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City of Phoenix Human Services Department 2013 Community Assessment

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Executive Summary

In accordance with federal Head Start and Community Services Block Grant requirements, the City of Phoenix Human Services Department (HSD) has undertaken a community assessment with the broad purpose of documenting the characteristics and needs of individuals and families served by its programs. This report summarizes the results of the assessment.

As one of the nation's largest cities in terms of both physical size and population, Phoenix is home to a diverse population. The characteristics of the City's population, particularly the demographics of those who are eligible for or receive HSD services, are a significant focus of the assessment. A few demographic realities are especially noteworthy.

Most relevantly, nearly one-in-five Phoenix residents live in poverty, with even higher concentrations in neighborhoods in the South and West portions of the City. Poverty rates are comparatively higher among children, Hispanic and Black residents, non-citizens, individuals who have not completed high school, and households headed by unmarried women. The services provided by HSD are critical to assisting these individuals and families to achieve self-sufficiency.

The median age of Phoenix residents is 31.6 years, significantly less than the state and national medians. Given that children and young adults are more likely to live in poverty than older adults, the City's youth has important implications for HSD. In fact, nearly 31 percent of Phoenix children under the age of five years live in poverty. The services offered by HSD are often critical in helping the families raising these children make ends meet. Additionally, for a variety of reasons – parents working long hours, few books in the home, lack of access to quality child care – children from homes in poverty often start school at a disadvantage. Programs such as Early Head Start and Head Start are critical to bridging these gaps.

At the other end of the age spectrum, Phoenix is home to more than 250,000 residents over 55 years of age. These individuals are much less likely to live in poverty, with a 10.5 percent poverty rate among this group. However, many of these individuals have other needs, including the 47,000 seniors who live alone and the 35,000 households in which a grandchild is living with a grandparent, including 14,000 grandparents who are financially responsible for their grandchild. The senior centers operated by HSD offer a number of important supports, including meal programs and socialization opportunities.

The growth in the Hispanic population is another significant demographic trend. Phoenix became a majority-minority City over the past decade as the number of individuals of Hispanic descent increased 31 percent, compared to growth of only one percent among White residents. The Hispanic population is also much younger, on average. About 55 percent of children in Phoenix are Hispanic. Phoenix residents of Hispanic descent are more likely than other racial groups to be living in poverty. Additionally, a sizeable number of Hispanic households struggle with English, which must be considered when planning services.

Programming to meet the needs of these diverse groups is the challenge for HSD in the coming years. Consideration of these needs and resources must be viewed against the backdrop of the Great Recession.

The impact the national recession has had on the City is evident throughout the Community Assessment. The greater Phoenix area has 150,000 fewer jobs today than five years ago. Nearly 58,000 Phoenix homes have been lost to foreclosure in the past four years. Home values remain significantly below their 2007 highs.

As a result, many families are seeking assistance for the first time. For example, 42 percent of individuals experiencing homelessness who sought shelter in Maricopa County in fiscal year 2011 were homeless for the first time.

The same economic factors that have increased the need for assistance have, unfortunately, decreased governmental resources to provide these services. As a result, the number of individuals served by programs including Early Head Start, Head Start, and Family Services Centers has remained little changed in recent years.

Working within these constraints, the Human Services Department continues to deliver high-quality services that are much-appreciated by the community. When asked to name the Department's greatest strengths, stakeholders who contributed to this assessment most frequently mentioned HSD's staff and leadership, as well as the individual programs administered by HSD.

The foundation of quality programs and exceptional staff ensure the Human Services Department is well-positioned to continue to serve the City's residents in need.

Introduction

The City of Phoenix's Human Services Department (HSD) delivers a variety of social services to City residents, ranging from Early Head Start and Head Start programs to senior centers, from rental and utility assistance for families in crisis to shelter services for those experiencing homelessness, from assistance for victims of crime to tax filing assistance.

Some of these programs are funded, at least in part, by federal funds, including Head Start grant dollars and the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG). Both of these grants require grantees to conduct periodic community assessments. Specifically, federal Head Start regulations mandate that grantees conduct assessments that include:

- (1) The demographic make-up of Head Start eligible children and families, including their estimated number, geographic location, and racial and ethnic composition;
- (2) Other child development and child care programs that are serving Head Start eligible children, including publicly funded State and local preschool programs, and the approximate number of Head Start eligible children served by each;
- (3) The estimated number of children with disabilities four years old or younger, including types of disabilities and relevant services and resources provided to these children by community agencies;
- (4) Data regarding the education, health, nutrition and social service needs of Head Start eligible children and their families;
- (5) The education, health, nutrition and social service needs of Head Start eligible children and their families as defined by families of Head Start eligible children and by institutions in the community that serve young children;
- (6) Resources in the community that could be used to address the needs of Head Start eligible children and their families, including assessments of their availability and accessibility.¹

CSBG requirements are less prescriptive, requiring only (*emphasis added*):

an assurance that the State will secure from each eligible entity in the State, as a condition to receipt of funding by the entity through a community services block grant made under this chapter for a program, *a community action plan* (which shall be submitted to the Secretary, at the request of the Secretary, with the State plan) *that includes a community-needs assessment for the community served*, which may be coordinated with community-needs assessments conducted for other programs;²

This assessment has been conducted to comply with these conditions. In addition to meeting these federal requirements, undertaking a regular assessment of the community affords HSD the

opportunity to understand the needs of the individuals and families it serves, to identify the strengths of its programs as well as potential gaps, and to support strategic planning.

Data Sources and Methodologies

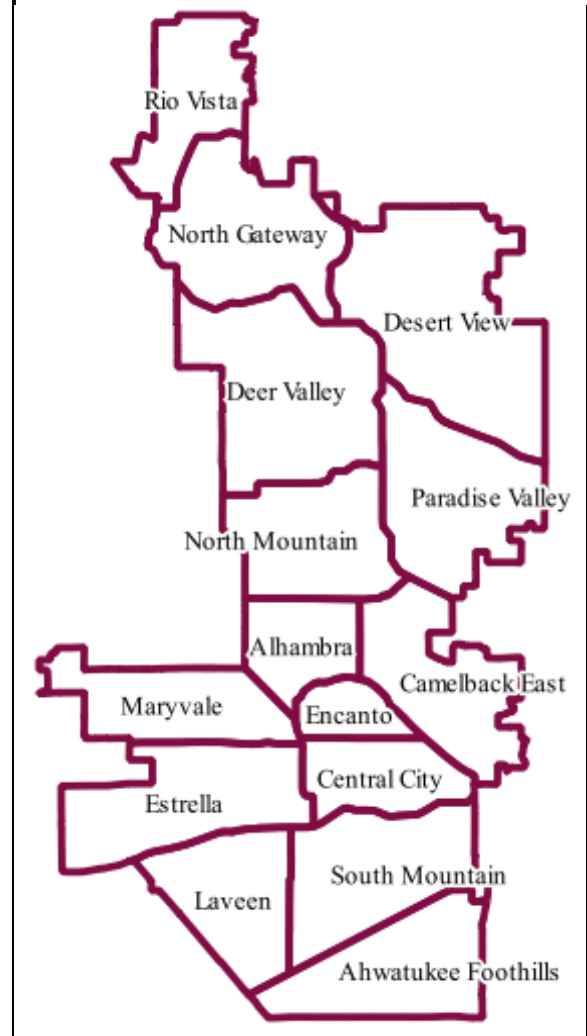
A variety of data sources have been incorporated in the assessment including:

- Census data
- Service data from federal, State, and City agencies
- Surveys of HSD service recipients and partners
- Secondary research of data from various sources

In order to compile demographic data not captured in the full decennial Census (such as income, education, and language), unless otherwise noted this report relies on the Census Bureau's five-year American Community Survey (ACS) estimates for the period of 2006 through 2010. The ACS is an ongoing survey that collects information from approximately one percent of American households each year and uses this sample to develop full-population estimates. The five-year ACS data produced a Phoenix population estimate of 1,438,473, which is within one-half of one percent of the actual 2010 Census count of 1,445,632. Detailed information regarding the ACS tables used and methodologies employed is provided in Appendix A.

There is significant diversity across Phoenix neighborhoods. As a result, whenever possible data is presented in terms of various regions of the City. Specifically, this assessment relies on the City's 15 planning villages to summarize data available at either the census tract or zip code level. Figure 1 illustrates these village boundaries and Appendix A includes discussion of the methodology used to apportion data across the villages. Additionally, data relevant to the Early Head Start and Head Start programs are presented according to the programs' specific service areas.

In order to provide a thorough overview of the public assistance programs available to low-income individuals and families and of how demand for these programs has changed in recent years, the assessment gathered enrollment data from a number of government agencies, including:

- City of Phoenix's Human Services Department and Housing Department
- Arizona Departments of Economic Security (DES), Education (ADE), and Health Services (DHS), the Arizona Early Childhood Development and Health Board (First Things First), and the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS)
- Federal Social Security Administration and Department of Housing and Urban Development

A key source of data for this assessment was a community survey of HSD clients and partners conducted in October and November 2012. The survey sought to gauge respondents' opinions regarding their communities' strengths and challenges, the types of services they need and use, and their satisfaction with HSD services. The survey was made available in English, Spanish, and Chinese at service locations such as Head Start delegate agency sites, senior centers, and family services centers. A separate online survey was emailed to a sample of HSD partners, including providers, advocates, and HSD Commission members.

A combined 1,950 client surveys (1,408 English, 513 Spanish, and 29 Chinese) were completed. Of these, 345 indicated they participated in Early Head Start services within the past year, 670 received Head Start services, 461 attended a senior center, 71 utilized a Family Service Center, 19 received services from the Watkins Homeless Shelter, and 20 used a family advocacy center. Respondents may have used multiple services, making this a duplicated count. Additionally, 572 respondents did not indicate which service(s) they utilized. A total of 84 partner surveys were received. Copies of the English surveys and detailed tabulations of survey responses are included in Appendix I.

Assessment Overview

This assessment is comprised of four Parts:

- Part I includes a general overview of the City, with sections devoted to the demographics of the City's residents, education, employment, housing, crime, and community amenities
- Part II outlines the services provided by the Human Services Department and the populations receiving these services
- Part III discusses the Early Head Start and Head Start programs and includes the specific assessment elements required by federal regulations
- Part IV concludes the assessment with a brief overview of comments received from surveyed partners regarding HSD's strengths and suggestions for improvements

There are also 10 appendices that provide the detailed analyses developed to compile this assessment for readers interested in additional data.

Part I: Overview of the City of Phoenix

The City of Phoenix is the political, economic, and geographic center of Arizona and is a vibrant and dynamic place. Covering almost 518 square miles, it is the nation's tenth largest city in terms of land area and the sixth most-populous city in the country.

The City is remarkably diverse. Neighborhoods range from affluent communities home to large concentrations of retirees to inner-city areas home to large numbers of young families attempting to work their way out of poverty. Given this diversity, it is important to consider the City's neighborhoods individually and as part of the whole and to tailor City services to each area's unique needs.

Section I-1: Demographic Profile

Between the 2000 and 2010 censuses, the City of Phoenix's population grew 9.4 percent, from 1,321,045 to 1,445,632.³ This pace made Phoenix the second-fastest growing city out of the ten most populous cities in the country, trailing only San Antonio, but Census estimates indicate nearly all of this growth occurred during the first half of the decade. Population growth is estimated to have stagnated and declined over the past four years. This reversal likely had a variety of causes, but a primary factor was the economic recession that hit Arizona particularly hard and greatly reduced employment opportunities. With the economy gradually improving, the City is likely to return to more historical growth patterns.

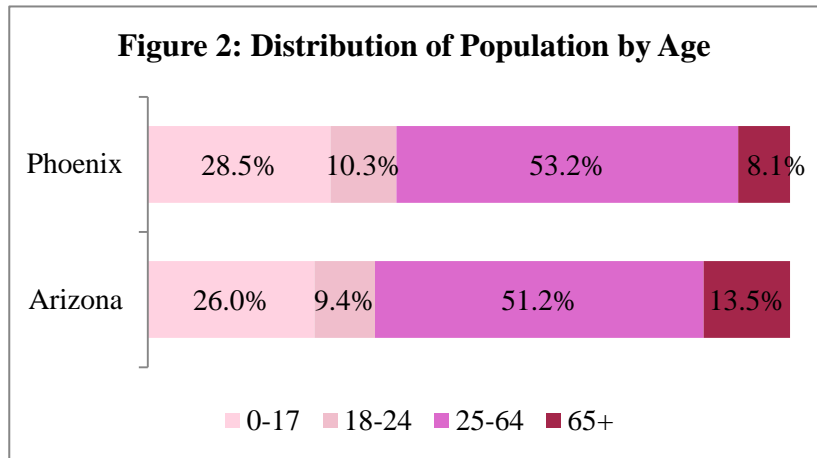
There are 518,665 households in the City. In Census parlance, each household has a single 'householder' who is the person, or one of the people, in whose name the home is owned or rented. A family household is defined as one in which at least one member of the household is related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. About 64.1 percent of total Phoenix households, or 332,363, are considered family households. Of these, 226,898 are led by a married couple, representing 68.3 percent of family households and 43.7 percent of all households. Of the remaining family households, more than twice as many are led by female householders (72,817) than male householders (32,648). In comparison, non-family households are slightly more likely to be led by a male householder (96,596) than a female householder (89,696).

Phoenix is a young city in a young state. Arizona has the seventh-lowest median age – 35.5 years – amongst the 50 states. The City's residents are significantly younger, with a median age of 31.6 years. Among the ten most populous cities, only Dallas has a younger population with a median age of 31.5 years.

