Feb. 10 - The Zero-Based Inventory of Programs Budget document (PDF) was presented to the City Council outlining costs, revenue, staffing levels, funding source, and other detail for more than 400 programs Citywide.

Feb. 24 - The 2015-16 General Fund Status Update and Five-Year General Fund Forecast as well as the Public Safety Funds Forecast and Hiring Plan will be presented.

March 24 - The City Manager's Trial Budget will be presented, and and will include proposals to provide a balanced 2015-16 budget.

April - Community budget hearings.

April 7 - The Preliminary five-year Capital Improvement Program will be presented.

- The Capital Improvement Program contains our planned construction program.
- The Zero-Based Inventory of Programs Budget document outlines costs, revenue, staffing levels, funding source, and other detail for more than 400 programs Citywide. The Inventory of
 Programs presents the City's budget by program, the key component of a Zero-Based Budget approach. The document is one element of a detailed and comprehensive presentation of
 the budget.


