhood Tree Plantings



This month, our office supported two free neighborhood tree plantings with the Office of Heat Response and Mitigation. The City launched two tree planting grant programs funded by federal grants in the fall. The Community Canopy grant program supports residents in low tree equity neighborhoods and the Canopy for Kids program supports planting trees in Phoenix schools. This project is funded through the Community Canopy grant program.

In the Camelback Community Neighborhood on Feb. 3rd, 20 more trees were planted on Campbell Ave. in addition to the 200 trees that were planted as part of the Cool Corridor along 55th Ave. from Camelback Rd. to Indian School Rd. This now provides community members a shaded sidewalk to walk and cycle.

In the North Glen Square Neighborhood on Feb. 17th, over 100 trees were planted at 52 different homes including another dozen trees recently planted in Mariposa Park. Click here to learn more about the program.

Graffiti Free Phoenix 10th Anniversary



February 2024 marks the 10th anniversary of Graffiti-Free Phoenix Awareness Month. While anti-graffiti education occurs year-round, the City of Phoenix highlights the issue in February to raise awareness about the negative effects of graffiti. We are committed to creating a safe, clean, and beautiful environment for residents and encourage them to report graffiti in their neighborhoods.

In most cases, the City will remove graffiti for free? In 2023, the Neighborhood Services Department's Graffiti Busters used over 10,000 gallons of paint and cleaned up more than 51,000 graffiti sites in Phoenix. Each day, they can

efficiently cover or eliminate as many as 200 graffiti sites, without charging any fees to residents or businesses.

Reporting graffiti is an important step to keeping Phoenix graffiti-free. Don't forget, graffiti is a crime. If you see it in action, call 911. If you notice graffiti, report it using one of three simple methods:

Non-Residential Financial Incentives to Remove Non-Functional Grass



The Phoenix Water Services Department is launching new financial incentives to help non-residential customers conserve water and save money by removing non-functional grass and converting to desert landscaping.

Key Highlights of the Incentive Program:

- Non-residential customers can receive \$2 per square foot of grass removed,
 up to a project total of \$250,000 per site, by converting to low water use, desert-adapted landscapes.
- A minimum of 1,000 square feet of grass must be removed to qualify for the incentive.
- The removed grass area must be replaced with a minimum of 50% live plant coverage at maturity per City of Phoenix Planning & Development (PDD) requirements.
- The final irrigation system must be drip-automatic.
- Applications will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis while funding lasts.
- Qualified applicants will receive their incentive in the form of a check, mailed to the address on file for their City Services Bill. Please allow up to 60 days to receive the check.
- The City will roll out the next phase of this financial incentive for residential customers as early as January 2025.