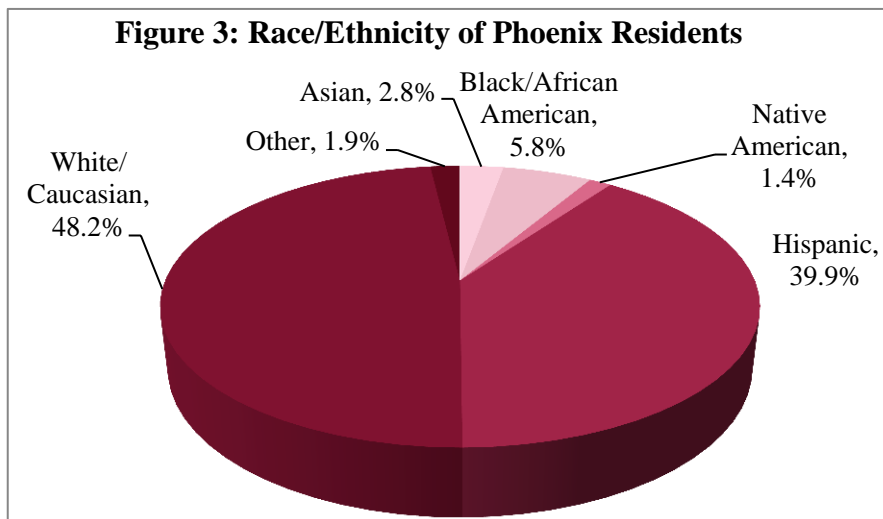
Figure 2 compares the age distribution within the City to the statewide total. Twenty-eight-and-one-half (28.5) percent of Phoenix's residents are under 18 years of age, compared to the statewide total of 26.0 percent. At the other end of the spectrum, only 8.1 percent of individuals living in Phoenix are 65 years of age or older while the statewide total is 13.5 percent. There are

significant differences in the age distribution across Phoenix neighborhoods. In the southwestern part of the City, the Estrella, Maryvale, Laveen, Central City, and Alhambra villages, as well as South Mountain, more than 30 percent of all residents are younger than 18 years. In both Maryvale and Estrella, more than 35 percent of residents are children. In every other village, fewer than 30 percent of residents are under 18 years of age. Conversely, relatively larger shares of the population are 65 years of age and older in the northern and eastern parts of the City, with more than 11 percent of residents in the Rio Vista, Paradise Valley, and Camelback East villages in this age group.



Phoenix is more racially diverse than the State as a whole and is now majority-minority, meaning that less than half of the City’s residents are non-Hispanic White. Figure 3 depicts the City’s racial/ethnic makeup. Between the 2000 and 2010 census, the number of residents in each racial/ethnic category increased, but there were large differences across groups. The number of individuals of Asian descent increased 71 percent while the number of individuals reporting that they were White/Caucasian increased by only one percent. In terms of numbers, the most significant increase was in the number of individuals reporting Hispanic ethnicity, who grew by nearly 140,000, or 31 percent.



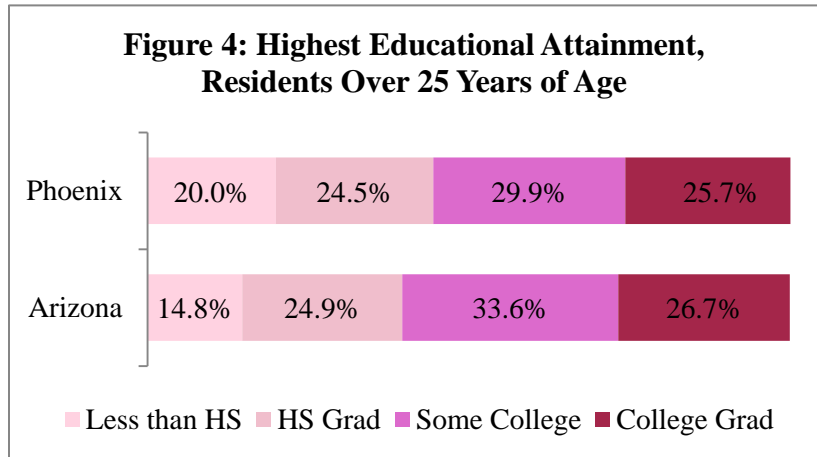
This trend is likely to continue as the Hispanic population is significantly younger than the White population. The median age of the Hispanic population in Phoenix is 23.9 years compared to 31.6 years for the City overall. Approximately 55 percent of children in Phoenix are Hispanic.

Phoenix’s racial diversity is also evident in the primary language spoken in City households. Nearly one-third of Phoenix households (172,006) primarily speak a language other than English. Most of these households (135,430) primarily speak Spanish. Households are considered ‘linguistically isolated’ if no one in the household over the age of 14 years old is

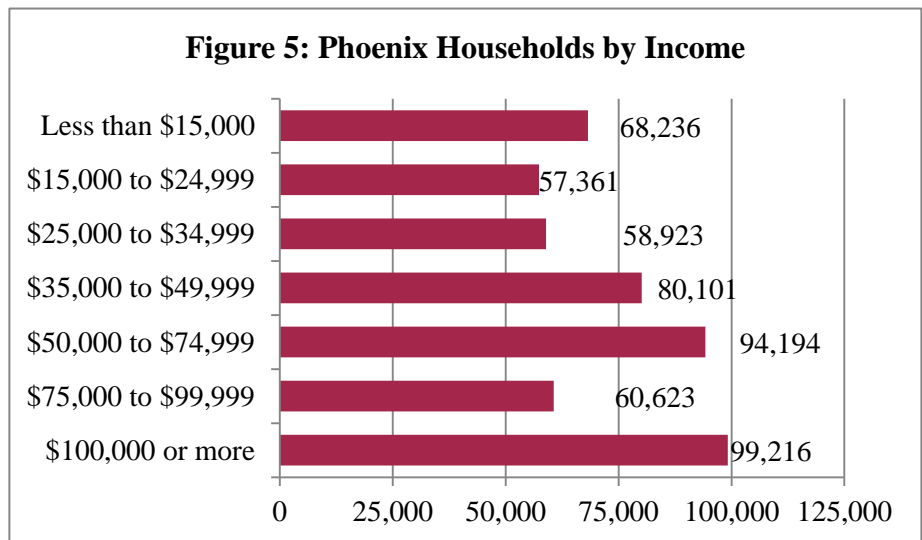
reported as speaking English ‘very well’. In Phoenix, 51,532 households, 9.9 percent of all households, are linguistically isolated, with most primarily speaking Spanish. In three villages – Estrella, Maryvale, and Central City – more than half of households primarily speak a language other than English and more than 20 percent are considered linguistically isolated.

Approximately one-in-six Phoenix residents are not United States citizens (the Census does not ask whether non-citizens have legal status) compared to about one-in-ten statewide. In the Maryvale, Estrella, Central City, and Alhambra villages more than 20 percent of residents are non-citizens and the South Mountain and Encanto villages are just short of 20 percent.

Figure 4 compares the educational levels of Phoenix residents over the age of 25 years to the statewide numbers for the same age group. In general, the City’s educational levels are somewhat less than the State as a whole. About one-in-five Phoenix residents, 20.0 percent, in this age group have not completed high school or equivalent, compared to 14.8 percent statewide. Another quarter of the Phoenix population has no education beyond high school. There are 226,207 Phoenix residents who have completed a bachelor’s or higher degree, or 25.7 percent of all individuals in this age group, which is only slightly less than the 26.7 percent statewide average.



A greater proportion of Phoenix’s working age population has jobs than the State overall, likely due both to its younger population and relatively more job opportunities compared to other parts of the State. Of Phoenix residents who are 16 years of age or older, 62.7 percent are employed; statewide, 57.5 percent are employed. In Ahwatukee Foothills, Deer Valley, and North Gateway, more than 70 percent of working age residents are employed. By comparison, only 43.0 percent of working age residents in Central City are employed.



The annual median income of Phoenix households is \$48,823, which is 3.3 percent less than the \$50,448 statewide median. Figure 5 notes the percentage of households at various income ranges. Incomes, however, vary widely across the City. Although households earning less than \$15,000 annually represent only 13.2 percent of all Phoenix households, they comprise more than 40 percent of Central City households. At the other end of the spectrum, 44.2 percent of Desert View households and 41.2 percent of North Gateway earn more than \$100,000 annually.

Section I-2: Health Profile

An individual's health can have a profound impact on all aspects of their life. Good health is a result of a number of factors, including access to routine health care and healthy behaviors.

One key to good health is access to quality care. This is impacted both by access to insurance and the location of healthcare providers. To the first issue, about 1.2 million individuals statewide do not have health insurance, or 19 percent of the total population. To the second, Phoenix is home to numerous healthcare providers, including:⁴

- 28 hospitals
- 9 federally qualified health centers
- 321 assisted living centers and homes
- 24 nursing homes

To provide a detailed view of the health of Arizonans, St. Luke's Health Initiative conducts the Arizona Health Survey. There is a survey for adults and a different survey used to discuss the health of children under five years of age. The most recent survey was conducted in 2010 and included more than 8,200 adults as well as responses for 2,154 young children. Of those, 1,089 adult surveys and 184 young children surveys were from Phoenix residents.

The results of the adult survey yield both strengths and weaknesses. Fewer than half reported their general health was "excellent" or "very good". A very clear trend based on income is evident. Only 18 percent of those with incomes below \$15,000 annually said their health was excellent or very good, compared to 72 percent of those with incomes above \$100,000. There was also a disparity based on insurance status with 48 percent of those with insurance and 38 percent of those without insurance rating their health as excellent or very good.

Most adults, however, generally indicated they have access to health care. More than 87 percent reported having health insurance, a rate higher than would be assumed based on statewide uninsured rates. Nearly 80 percent have a "personal doctor" to whom they would go for medical advice or treatment, and about 70 percent had seen a doctor within the past year. Similarly, about 62 percent of respondents had seen a dentist in the past year. In all three cases, percentages generally increase as individuals' ages increase.

Other highlights include:

- 63 percent of respondents were overweight or obese, with rates exceeding 70 percent among Black, Hispanic, and Native American individuals
- Incongruently, about 70 percent reported they engage in moderate or vigorous exercise three or more days per week
- More than one-in-ten survey participants reported having either clinical depression, bipolar disorder, or an anxiety disorder
- 20 percent smoked in the past year, with the highest rate among White individuals
- About 3.5 percent of individuals reported marijuana usage in the past year, 4.5 percent reported prescription drug abuse, and only a handful reported using other drugs

The results of the young children survey presented a very positive picture of the health of the City's youngest residents across all income groups and races, although children of Hispanic descent generally lagged behind other racial and ethnic groups. Notably, 60 percent of parents rated their young child's health as "excellent" and another 20 percent rated their health as "very good". About 16 percent rated "good" and less than four percent said their child's health was "fair" or "poor". Parents of children of Hispanic descent were somewhat less likely to select excellent or very good.

The survey also indicates Phoenix children have access to routine health care. Nearly 90 percent of children were reported to have health insurance, from either public or private sources. Almost 95 percent have a personal doctor and more than 95 percent had been to a doctor for routine care within the past year. However, only 54 percent of children older than two years of age had been to a dentist in the past year and 40 percent had never seen a dentist.

Several survey measures also point to healthy lifestyles among young children. Seventy (70) percent of children were reported to have been physically active for at least 60 minutes in each of the previous seven days. Almost three-quarters of parents reported a park, playground, or recreation area was within walking distance of their home. Additionally, 72 percent reported their child had one or fewer fast food meals within the past week.

Information regarding Arizona births between 2008 and 2010 is available from the Department of Health Services (DHS).⁵ The most notable observation is the 15 percent decline in the number of births in Phoenix during this period. There were 24,303 Phoenix births in 2010 compared to 28,640 in 2008. Of the 2010 births:

- Only 1.6 percent of mothers did not receive any prenatal care during their pregnancy
- 8.2 percent of newborns were considered low birth-weight, an increase from 7.3 percent in 2008
- 11.1 percent of births were to teen mothers, down from 14.0 percent in 2008

Separate DHS statistics report 53 percent of Phoenix births were to unwed mothers.⁶ Additionally, more than two-thirds of births in Phoenix were paid by a public payer (generally the State's Medicaid program).

Section I-3: Education Profile

Phoenix residents have a variety of options across the education continuum. State law establishes 'open enrollment', which allows students to apply for admission to any public school, based on available classroom space.⁷ Additionally, there are numerous charter and private schools located in Phoenix. There is similar diversity in higher education options, including public community colleges and universities, as well as private technical colleges and universities.

Primary and Secondary Education

According to the City of Phoenix, there are 30 school districts whose boundaries extend at least partially into the City.⁸ These include 21 elementary districts, 4 high school districts, 4 unified districts offering kindergarten through high school, and the Maricopa County Regional District. In general, the southern part of the City has non-unified elementary and high school districts while the northern portion is served by unified districts. In several instances, only a small portion of the City falls into a district's boundaries. In a couple of cases, part of Phoenix is covered by a district's boundaries, but the district does not have any schools actually located within the City. According to the Arizona Department of Education (ADE), there are 267 traditional public schools physically located in Phoenix.⁹ These schools reported total enrollment of nearly 192,000 students.¹⁰ Additionally, Arizona is a national leader in school choice and there are more than 600 public charter schools operating in the State, including 140 within the City. More than 36,000 students attend these schools.

Arizona schools have been challenged in recent years by funding reductions as the State has contended with historic declines in tax revenues. According to the Arizona Joint Legislative Budget Committee (JLBC), State funding for education declined 19.5 percent, from \$5.1 billion to \$4.1 billion between the high water funding year of fiscal year 2008 and fiscal year 2013.¹¹ The largest reductions have been in funding for new school facilities, basic state aid (general operations), and building maintenance, as well as funding from the Proposition 301 sales tax.

