I'm excited about the potential this brings for creating safer neighborhoods and a more secure community.

31st Ave. Street Paving & Bike Lanes

Current Roadway Design and Proposed Changes

Option A: No Changes

South of Maryland Avenue, parking is restricted in the bike lane from 7 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. on weekdays.

North of Maryland Avenue, parking is restricted in the bike lane from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekdays.




Bethany Home Road to Maryland Avenue / Maryland Avenue to Glendale Avenue

Option B: Parking Removal and Widened Bike Lanes



Bethany Home Road to Maryland Avenue



A future paving project along 31st Avenue between Bethany Home Road and Glendale Avenue provides an opportunity for the Phoenix Street Transportation Department to review re-striping options that would better accommodate the needs of all roadway users. The number of travel lanes will remain the same, but proposed options would narrow the lanes and remove some parking to widen bicycle lanes. The proposed bike lanes would connect to Maryland Avenue and to 31st Avenue at Bethany Home Road.

Pavement maintenance (new asphalt) is scheduled for summer/fall 2024, and

restriping would happen shortly after paving is completed. Join us for an in-person public meeting on Thursday March 28, 2024 at 6 p.m. at Ocotillo Elementary School Library, 3225 W. Ocotillo Rd., to discuss the project and proposed changes. Following the meeting, an online survey for community members to provide input will be available on this page in English and Spanish. The survey will be open through April 21, 2024. Click here for more details and to take the survey after Thursday.

Love Your Block Grant Application



In 2023, we (the Council District 5 Office) supported the Love Your Block grant application of the Glen Canyon Vista Block Watch to fund a neighborhood mural painting. The artist painted a beautiful mural that represents the community on the

wall of a convenience store on the corner of 27th Ave. and Northern Ave. (pictured above).

The Love Your Block (LYB) program is for listed neighborhood groups who are interested in making a difference in their community. The program is designed to develop and build neighborhood capacity. The LYB grant program offers neighborhood groups the opportunity to apply for grant funding up to \$5,000 to implement a community project that benefits their whole neighborhood.
