YEARLY ACCOMPLISHMENTS



1. Enter School Ready to Learn

Head Start Birth to Five Years

- Awarded an additional \$3.3 million per year in Early Head Start Program
- Expanded services to an additional 188 children in targeted communities

Kindergarten Bootcamp

- Delivered 25 series of camps for 375 families



2. Read on Grade Level by 3rd Grade

Read on Phoenix

- There were 156 adult tutors who provided tutoring for 535 K-3rd grade students in 2015-2016
- 78% increase of students served from 2014-2015



Little Libraries

- Partnership with Habitat for Humanity to provide Little Free Libraries to increase reading proficiency



3. Graduate from High School

Graduation Highway

- Partnership with Phoenix Union High School District and local celebrities to walk door to door to encourage youth to return to high school and increase graduation rates



Youth Engagement Summit

- 380 youth participated in focus groups and surveys to create long-term strategies to address youth disconnection
- Resulted in \$200,000 into the general fund budget to fund additional recreation programs



4. Complete Postsecondary Education/Training



Starbucks Training Store Opening

- Nationwide initiative to support job training and social change for opportunity youth
- Customer service training, leadership skills training, and free tuition



5. Be Employed

100K Initiative Opportunity Fair and Forum

- 1,555 youth attended fair resulting in 371 job offers

White House LinkedIn Summer Job Initiative

- Effort to provide youth 16-24 summer internship opportunities
- 2 companies participated providing summer internship opportunities to 4 youth

Transdev North America

- Leader in transportation industry
- Partnership with MBKPHX to provide Commercial Driver's License training and employment opportunities



Youth Build Grant

- City was awarded \$1.1 million grant to provide educational and occupational skills and opportunities for 66 youth between the ages of 16-24.



6. Be Safe from Violent Crime

Fines & Fee Reform Package

- Compliance program that assists individuals to reinstate driving privileges using payment plan
- Over 7,200 participants in the program resulting in \$3.5 million in previously uncollected fines



Ban the Box

- City of Phoenix eliminated requirement to disclose criminal history during employment application period
- Resulting in opportunity for applicants to discuss previous offenses in relation to job