Additionally, a number of districts have lost bond or budget override elections in recent years, although they were largely successful in the November 2012 election. Of the 18 bond or override measures on the ballot for districts whose boundaries lie at least partly within Phoenix, 14 were successful. Voters statewide did defeat Proposition 204, which would have made

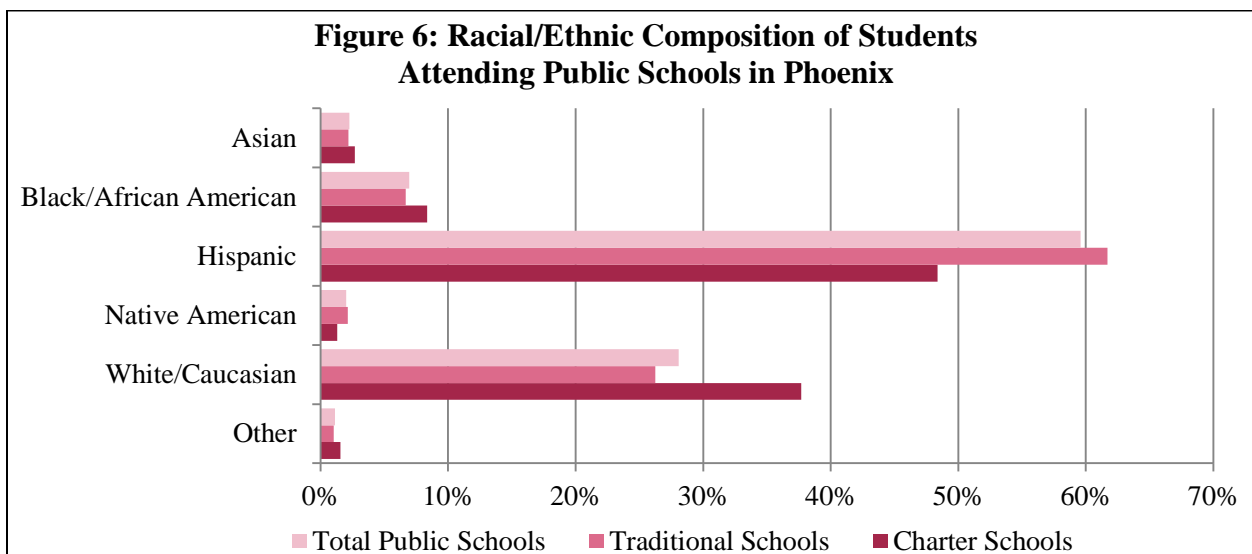

permanent a temporary one-cent sales tax scheduled to expire in May 2013 and directed the majority of the funds to education.

Overall, the JLBC reports the State is providing \$3,887 per student in fiscal year 2013, compared to an inflation adjusted \$4,901 in fiscal year 2008 (when adjusting for inflation, funding has declined 27.8 percent during the period). When local and federal funds are included, schools receive \$8,784 per student, compared to \$9,540 in fiscal year 2008.

Like Phoenix residents overall, students in schools within the City are a diverse group. Figure 6 compares the racial/ethnic composition of students attending traditional public schools and public charter schools within the City to the overall total.



As seen in the chart, Hispanic students comprise nearly 60 percent of enrollment in Phoenix schools, White students less than 30 percent, and Black students about seven percent. Racial composition varies widely across districts. Consistent with demographic trends, school districts located primarily in the southern part of the City are largely non-White while schools in the northern portion of the City are majority White. Of the 21 elementary school districts in Phoenix, 18 are at least 75 percent non-White; the exceptions are Madison, Kyrene, and Washington. In contrast, the Phoenix schools in the unified districts serving the northern parts of the City are majority White, except for Glendale Union, which is 44 percent White. The chart also shows there are noticeable differences in school attendance across racial and ethnic groups. In relative terms, White students are significantly more likely to attend charter schools, where they comprise 37.7 percent of enrollment compared to 26.3 percent of traditional school enrollment. Conversely, Hispanic and Native American students are comparatively more likely to attend traditional schools.

Many students have special needs. Figure 7 notes the proportion of students who receive free or reduced lunch, are English language learners, or receive special education services.

As the table demonstrates, nearly half of students in Phoenix schools receive free or reduced price lunches, meaning their families’ incomes are less than 185 percent of the federal poverty level, which translates to \$35,300 for a family of three in the current school year. In several districts in the southern and western parts of the City, more than 80 percent of students qualify for free or reduced lunches. More than 10 percent of all students are English Language Learners (ELL) and more than nine percent receive special education services. Notably, both ELL and special education students are about twice as likely to attend traditional district schools as charter schools.

Additionally there are nearly 14,000 children experiencing homelessness who attend school districts or charter providers with schools in Phoenix.¹² Figure 8 notes the number of Phoenix school children who are homeless. The table shows the number of school children without a home grew 23.7 percent in only two years. The largest cohort of children experiencing homelessness are kindergartners (1,229). The number decreases each year through the eighth grade before increasing again in the high school grades.

The Phoenix area districts with the highest counts of homeless students in 2012 are Phoenix Union High School (1,306), Alhambra Elementary (1,012), and Roosevelt Elementary (998).

There are a variety of ways to measure the performance of schools. ADE has established a system that seeks to incorporate many of these metrics and produce a single A through F letter grade. The formula takes into account Arizona Instrument to Measure Standards (AIMS) scores, the percent of ELL students reclassified, high schools’ graduation and drop-out rates, academic growth amongst all students, and academic growth amongst the bottom quartile of students. A somewhat different formula is utilized for alternative schools. Figure 9 notes the distribution of grades for schools in Phoenix, which is comparable to the statewide totals. Comparing traditional and charter schools, greater proportions of charters schools score high ‘A’ grades and low ‘D’ grades while larger shares of traditional schools rate ‘B’ and ‘C’ grades. There is significant variation across districts, even among neighboring districts. For example, 72 percent of the schools in the Cartwright Elementary School District received an ‘A’ or ‘B’, while only 10

percent of schools in the Isaac Elementary School District scored thusly.

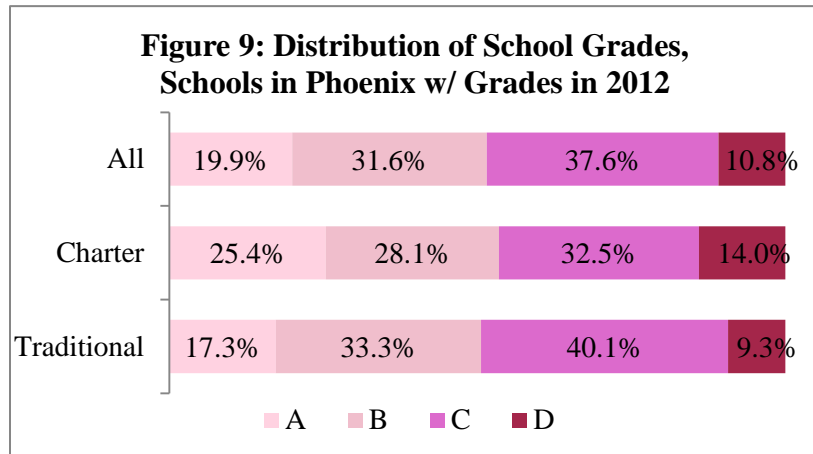


Figure 10: Five-Year Graduation Rates for Class of 2011, by Select Groups

The Arizona Department of Education calculates graduation rates for all traditional and charter high schools in the State. Its data indicates the five-year graduation rate for the class of 2011 was 81.3 percent.¹³ High schools located in Phoenix had a 79.0 percent graduation rate as detailed in Figure 10.¹⁴

The table shows traditional schools have significantly higher graduation rates than charter schools overall. However, there is wide variation across charter schools; of the 48 charter high schools in Phoenix, 14 have graduation rates that exceed 90 percent. Graduation rates for Native American, Hispanic, and Black students lag those of Asian and Caucasian students. Students who are economically disadvantaged or who have disabilities generally have lower graduation rates.

School-level detail for the information presented in this Section is provided in Appendix C.

Post-Secondary Education

Phoenix residents seeking post-secondary education have a large and diverse number of options. The Maricopa County Community College District is the largest in the country, with 10 campuses serving more than 250,000 students in fiscal year 2011. The District serves recent high school graduates as well as those seeking to gain occupational skills and lifelong education. Overall, the District offers approximately 1,000 occupational programs (degrees and certificates), 37 academic associate degrees, and 10,254 courses.¹⁵ The District awarded more than 21,000 certificates and associate degrees in fiscal year 2011.

Four of the District's campuses are located in Phoenix: Gateway, Paradise Valley, Phoenix, and South Mountain. Figure 11 reports fiscal year 2011 enrollment figures for these campuses, which has increased 345 percent over the past ten years, led by 572 percent growth at the South Mountain campus.¹⁶

Each of the State's three public universities – Arizona State University (ASU), the University of Arizona (U of A), and Northern Arizona University (NAU) has some presence in Phoenix, with ASU having the largest due to its main campus being located in nearby Tempe. ASU has a downtown Phoenix campus, which includes colleges of nursing, teaching, journalism, and public programs, and has announced its law school may relocate to Phoenix in the future. The U of A opened a medical school in Phoenix in 2007. NAU has partnerships with several community colleges allowing students to complete two years at the community college and two years with NAU on the same campus.

Additionally, Phoenix is home to 80 private vocational programs and degree-granting institutions licensed by the Arizona State Board for Private Postsecondary Education ranging from small specialized schools in areas such as massage therapy and polygraph science, to large universities such as the University of Phoenix and Grand Canyon University,¹⁷ 18 cosmetology schools

licensed by the Arizona Board of Cosmetology,¹⁸ and six barber schools licensed by the Arizona Board of Barbers.¹⁹

Section I-4: Economic Profile

Though fewer Phoenicians are employed today than five years ago, the City has posted modest job gains in each of the past two years and forecasters predict the greater Phoenix area will largely return to its historically strong growth and add almost 400,000 jobs over the next decade.

In an increasingly globalized and interconnected world economy, the greater Phoenix area's economy is substantially affected by national and international trends and the economic story of the past several years has been one of recession and subpar growth both in the United States and abroad. By many measures – percentage of jobs lost, declines in home values, decreases in tax revenues – Arizona was one of the states hardest hit by the national Great Recession.

Beginning in December 2007 and officially ending in June 2009, the 18-month recession was the nation's longest downturn since World War II. However, even this belies the depth of the recession. The national unemployment rate did not peak until January 2010 and neither the country nor the State has experienced the type of economic expansion typically following modern recessions. As the economic center of the State, Phoenix's experience during the recession largely mirrored that of the State. Though not fully recovered from the effects of the recession, the employment picture in the City has shown consistent, albeit gradual, improvement.

Phoenix's economy is large and diverse. The greater Phoenix area economy supports jobs at all skill levels and educational requirements in a variety of industries, as illustrated in Figure 12.²⁰

Using federal Bureau of Labor Statistics industry definitions, the greater Phoenix area’s largest industry by employment is trade, transportation, and utilities (almost 60 percent of this industry is comprised of retail jobs and wholesale trade accounts for more than 20 percent), followed by professional and business services (with the largest share in administrative services), education and health services, and government. As the table illustrates, the greater Phoenix area had 8.1 percent fewer jobs in 2012 than in 2007. Nearly every industry lost jobs, led by a 47.2 percent decline in construction jobs. The one exception is education and health services jobs, which actually grew 23.6 percent over the past five years. Additional industry data is provided in Appendix D.

Information collected by the Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG) provides further insight into employers located within the City. The database seeks to collect information from employers with at least five employees. The 2010 database includes 19,536 employers located within the City of Phoenix that collectively employ more than 650,000 individuals.²¹

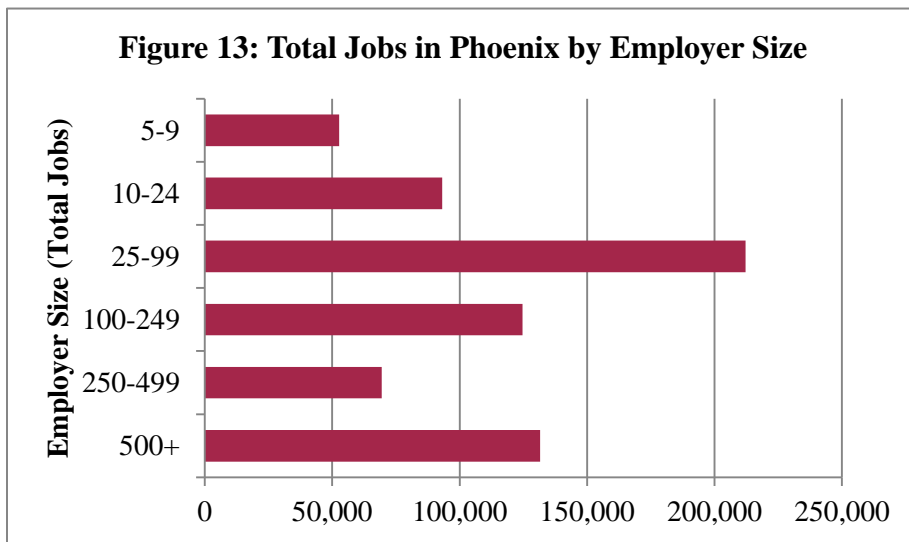


Figure 13 reports jobs by employer size. Although more than 70 percent of employers included in the database employ between 5 and 24 individuals (as noted, employers with fewer than five employees are excluded), larger firms are responsible for most Phoenix jobs. Firms with at least 25 employees represent

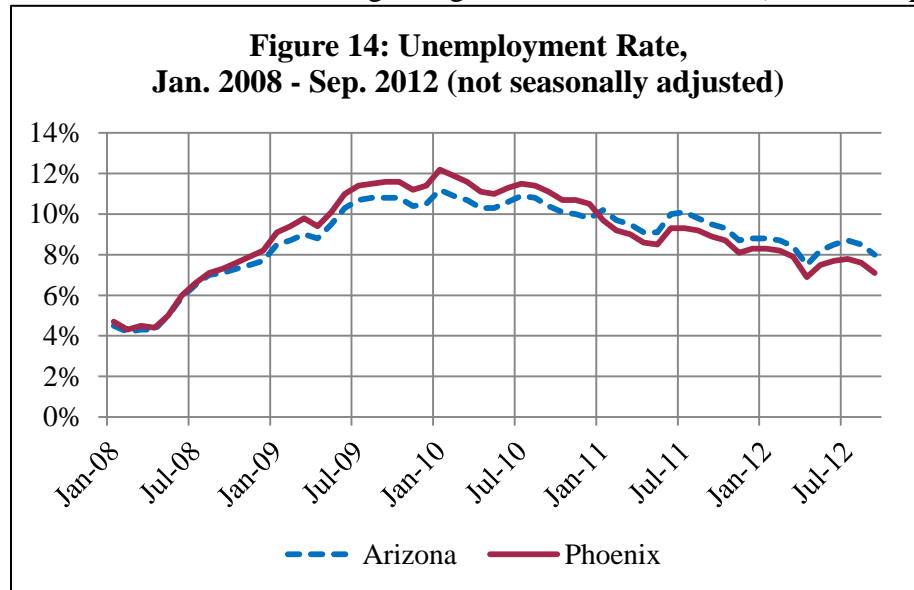
less than 30 percent of Phoenix businesses, but are responsible for more than 75 percent of the jobs in the City. According to the MAG employer data, the three largest employers in Phoenix are governments, led by the State and followed by the City and Maricopa County. The ten largest private employers are the Apollo Group (the parent of the University of Phoenix), American Express, Banner Health, Honeywell, St. Joseph’s Hospital, Bank of America, Wal-Mart, Fry’s Food Stores, Wells Fargo, and JP Morgan Chase Bank.

