

# **HOME-ARP Overview**

City of Phoenix –Awarded \$21 million

Available for expenditure until September 2030

#### **Qualifying Populations**

Individuals and families

- Experiencing homelessness
- At risk of homelessness
  - Cusp of eviction
  - Doubled up
  - Paying more than 50% of household income for rent and extremely low-income
- Fleeing or attempting to flee domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, and human trafficking





# **HOME-ARP Overview**

#### **Eligible Activities**

- New construction, acquisition and/or rehabilitation (including conversion)
  - Non-congregate Shelter
  - Rental Housing
- Supportive Services
- Tenant-based Rental Assistance
- Support for nonprofit project partners
  - Up to \$300,000 (Up to \$50,000/year/partner)
- Planning and Administration
  - Up to 15%





### What the Data Tells Us

#### **People Experiencing Homelessness**

- 2,909 were sheltered (January 24, 2022)
  - 307 were domestic violence survivors
- 3,096 were unsheltered (January 24, 2022)
- 1,020 people will return to homelessness each year
- The length of time people reside in shelters or remain unsheltered is increasing

#### **People At Risk of Homelessness**

- At any given time, 3,500 renters at risk of eviction within 21 days
- 2,035 low-income families are doubled up
- 35,510 extremely low-income renters pay more than 50% of income for housing
  - 6,210 are age 62 or older
  - 12,605 live in families that include 2-4 people
  - 5,250 live in families with 5 or more people
  - 11,445 are under age 62 and live alone or with non-relatives





# Consistent Themes - Stakeholder Input

- Homelessness is increasing because there are not enough housing units, particularly affordable rental units
  - Non-congregate shelter can help reduce unsheltered homelessness
- Once people experience homelessness, supportive services are often needed to help them retain housing
- Focus on the lowest-income and most vulnerable
  - Seniors
  - People with disabilities and their families
  - People who have experienced longer-term homelessness
