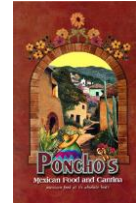
### 1. Best Activity for the Family – Judith Tunnell Accessible Trail, 10409 S. Central Ave. Phoenix, AZ 85042

## **COUNCILMAN NOWAKOWSKI RECEIVES OHTLI AWARD**

The Ohtli is considered the highest honor bestowed by the Government of Mexico to a leader outside of Mexico and acknowledges and celebrates the commitment, vision and impact of an individual in lifting the Mexican or Latino community. The Ohtli Award is granted once a year and consists of a medallion, a silver rosette, and a diploma. This year the award was given to Councilman Nowakowski for his arduous work and commitment in representing the Latino community in every issue affecting their lives and communities.

The word Ohtli means “path” in Nahuatl (language of the Aztecs), and this is what this distinction signifies: to open the path to progress. The title honors and recalls the continued tradition of Aztec descendants who still bid farewell with the phrase “Cualli ohtli!” (To have a good trail/journey).