The MAG employer database indicates the major employment centers within the City. The Central City village has the greatest number of jobs as it encompasses downtown Phoenix and Sky Harbor Airport, and it has access from Interstates 10 and 17 and State Route 51. Central City is followed by Camelback East (which includes the Biltmore Corridor), Deer Valley (with major employers including American Express and Mayo Clinic near the intersection of I-17 and

the Loop 101), South Mountain (which benefits from its proximity to Sky Harbor), and Encanto (which includes the Central Avenue corridor between McDowell and Indian School Roads). The areas with the fewest jobs are the far northern (Rio Vista and North Gateway) and southern (Laveen and Ahwatukee Foothills) villages. Appendix D details employer and employee counts by industry and firm size across villages.

The loss of jobs depicted in Figure 12 resulted in a significant increase in the unemployment rate. The trend over the past four-plus years is displayed in Figure 14.²² In January 2008 (one month after the technical beginning of the Great Recession), the unemployment rate was slightly



higher than four percent. The City's rate grew nearly uninterrupted for two years, peaking in January 2010 at 12.2 percent and eclipsing the State's high-water mark by a full percentage point. Since that time the rate has trended downward, dropping lower than the State rate and reaching 7.1 percent in September 2012.

Job loss has affected residents in all regions of the City. In July 2012, 18,495 Phoenix residents received unemployment insurance (UI) benefits, a 336 percent increase over the 4,241 recipients in July 2008.²³ These numbers include only individuals eligible to receive UI benefits and, because there are many individuals who either do not qualify or have exhausted their benefits,²⁴ undercount the true number of individuals unable to find work. Growth in UI claimants in the City's villages ranged from 265 percent in Central City to 518 percent in North Gateway. The complete list of UI claimant counts by village is included in Appendix D.

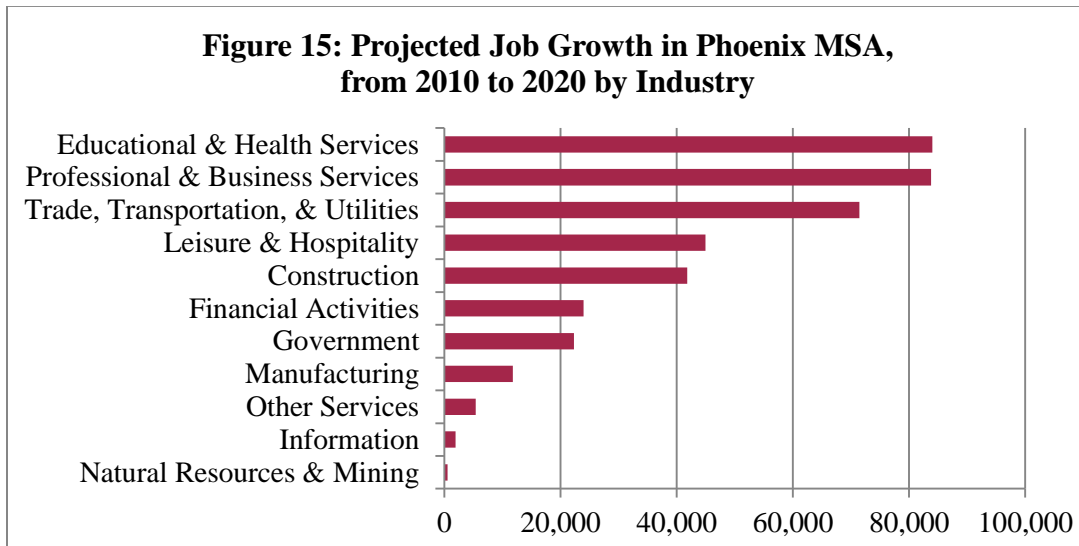
Despite the severe impact the Great Recession had on the City's economy, forecasters expect reasonably strong growth over the next decade with the greater Phoenix area set to add almost 400,000 jobs.²⁵ However, it is worth noting the region needs to add more than 150,000 jobs just to return to 2007 employment levels. Figure 15 presents this estimate by industry.

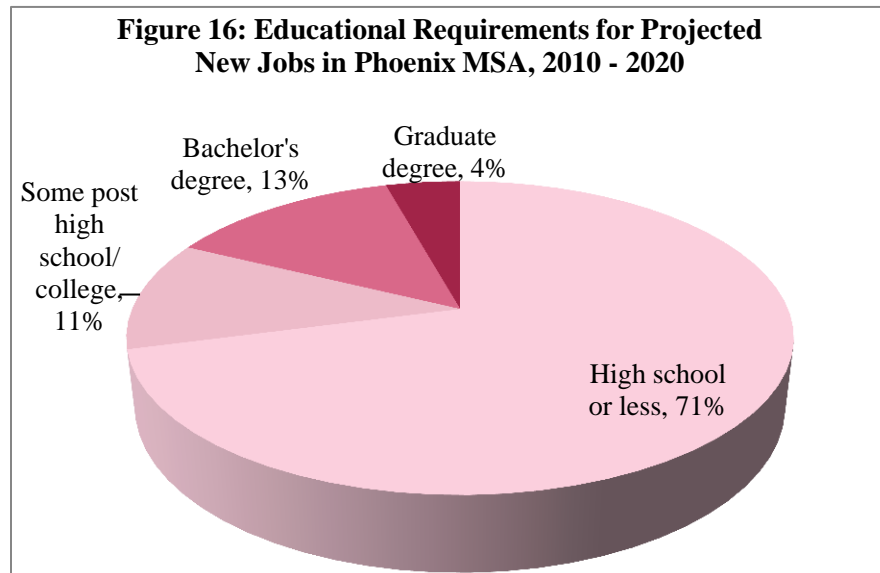

As the chart illustrates, the three biggest industries in the greater Phoenix area – education and health services (projected 84,000 new jobs over the next decade), professional and business services (84,000), and trade, transportation, and utilities (71,000) – are expected to add the greatest number of jobs. In percentage terms, the construction industry is expected to grow the most, adding 42,000 new jobs – a 50.7 increase – over the coming decade. No industry is expected to lose jobs overall during this period, but only minimal new jobs are projected in the natural resources and mining, information, and manufacturing industries.

The Phoenix economy is projected to provide opportunities for individuals with a variety of



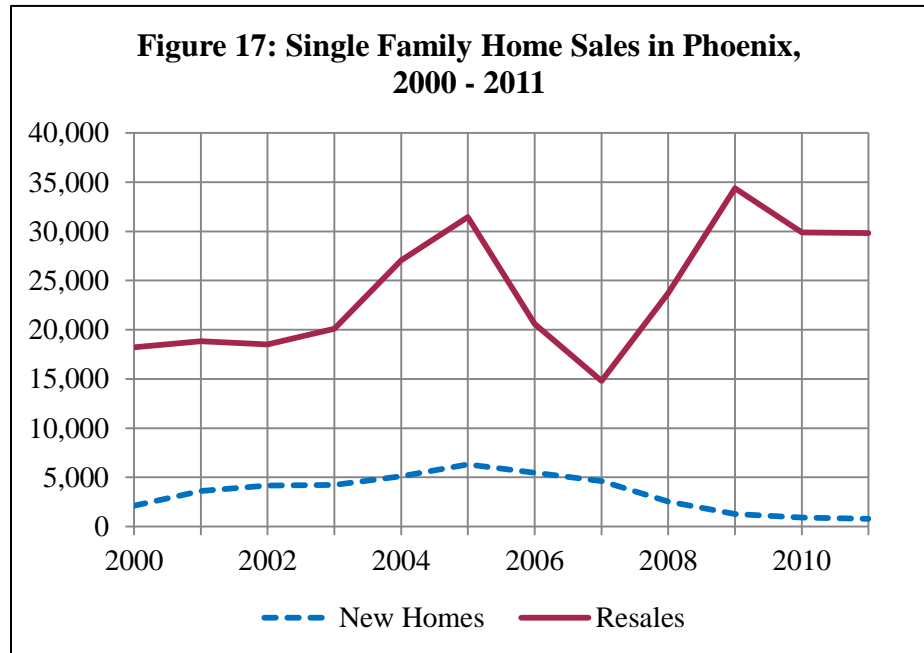
skills and educational backgrounds. Figure 16 notes the educational requirements of the specific occupational growth forecast over the next decade. The chart shows 71 percent of the projected job growth will be in occupations that require only a high school diploma. Seventeen (17) percent of the forecasted jobs are in occupations that require a bachelor's or higher degree.

Although several economic threats loom, chiefly federal budget cuts and economic weakness abroad, the worst of the Great Recession looks to be behind the City. Phoenix appears poised to return to its historical pattern of strong job growth, creating opportunity for its residents.

Section I-5: Housing Profile

The State and City real estate market was one of the biggest casualties of the Great Recession. Between 2006 and 2011, the median price of single family home resales declined 61 percent.²⁶ The number of home foreclosures increased 373 percent between 2007 and 2011. There is some evidence the housing market has hit bottom as home prices have stabilized and even increased in some areas while the number of foreclosures has declined, but it will likely be several years before the market recoups its losses.

Figure 17 notes the number of single family home sales in Phoenix since 2000 and illustrates the City's housing sales rollercoaster in recent years. After several fairly steady years to begin the decade, the number of single family home resales jumped from about 20,000 in 2003 to more than 30,000 in 2005. The near-collapse of the housing market pushed that number to less than 15,000 in 2007. Sales



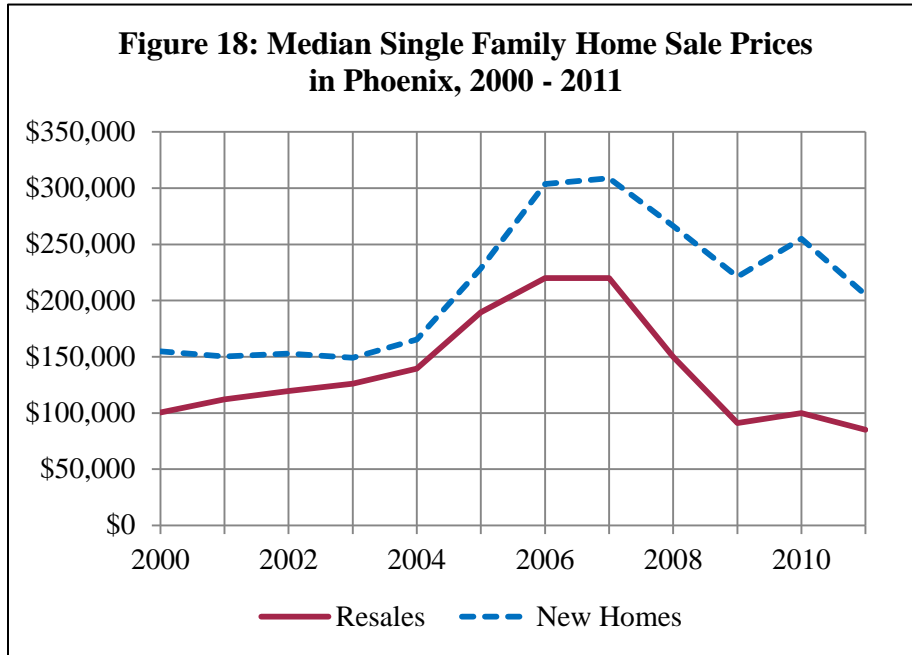
then rose to nearly 35,000 as distressed homeowners sold their homes and banks unloaded foreclosure properties. In fact, foreclosures in Phoenix increased more than five-fold in one year, from 2,395 in 2007 to 12,165 in 2008. The home resale market has been more consistent over the past two years, with just fewer than 30,000 sales recorded in each year. However, foreclosures represented more than one-third of sales in both years. New home sales have yet to recover and have posted year-over-year declines each year since 2005.

Every corner of the City has been impacted by foreclosures. As shown in Appendix E, the zip codes with the greatest number of foreclosures tend to be in the southern and western parts of Phoenix, but foreclosures are spread across the City.²⁷ In terms of the percentage of sales that are foreclosures, most of the highest rates are in the Deer Valley and North Mountain village zip codes.

As the number of foreclosures makes clear, the onset of the recession and accompanying job losses resulted in a large number of individuals and families unable to make their mortgage payments, especially those who had anticipated home equity growth to allow them to refinance.



