City Pools Open Memorial Day Weekend



City of Phoenix Pools will be opening this weekend for the 2023 summer season. A total of 18 pools will open this summer, with 15 open at a time. In District 5, Maryvale Pool, Starlight Pool and Washington Pool will be open May 27-29 and June 3-July 30 (closed Fridays). In addition, Maryvale Pool will be open for the extended season from August 5-6, 12-13, 19-20, 26-27 and September 2-4.

Residents can cool off during open swim from noon to 6pm or sign up for swim or water fitness classes, which take place before and after open swim hours. All the District 5 pools are Kool Kids pool locations, which allows kids 17 and under to

Street Improvements in Western District 5



In early May, city staff completed mill and overlay work in the western end of District 5 along Camelback Road between 107th Ave and 113th Dr. There have been 91.2 miles of Mill and Overlay Work, 112.2 Miles of preservation treatments,

and 182.8 of crack seal treatments as part of Transportation 2050 Pavement Maintenance progress between July 1st, 2018 and April 30th, 2023.