This has had a profound impact on home prices as illustrated in Figure 18. Between 2000 and 2006, the City experienced nearly uninterrupted growth in housing prices with the median prices for both new and resold homes roughly doubling. From 2007 to 2011, the median price of home resales in Phoenix declined from \$220,000 to \$85,000. Home price declines occurred

citywide, with each Phoenix zip code posting a median price decrease of between 33 and 83 percent.²⁸ The largest declines are generally concentrated in zip codes overlapping the Maryvale, Alhambra, and Estrella villages in the southern part of the City.

American Community Survey estimates indicate 61.1 percent of Phoenix residents live in owner-occupied housing.²⁹ In only two villages, Central City and Encanto, do more than half of residents live in rental property. Thus, if there is a silver lining to this housing correction it is the return of affordable housing for the majority of City residents in owner-occupied housing.

Arizona State University's Arizona Real Estate Center (AREC) maintains an 'affordability index' to measure the extent to which an individual with average earnings can afford an average priced home. An index value of 100 indicates an individual earning the median income for a given area can afford the median priced home in that area. An index below 100 means an individual with average earnings cannot afford a median priced home; for example an index of 90 means the median income provides only 90 percent of what is necessary for the median priced home. An index above 100 indicates median earnings are more than enough to afford a median priced home. Until 2004 the affordability index for resold homes in Phoenix was above 100, but it dropped to 81 by 2006. In 2011, the index reached 272 due to the reduction in home values.³⁰

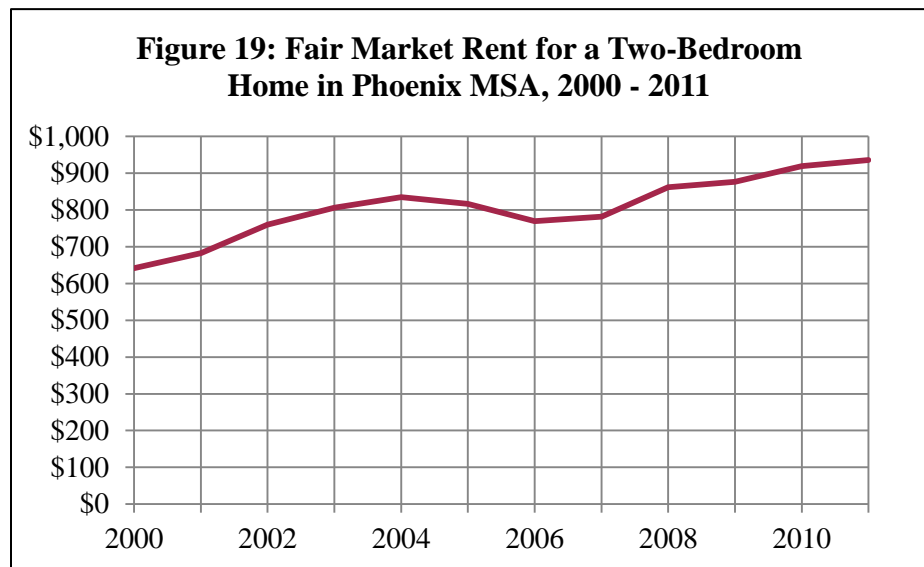

AREC also publishes its affordability index for ‘districts’ in Maricopa County, although these districts are not the same as the City’s villages and often span municipal boundaries. Similar to the citywide index, the indices for each of those districts that appear to include at least some portion of Phoenix were generally below 100 in 2006 and 2007. This was reversed in 2011, by which time the index for every district was above 100. The most affordable housing was in the western portion of the City, with the indices for the Maryvale, Central West Phoenix, Northwest Phoenix, and Metrocenter districts approaching 400. The East Camelback and Christown districts had comparatively less affordable housing with indices below 140, but the levels are still significantly greater than 100.

Although home prices declined significantly in recent years, rental housing prices in the greater Phoenix area increased markedly, presumably due to growth in demand as former homeowners became renters.

The fair market rental cost for a two-person home in the greater Phoenix area is displayed in Figure 19.³¹ As the chart illustrates, the fair market rent, which includes utilities, increased 19.7 percent between 2007 and 2011, from \$782 to \$936.



Housing affordability is commonly defined as no more than 30 percent of gross income. By this measure, a full-time worker would have to earn \$18.00 an hour to afford the fair market rent for a two-bedroom home. According to American Community Survey data, approximately 64 percent of Phoenix households earn at least this income and 36 percent earn less.

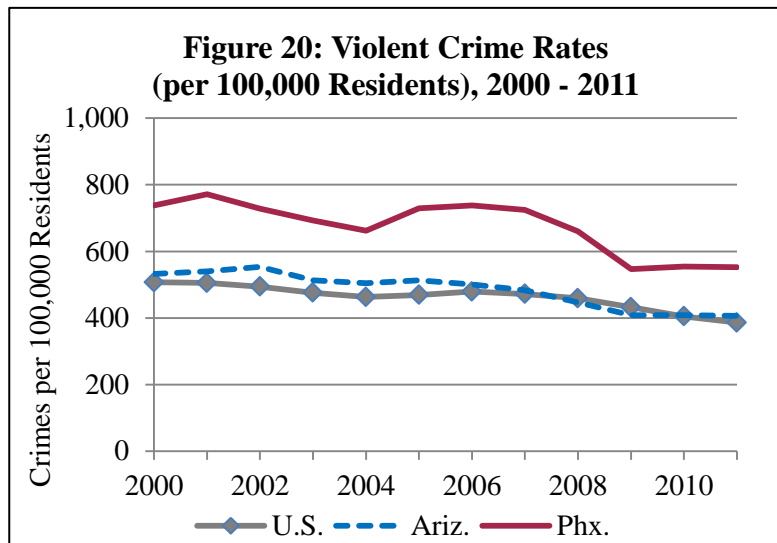
Phoenix provides a variety of housing options for individuals and families at all income levels, although this has been driven to a significant degree by a housing market that was one of the hardest hit in the country. There are nascent signs of recovery, but a complete recovery probably remains years away and the effects of home equity losses and foreclosures will likely have long lasting impacts on Phoenix residents.

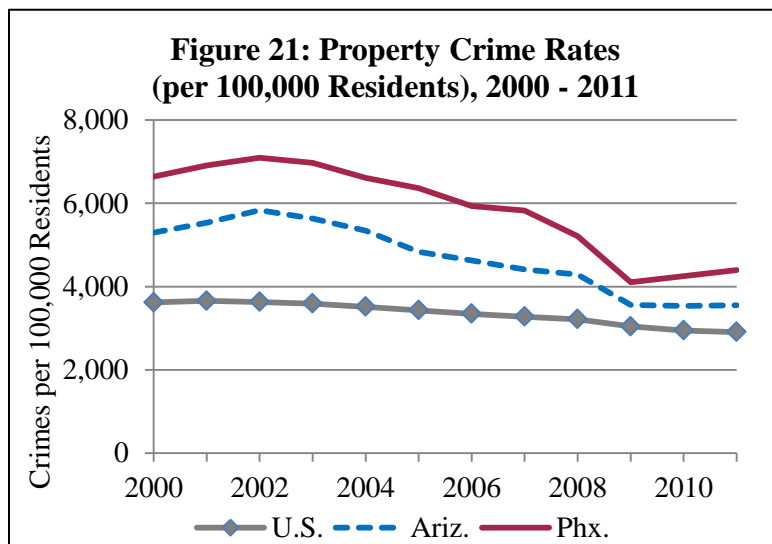
Section I-6: Crime Profile

Mirroring national and state trends, the City of Phoenix has experienced a significant reduction in crime in recent years. As with other large urban areas, however, crime remains an important issue in the City, with crime rates remaining notably higher than the rest of the State. Further, crime is not evenly distributed across the City, but rather is concentrated in lower-income South Phoenix neighborhoods.

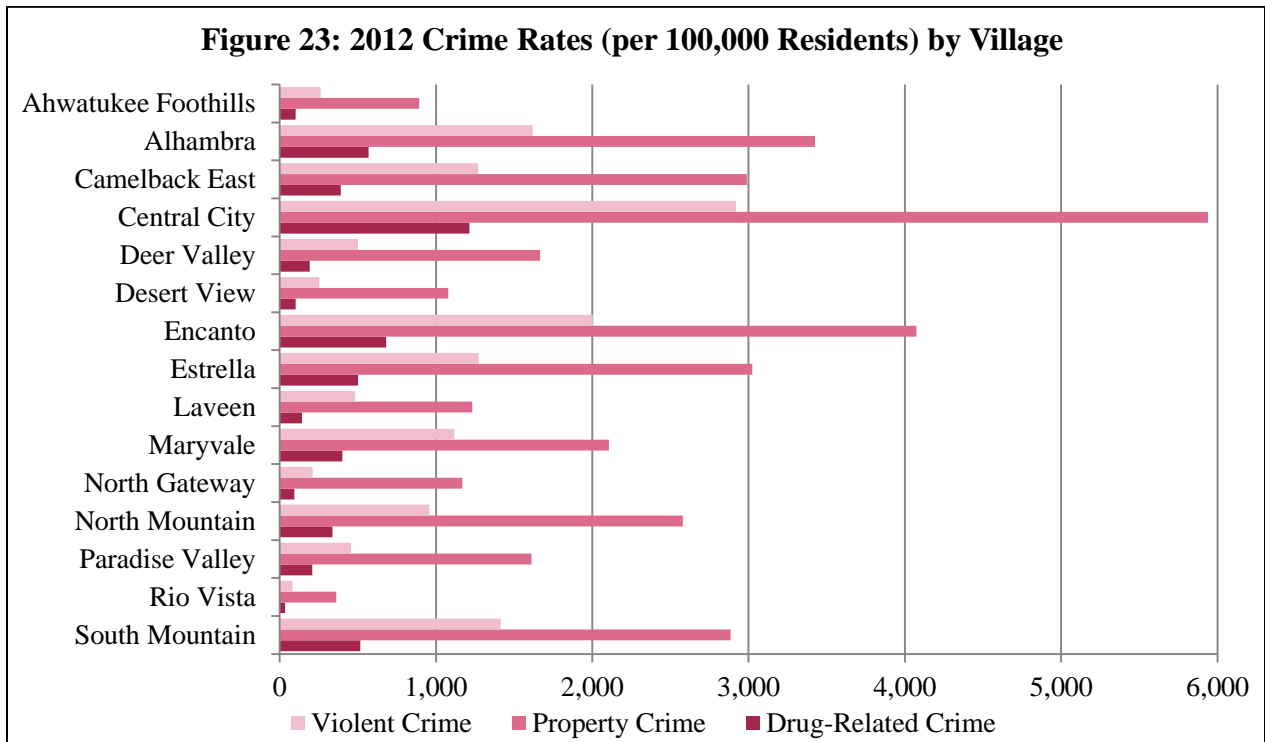
Figures 20 and 21 show crime rates in Phoenix are notably higher than the statewide and national rates. This reflects national trends, with crime rates higher in major urban centers than in suburban and rural areas. In comparison to the other nine largest cities in the country, Phoenix is fairly average, as shown in Figure 22. In terms of violent crime, Phoenix has the fifth-highest rate, which is 14.4 percent lower than the total rate within the group. The City's property crime rate is 41.0 percent higher than the total for the group and fourth highest.

Figures 20 and 21, respectively, summarize violent and property crime rates for the United States, Arizona, and Phoenix from 2000 to 2011.³² Detailed information is included in Appendix F. Violent crimes include murder and non-negligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault. Robbery and assault typically comprise 90 percent or more of the crimes in this category. As Figure 20 illustrates, violent crime rates have been gradually declining



across the country and State over the past decade. Phoenix experienced a period between 2004 and 2007 in which the rate of violent crimes increased and then experienced little change. Since 2008, though, the violent crime rate in Phoenix declined 16.3 percent, surpassing the 9.2 percent reduction in Arizona overall, and the 15.8 percent national decrease.



Property crimes include burglary, larceny/theft, and automobile theft. Figure 21 shows property crime rates have declined substantially in the State and City of Phoenix over the past decade, although there has been a slight uptick in the past two years. Despite this 7.1 percent increase in the past couple of years, the City's property crime rate is still 15.7 percent lower than in 2008. Since 2000, the City's property crime rate has fallen by a remarkable 33.8 percent.

The chart demonstrates crime rates vary significantly across different areas of the City. For example, the highest village violent crime rate (2,923 crimes per 100,000 residents in Central City) is 57 higher than the lowest village violent crime rate (Rio Vista with 51 crimes per 100,000 residents). The ratios are similarly stark for property crimes and drug-related crimes.

Generally, the southern areas of the City have significantly higher crime rates than other areas, with the Central City, Encanto, and Alhambra villages in the central part of the City respectively ranking one, two, and three in each of the categories of violent, property, and drug-related crime. As noted earlier, these are also the three areas of the City with the highest poverty rates. In contrast, the more affluent areas of the City, including the three northernmost villages (Rio Vista, North Gateway, and Desert View) and Ahwatukee Foothills in the southeast, have the lowest crime rates.

Similar patterns exist for code violations, such as overgrown vegetation, trash/litter, and graffiti.³⁴ Violations per resident are highest in the Central City village, which is followed by Alhambra and Maryvale. The lowest rates of code violations are in Rio Vista, North Gateway, Ahwatukee Foothills, and Desert View.

Appendix F details crime and code violation counts by type and village.

Section I-7: Community Amenities Profile

Befitting its status as the nation's sixth-largest city and the political and economic capitol of Arizona, the City of Phoenix boasts numerous world-class educational, cultural, and performing arts institutions; several professional sports franchises; an expansive parks system and diverse outdoor activity opportunities; and myriad entertainment options. The City is also home to a great number of civic and faith-based organizations.

A variety of community and social services are available to Phoenix residents. Assistance includes supports for youths, the elderly, low-income individuals and families, and persons with disabilities. These services are delivered through a network of providers, including government agencies, faith-based organizations, non-profits, and for-profit companies.

The City itself is responsible for operating or providing a wide array of services, including:

- 188 city parks
- 30,830 acres of desert/mountain preserves
- 31 recreation and community centers
- 15 senior centers
- Three Family Services Centers
- 29 swimming pools

- 17 public libraries
- Five 18-hole golf courses and three nine-hole courses
- 58 Head Start centers through 10 delegate agencies
- Early Head Start services
- Housing and utility assistance
- Family Advocacy Center

Head Start and Early Head Start, senior and community services, and Family Advocacy Center services are discussed in the following parts of this report. Appendix J includes a map noting the locations of the City's parks, recreation and community centers, pools, and golf courses.

Part II: Human Services Department and the Populations It Serves

To achieve its mission to “improve the quality of life for Phoenix residents through innovative social services, educational and victim advocacy programs, collaborations and partnerships”, the City of Phoenix’s Human Services Department (HSD) provides an extensive array of services that include:

- Early Head Start and Head Start
- Rental and utility assistance, home repairs, and other supports for low-income individuals and families
- Senior centers
- Homeless services, including operation of the Watkins Emergency Shelter and delivery of summer and winter respite programs
- Crime victim services through the Family Advocacy Center

These programs collectively form an important part of the social safety net for vulnerable individuals and those in need.

Section II-1: Human Services Department Client Populations

The Human Services Department provides assistance to tens of thousands of Phoenix residents every year, spanning the age spectrum from infants and toddlers to seniors, including low-income individuals and families, persons experiencing homelessness, and victims of violence.

Individuals and Families Living in Poverty

More than 275,000 Phoenix residents, 19.1 percent of the City’s population, live in poverty. Compared to the total population, individuals in poverty are more likely to be younger, Hispanic or African American, and non-citizens; to have no more than a high school education; and to live in family households led by unmarried female householders.

Figure 24 notes the 2012 federal poverty level (FPL) for families of various sizes.³⁵ The FPL is used for the purposes of eligibility for many government programs, but a number of commentators have suggested the FPL is inadequate for identifying individuals and families in need. Rather, they argue a ‘living wage’ that reflects the income required to meet minimum standards of living should serve as the benchmark.

To that end, the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) has developed a living wage calculator that considers the cost of housing, food, medical care, transportation, and child care in a

given area. The calculator also accounts for differences in family composition. Figure 25 presents the living wage calculator for several family types in Phoenix.³⁶ Comparing the two measures, the living wage calculator yields much greater income requirements. For example, a single person is above the poverty line if they earn more than \$11,170, but the living wage is \$19,136, 71.3 percent greater than the FPL. The differences are even greater for families, particularly those with children. Nevertheless, most HSD programs use the federal poverty level, or some percentage thereof, to determine program eligibility.

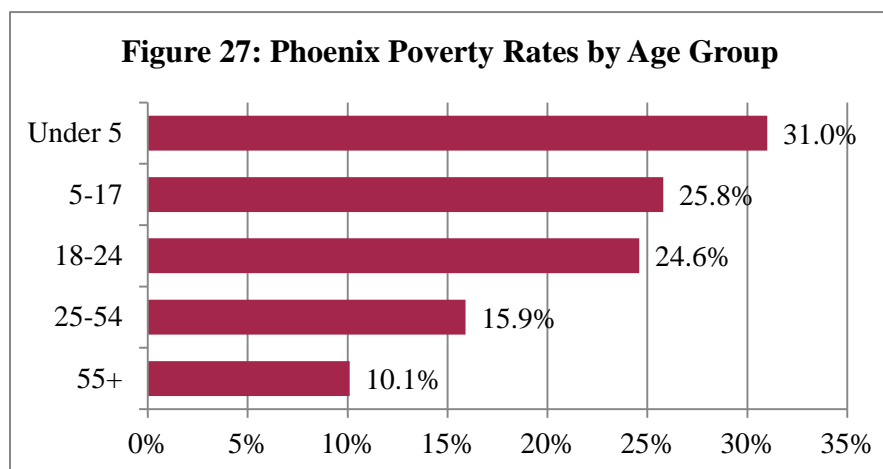
The City's 19.1 percent poverty rate is considerably higher than the 15.3 percent statewide poverty rate. Rates of poverty vary widely across the City as depicted in Figure 26.

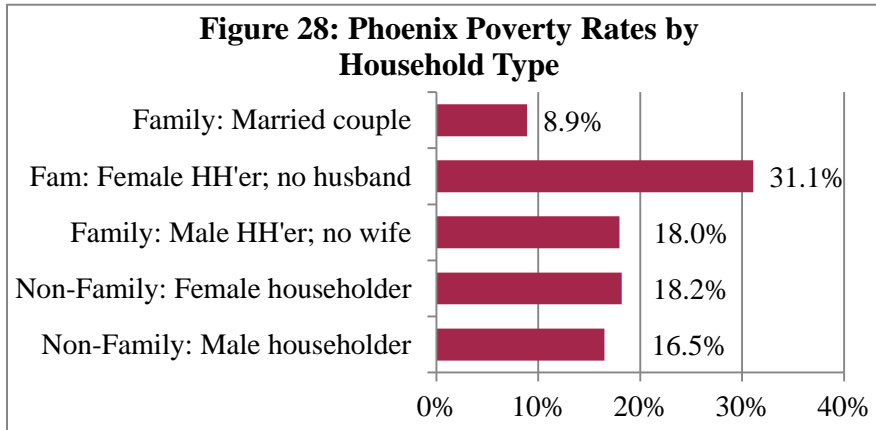
In five villages, more than 25 percent of residents live in poverty, including nearly half of those in Central City, while the poverty rate is less than ten percent in five other villages. Compared to the City's overall poverty rate, seven villages have higher than average rates and eight have lower than average rates.

Poverty in Phoenix is inversely proportional to age; that is, poverty decreases as age increases. Children are significantly more likely to live in poverty than adults or seniors, with children under five years of age experiencing the highest poverty rates. Figure 27 illustrates the rate of poverty by various

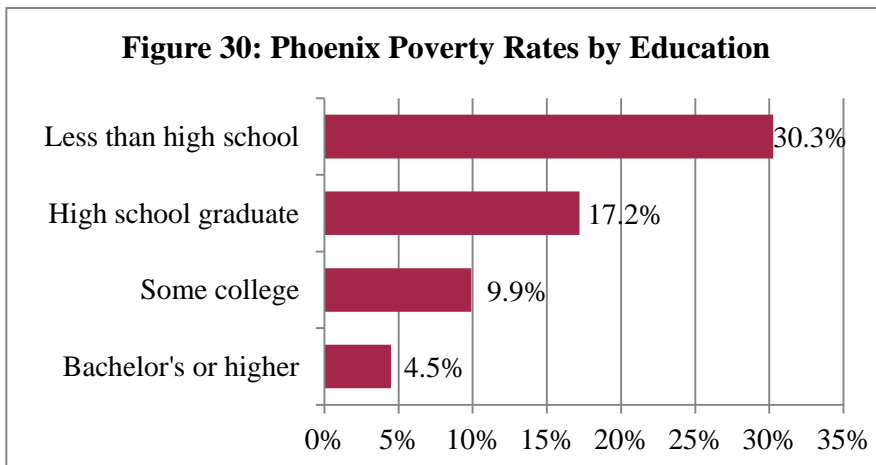
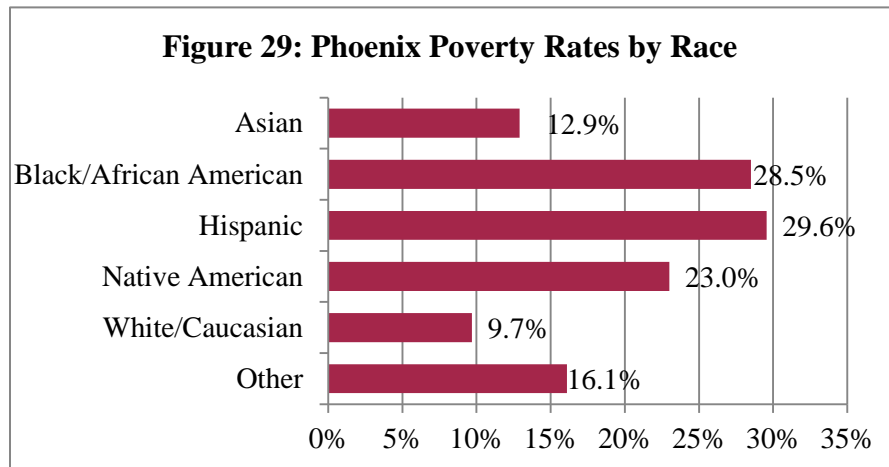
age groups. As the chart demonstrates, more than one-in-four children in Phoenix live in poverty, including 31.0 percent of children under five years of age, who are three times more likely to live in poverty than individuals over 55 years of age.



As shown in Figure 28, household composition is a strong predictor of poverty. Households headed by unmarried females are far more likely to be living below the poverty line than any other household type. More than three-in-ten of such households are in poverty. In comparison,

fewer than nine percent of homes headed by a married couple live in poverty.

There are also significant differences in poverty rates across racial groups as depicted in Figure 29. Poverty rates for the Native American, Hispanic, and Black populations exceed 23 percent, compared to 12.9 percent for the Asian population and less than ten percent for the White population. The 31.4 percent poverty rate for non-citizens is nearly twice as high as the 16.7 percent rate for citizens.



There is a predictable correlation between educational attainment and poverty as shown in Figure 30. More than 30 percent of residents who have not completed high school live in poverty. Each successive level of educational attainment significantly reduces the likelihood of living in

poverty, with fewer than five percent of college graduates in poverty.

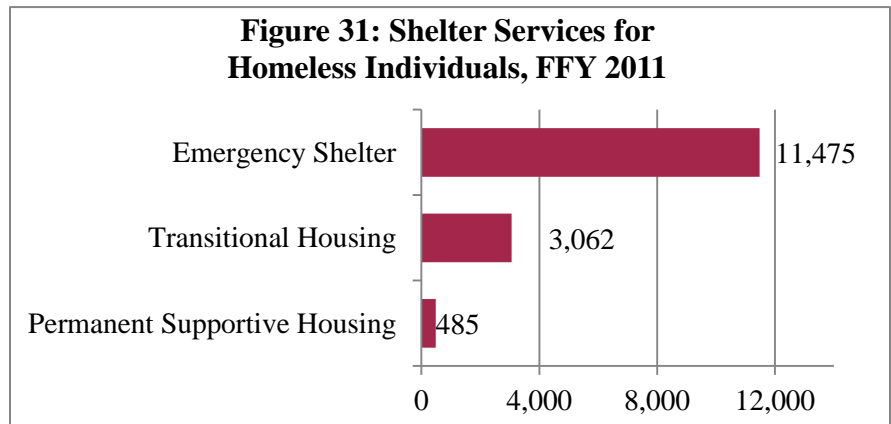
The five-year American Community Survey estimates do not include counts of the language spoken at home or linguistic isolation data amongst households in poverty. It does provide estimates of the primary language spoken by all individuals who are at least five years of age and living in poverty. Of these more than 237,000 individuals, the majority (51.0 percent) speak Spanish while 43.3 percent speak English only and the balance speaks some other language.

Individuals Experiencing Homelessness

A subset of individuals living in poverty is those experiencing homelessness. For obvious reasons, it can be difficult to obtain accurate counts of the number of individuals who are homeless and to survey them.

Information regarding individuals who seek shelter is collected through the federal Department of Housing and Urban Development’s (HUD) Homeless Management Information System (HMIS). HUD publishes annual homeless assessment reports for various jurisdictions, including the City of Phoenix, that summarize data relating to individuals who received shelter and provide estimates to account for providers that do not participate in HMIS.³⁷ The report provides both an estimate of the number of individuals who received shelter during a one-year period as well as detail regarding those in shelter at specific points-in-time.

In federal fiscal year 2011 (October 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011), an estimated 15,022 individuals experiencing homelessness sought shelter services. Figure 31 details this estimate by shelter type. As the chart demonstrates, the bulk of shelter services are currently provided in emergency shelters, rather than

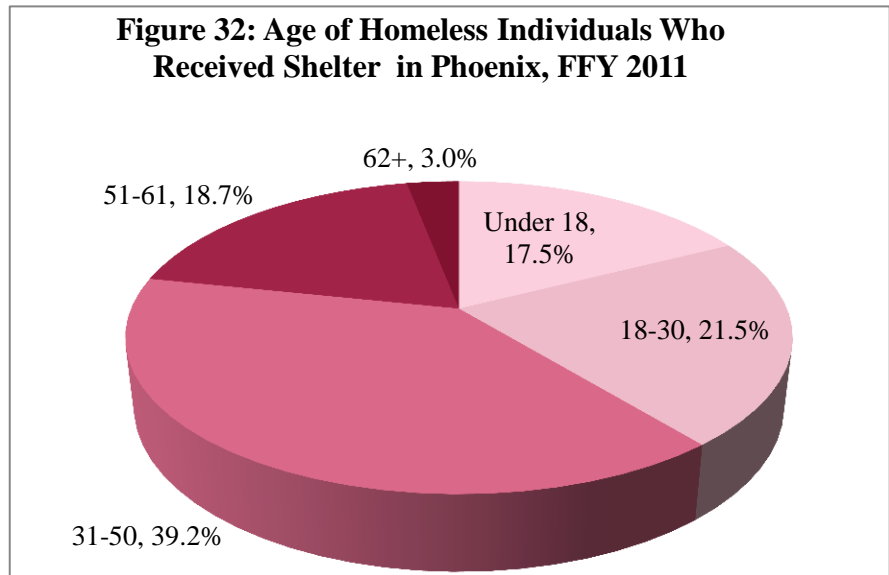


transitional housing or permanent supportive housing. Reported capacity in transitional housing was 1,495 year-round equivalent beds and actually exceeded the emergency shelter capacity of 1,198 beds. Because individuals tend to stay in emergency shelters for shorter periods, an emergency shelter bed serves more individuals in a year, an average of 6.8 persons per year compared to 1.8 in transitional housing.

Of the total estimated population experiencing homelessness, 28.4 percent were individuals in families and 71.6 percent were single individuals. Totaling 6,709, single males were the largest category of individuals who sought shelter, followed by 3,546 single females. There were 3,013 children who received shelter services, including 388 unaccompanied minors.

Figure 32 displays the distribution of ages among individuals experiencing homelessness as reported to HMIS. Overall, children accounted for 17.5 percent of those who received shelter services. Most of these children were less than 12 years of age. After this group, there appears to be a fairly even distribution of ages through 61 years. Individuals over the age of 61 years accounted for only 3.0 percent of those who received shelter services.



Of the adults, 32 percent were disabled and 13 percent were military veterans. In terms of race and ethnicity, individuals who are non-Hispanic White accounted for 42 percent of the population experiencing homelessness, followed by individuals who are Black (24 percent) and Hispanic (20 percent).

Additional information regarding individuals receiving shelter services anywhere in Maricopa County is produced by the Maricopa County HMIS Project. Highlights of its Continuum-wide Housing Demographics Report for fiscal year 2011 include:³⁸

- More than 42 percent of those accessing shelter were homeless for the first time and only 3.6 percent were considered chronically homeless
- The most common causes of homelessness were lack of financial resources or loss of a job (29.3 percent) followed by loss of their home due to eviction, foreclosure, or family issues (21.1 percent)
- Of those who reported a disability, 47.0 had a mental health issue and 25.7 percent reported drug or alcohol abuse
- Nearly 14 percent reported they had been a victim of domestic violence, including 36.8 percent of this group who had been a victim within the past twelve months

Less is known about individuals experiencing homelessness who do not seek shelter services. An annual point-in-time street count is coordinated by the Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG). It is conducted by volunteers who attempt to count the number of individuals who are homeless and not in a shelter on a given night. According to the 2011 Homeless Street Count,

there were 1,159 homeless individuals living on the streets in Phoenix on January 25, 2011.³⁹ The largest groups were non-chronically homeless males (424) and chronically homeless males (302). A total of 64 children were identified, 62 of whom were on their own.

The overall count was a decline from 1,750 in 2010 and 2,140 in 2009. Some observers believe the decrease is a result of difficulties in identifying people living on the streets rather than a real reduction in the number of individuals experiencing homelessness.

Older Residents

There are 247,229 individuals in the City of Phoenix who are 55 years of age or older, 17.2 percent of all residents. This is a significantly smaller proportion than the State as a whole, in which 24.6 percent of residents are 55 years or older. As with the City as a whole, Phoenix's older residents are a diverse group.

In five villages – Rio Vista, Paradise Valley, North Mountain, Camelback East, and Desert View – more than 20 percent of the population is at least 55 years of age – while the proportion in two villages – Estrella and Laveen – is less than 11 percent. The City has strategically located its 15 senior centers in areas with the greatest numbers of older residents. Figure 33 displays the physical land area that is within one and three miles of a senior center and the number of seniors within these same distances. As the table demonstrates, only 46.5 percent of the City's land area is within three miles of a senior center, but 73.3 percent of seniors live within that distance to a center. Appendix J includes several maps that illustrate the areas of the City with the greatest number of older residents and senior center locations.

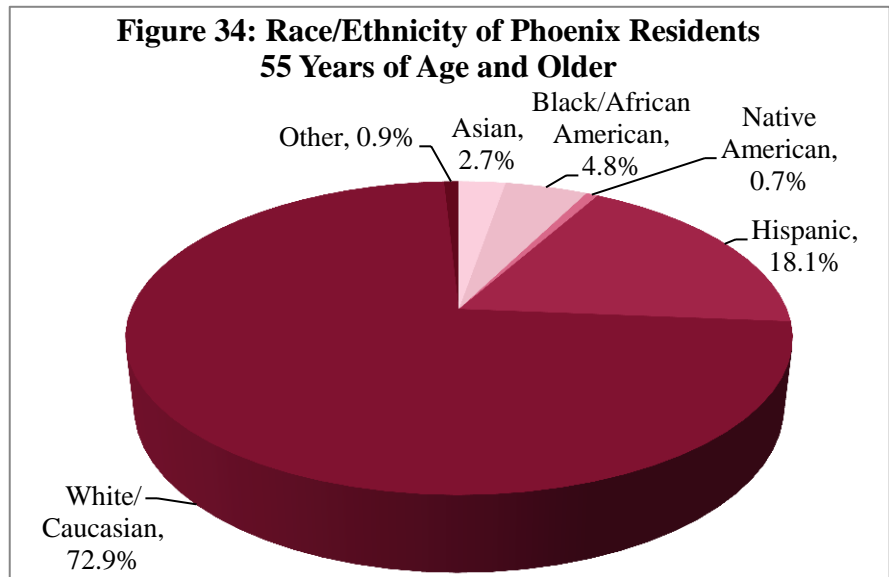

More than 41 percent of the 55 and older population is currently employed. As would be expected, employment decreases as age increases. The employment rate is 62.5 percent for individuals between 55 and 64 years and falls to 26.7 percent and 6.8 percent among those between 65 and 74 years and older than 75 years of age, respectively.

As a group, older individuals are more affluent than other age groups. More than 55 percent of individuals older than 55 years of age have incomes at least three times the federal poverty level. At the same time, about one-in-ten seniors in Phoenix live in poverty, though this is substantially less than the City's overall 19.1 percent poverty rate. The senior poverty rate in Central City is 38.4 percent, more than twice as great as the second-highest village. In contrast, the senior poverty rate in North Gateway, Ahwatukee Foothills, and Rio Vista is less than five percent.

The racial/ethnic composition of older Phoenix residents is much different than the City overall, as illustrated by Figure 34. Whereas less than half of the overall population is White, 73.0 percent of the population over the age of 55 years is White. Conversely, individuals of Hispanic descent comprise almost 40 percent of the total population, but only 18.0 percent of the older age groups. Seniors of Hispanic descent are about twice as likely to live in poverty as are older White residents.



Phoenix has 136,117 households with at least one resident over the age of 60 years. More than 47,000 of these are seniors living alone. The remaining households have at least two residents and more than 90 percent of these are family households.

There are more than 35,000 Phoenix households in which a grandchild is living with one or more grandparents of any age. In the majority of these families, the grandparents are not financially responsible for the grandchild(ren) leaving 13,977 grandparents who do shoulder that financial responsibility. In most of these homes, a parent is present, but apparently unable to provide financially for the child. There are 3,417 households in which no parent is present in the home, including 1,428 in which the grandparents are over sixty years of age.

There are 8,496 households in which grandparents and grandchildren reside together in Maryvale, which is more than one-in-seven of all households in this village. South Mountain and Estrella have similarly high proportions of these households. These are also the villages that have some of the highest poverty rates in the City, which may explain the number of multigenerational homes.

Victims of Violent Crime

There is not a demographic 'profile' of persons who are crime victims as crime spans individuals of all ages, racial and ethnic backgrounds, and economic classes. However, as noted in Section I-6, crime rates vary across the City. Additionally, the City's Family Advocacy Center (FAC) records information about the individuals it serves.

According to azcentral.com’s crime report database cited earlier, there were 15,224 violent crimes in the City reported to the police during the 12-month period ending November 13, 2012. Figure 35 details the reported crimes within this category. In fiscal year 2012, the FAC provided

services to 6,309 crime victims, 82.2 percent of whom were victims of domestic violence and 10.6 percent of whom were victims of sexual assault. However, the FAC’s caseload is not directly comparable to the reported crime counts because certain crimes, such as domestic violence, frequently go unreported.

Violent crimes occurred in every Phoenix village, but the greatest numbers were in the southern and western parts of the City. As described earlier in this Section, residents of these areas are more likely to be living in poverty, to be non-White, and to speak a language other than English.

The demographic data collected by the FAC supports some of these assumptions. Of the 6,309 individuals who received services from the FAC in fiscal year 2012:

- 88.4 percent were women
- By age, 1.0 percent were under 12 years old, 4.3 percent were 13 to 17 years, 36.2 percent were 18 to 29 years, 40.1 percent were 30 to 44 years, 16.6 percent were 45 to 64 years, and 1.7 percent were 65 years or older
- 53.6 percent were of Hispanic descent, significantly greater than the 39.9 percent of the overall City population that is Hispanic
- 25.8 percent spoke a language other than English, about equal to the 26.1 percent of the entire City population that is primarily non-English speaking

Section II-2: Help for Low-Income and Other Persons and Families in Need

There are a variety of government programs that provide assistance to low-income and other individuals and families in need. Responsibility for these programs is divided amongst the federal, State, and City governments. As government revenues have declined at all levels in recent years due to the economic downturn, many of these supports have been reduced. This has been particularly true at the State level, where nearly every program has been cut back. These cuts include program suspensions and eliminations, institution of waiting lists, implementation of copayments, and provider rate reductions.

Select State and Federal Programs

State government is responsible for administering a number of assistance programs, including health care, income supports, food assistance, child care, child protection and child welfare services, and crisis services. Historically, social services in Arizona have been fairly limited,

though health care is a notable exception, and program cuts necessitated by declining revenues have further reduced these programs.

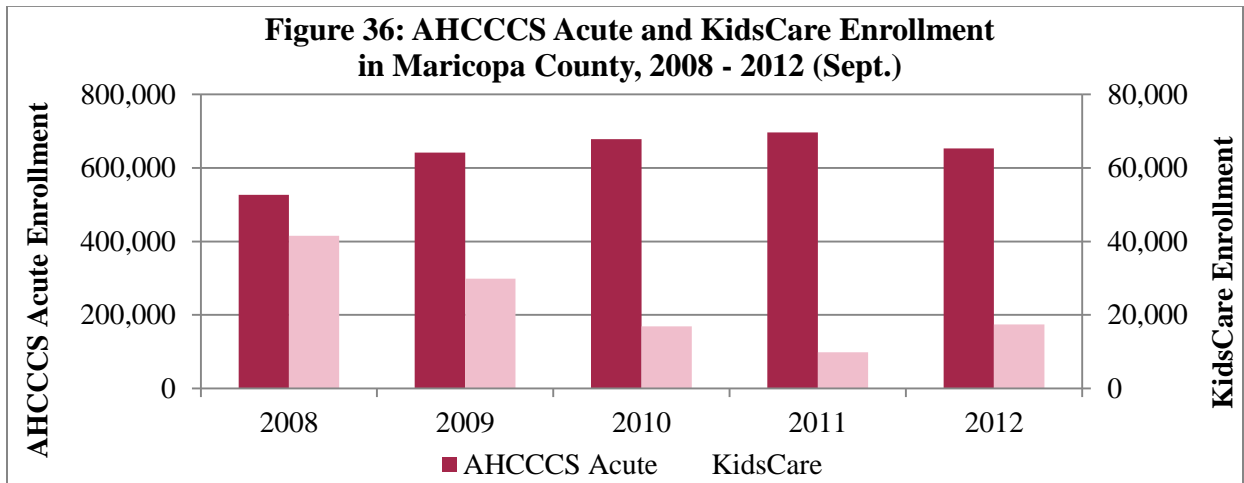
Due to the high cost of health care, many low-income individuals would not be able to access these services without public assistance. The primary health care program for low-income individuals is Medicaid, which is jointly funded by the federal government and the states and administered by the states operating within federal requirements. The Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) is responsible for administering Arizona's Medicaid program. AHCCCS also operates a related program, KidsCare, that provides health care insurance to children with incomes in excess of the Medicaid program.

Until July 2011, Arizona operated one of the most expansive Medicaid programs in the country as a result of voter approval of Proposition 204 in November 2000. In brief, Prop. 204 expanded eligibility beyond 'traditional' Medicaid populations – infants and children, pregnant women, individuals with disabilities, and certain very low-income parents – to include parents and childless adults up to 100 percent of the federal poverty level. Arizona was one of only a handful of states to provide coverage to childless adults. In response to funding reductions, however, AHCCCS 'froze' coverage for childless adults in July 2011. Current enrollees remained in the program, but new enrollees were no longer accepted.

KidsCare, which provided health care coverage to children with family income above the Medicaid program requirements (133 percent of the FPL for children under six years of age and 100 percent of the FPL for children six years and older) and below 200 percent of the FPL. KidsCare enrollment was frozen in January 2010. However, a more limited program, titled KidsCare II and with a family income limit of 175 percent of the FPL and an enrollment cap, was established with enrollment beginning in June 2012.

Figure 36 presents KidsCare and AHCCCS acute plan enrollment for all eligibility groups in September of 2008 through 2012 for Maricopa County.⁴⁰ Enrollment in AHCCCS acute plans grew 32 percent between 2008 and 2011 due to the recession and weak recovery. Between 2011 and 2012, though, the caseload declined six percent, primarily due to reductions in childless adults. KidsCare enrollment fell 76 percent between 2008 and 2011 before roughly doubling between 2011 and 2012 as KidsCare II was implemented.

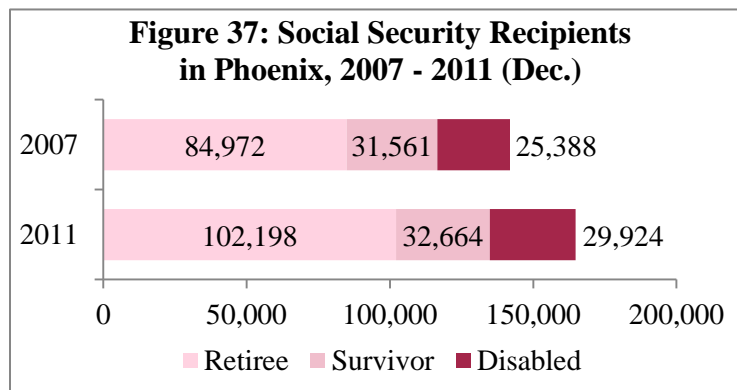

Although there are AHCCCS recipients throughout the City, the greatest numbers are in Maryvale, Alhambra, South Mountain, and North Mountain, each of which had more than 40,000 enrollees in November 2011.⁴¹ In Central City, South Mountain, and Maryvale, more than 40 percent of residents were receiving AHCCCS benefits. Conversely, there were fewer than 5,000 AHCCCS beneficiaries in Rio Vista, North Gateway, Desert View, and Ahwatukee Foothills.

Income support programs are cash payments to eligible populations intended to augment their incomes and to assist them to meet their basic needs. Social Security is probably the best-known income support program. Social Security provides monthly payments for, to use its acronym, old age, survivors, and disability insurance (OASDI). As of December 2011, 1.1 million Arizonans were receiving Social Security benefits, an increase of 15.1 percent compared to 960,000 recipients in December 2007.⁴² In 2011, about 750,000 individuals were retirees, 200,000 were survivors, and 150,000 were individuals with disabilities. Aggregate monthly benefits for all recipients totaled \$111 million.

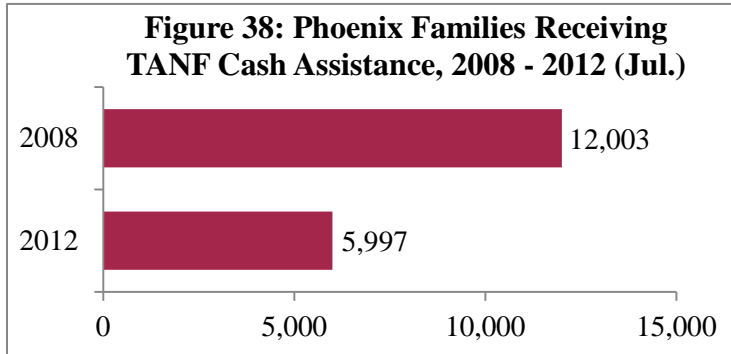
Figure 37 compares the number of Social Security recipients in Phoenix in December 2007 and 2011. During this period, the number of Social Security recipients in Phoenix increased 16.1 percent, to 164,786. As a percent of total Social Security recipients, Desert View, Ahwatukee Foothills, and Paradise Valley had the highest proportions of retirees, while Central City and Laveen had the highest rates of individuals with disabilities.

Another major income support program is the State-operated Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) cash assistance, which provides monthly payments to very low-income families with dependent minor children. Figure 38 compares the number of Phoenix families



receiving cash assistance in July 2008 and July 2012.⁴³ As the chart shows, the Phoenix caseload has declined by more than one-half. This reduction, however, is due not to changes in need, but to changes to eligibility criteria. Specifically, the Legislature changed the lifetime benefit limit for cash assistance from five year to three years in 2010 and then to two years in

2011, which is one of the most restrictive limits in the country. Additionally, in 2009 the Arizona Department of Economic Security (DES), which operates the program, decreased the benefit amount by 20 percent from an average of \$263 per household per month to \$210. According to the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities (CBPP), Arizona’s maximum benefit level was the ninth-lowest in the nation as of July 2011.⁴⁴

Families receiving cash assistance are concentrated in the western and southern parts of the City with more than 1,500 in Maryvale, Alhambra, and South Mountain, compared to fewer than 100 in several northern villages and Ahwatukee Foothills.

DES provides child care assistance to families receiving cash assistance when necessary to support their job development efforts, those transitioning from cash assistance to employment, those earning up to 165 percent of the federal poverty level, and families involved with Child Protective Services (CPS). The subsidies are available for children from birth to 12 years of age and are intended to remove the lack of child care as a barrier to employment and, except for CPS-involved families, recipients must be employed or looking for work while receiving cash assistance. Working families must make copayments set on a sliding scale based on their incomes.

Funding for the DES child care program has been significantly reduced in recent years, falling from \$198.5 million in fiscal year 2008 to \$121.4 million in fiscal year 2013.⁴⁵ As a result of these funding cuts, the statewide number of children receiving assistance has declined 43.5 percent, from 54,343 to 30,695, between July 2008 and July 2012.⁴⁶ Additionally, a waiting list has been in effect at various times since February 2009. As of November 16, 2012, there were 7,138 children on the waiting list.⁴⁷

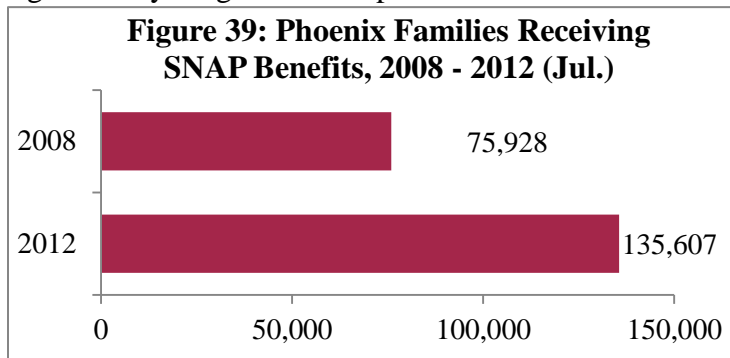

The State operates two major federally-funded food assistance programs, the supplemental nutrition assistance program (SNAP, formerly food stamps) and the women, infants, and children program (WIC).

SNAP provides payments to low-income households (generally with gross incomes at or below 130 percent of the federal poverty level and net incomes at or below 100 percent of the FPL) to purchase food. The average monthly benefit in Arizona was \$292.35 in September 2012.⁴⁸

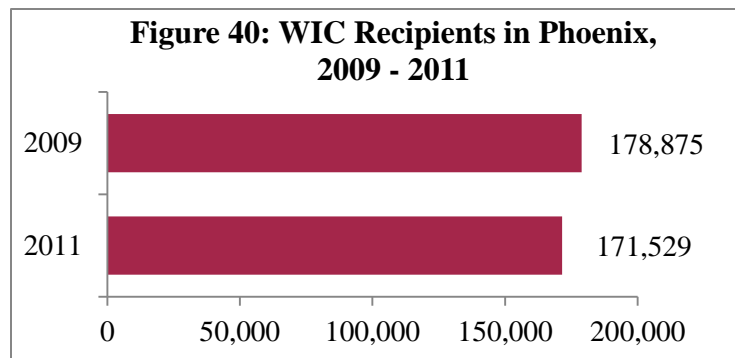
As the national economy has struggled, SNAP caseloads across the country have grown significantly. Figure 39 compares the number of Phoenix households receiving SNAP benefits



in July 2008 and July 2012, a period during which the caseload increased more than 78 percent.⁴⁹ More than 25 percent of Phoenix households are currently enrolled in SNAP. By village, more than 60 percent of households in Central City are enrolled compared to fewer than 5 percent in Rio Vista and Ahwatukee Foothills.

The WIC program provides vouchers to pregnant, breastfeeding, and postpartum women, and infants and children under five years of age to allow them to purchase certain nutritional foods. The program also provides nutrition education and referrals to health and social services. In order to qualify, clients must have incomes below 185 percent of the federal poverty level.

Figure 40 compares the number of WIC recipients in 2009 and 2011.⁵⁰ As the table shows, total recipients were somewhat less than 180,000 in both years as federal funding was largely unchanged during this time. With more than 46,000 recipients in 2011, Maryvale had more than twice as many residents using the program as the next greatest village. The three northern-most villages had fewer than 600 recipients each.



The State, through DES' Child Protective Services, is responsible for child protection and child welfare services. CPS investigates reports of neglect and abuse. The number of reports

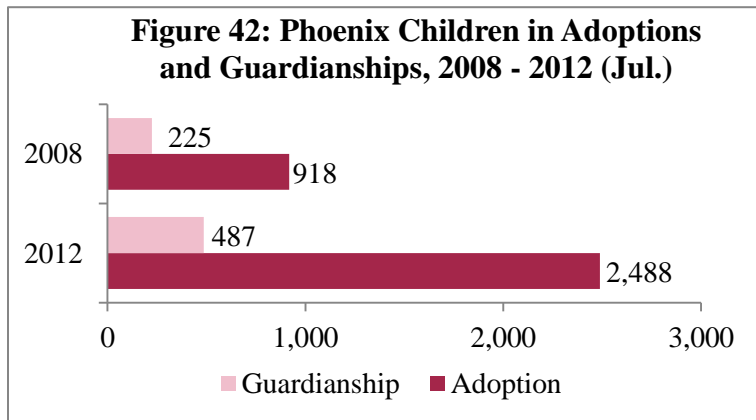
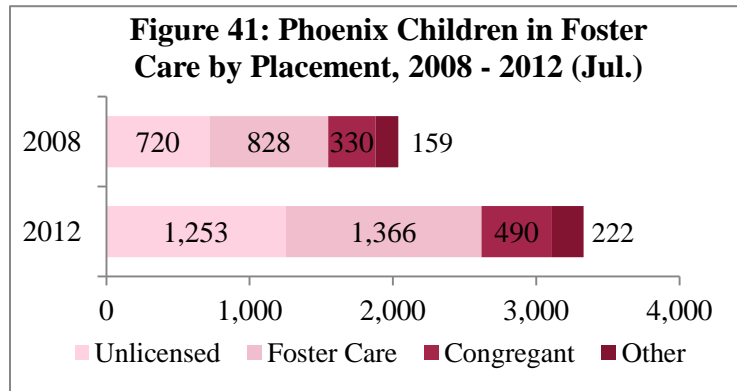

increased more than 15 percent, from 35,019 to 40,389, between fiscal years 2008 and 2012.⁵¹ CPS reports in Phoenix grew 16.3 percent, slightly more than the statewide average. There were more than 11,000 reports of neglect and abuse in Phoenix in fiscal year 2012, about 27.8 percent of the statewide total. It is rare for any household to have contact with CPS, but in terms of the number of investigations per household, the villages with the highest rates of investigations were Central City, South Mountain, North Gateway, Alhambra, and Estrella.

When CPS does not believe a child can remain safely in their home, they remove the child and place him or her in foster care. Between July 2008 and July 2012, the number of Arizona children in foster care increased 35.0 percent to 13,537.⁵² The number of Phoenix children in foster care grew 63.4 percent, to 3,300, during this period. Figure 41 illustrates this growth as well as the types of placements into which children were placed. Unlicensed placements are typically relatives or other individuals with whom the child has a relationship; congregant placements include shelters and group homes.



When a child cannot be returned home, CPS seeks a permanent placement, usually a guardianship or adoption. In guardianships, natural parents' parental rights have not necessarily been severed. Between 2008 and 2012, the number of children in adoptions and guardianships from foster care in Phoenix grew 171 percent and 116 percent, respectively.⁵³ Figure 42 presents the totals.

The newest State agency, Arizona First Things First (FTF), was created by Proposition 203, a citizen initiative approved by voters in November 2006. The initiative also created a new 80-cent per pack of cigarettes tax to fund the agency. FTF funds a variety of early childhood development and health programs for Arizona children through five years of age intended to ensure they begin school healthy and ready to succeed. This charge is in many ways similar to the goals of the Early Head Start and Head Start programs. The tobacco tax generates about \$120 million annually and the majority of these funds are directed to 31 regional partnership councils that allocate the dollars based on local needs. Programs funded by FTF include child

care scholarships (discussed further in Part III), home visitation programs, and a variety of health programs.

Appendix G details village-level caseload estimates for most of the State and federal programs discussed in this Section.

City Services

As noted in the introduction to this Part, the Human Services Department delivers a variety of services to assist City residents. Services are delivered through three HSD program divisions:

- The Education Division administers Early Head Start and Head Start programs
- The Community and Senior Services Division, which oversees 15 senior centers and provides a variety of emergency services through three Family Services Centers
- The Family Advocacy Center and Homeless Programs

In fiscal year 2012, 3,624 children received Head Start services and another 601 were served by Early Head Start. These programs are the focus of Part III of this assessment.

The Family Services Centers provided services to 36,960 individuals in fiscal year 2012. By individual center, the John F. Long location served the most individuals (13,990), followed by the Travis L. Williams location (12,461) and the Sunnyslope location (10,762). Additionally, the Watkins Emergency Shelter provided services to 715 individuals and another 2,003 residents received Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing services.⁵⁴

Community services were delivered to a diverse cross-section of Phoenix residents. Services were provided to residents of all ages, with the greatest utilization among children (44.4 percent of all clients) and young families. Individuals over the age of 65 years were 6.5 percent of the total service population. The racial composition is not directly comparable to the total population estimates because Hispanic is not classified as a race and is combined with the White or Other categories. Notably, Black residents represented 28 percent of services users, a percentage much higher than their overall share of the population.

In terms of the services provided, utility deposit and payment assistance accounted for 75 percent of all services, followed by rental assistance at nine percent, and bus passes at five percent.

The Family Advocacy Center provided services to 6,309 crime victims in fiscal year 2012. A brief discussion of the demographics of this population was included in Section II-1. The FAC reported a total of 11,300 contacts during the year, with most coming by phone, and provided a variety of services.

One of the FAC’s primary functions is to connect individuals in need with available community resources, and information and referral was provided 8,560 times in fiscal year 2012. Other services included conducting forensic exams (225 times); counseling (1,372); assisting with safety planning, injunctions against harassment, and orders of protection (2,342); identifying shelter (160); providing financial assistance and vouchers (314); and aiding with transportation (147).

The City’s Housing Department also provides important services to low-income residents. The Department manages approximately 3,500 City-owned units of public and affordable housing, as well as more than 5,200 housing choice vouchers. The Housing Department reports these programs provide homes for more than 25,000 residents.

However, the demand for housing assistance greatly exceeds the supply. There are more than 56,000 individuals on the waiting list for Section 8 housing vouchers. The Department reports the current wait is approximately five years. The greatest numbers of individuals on the waiting list are in Maryvale and South Mountain.

Section II-3: Community Survey Results

In late 2012, HSD commissioned a community survey to measure the perceptions of its clients and partners regarding their communities’ strengths and challenges, the types of services they need and use, and their satisfaction with HSD services. English, Spanish, and Chinese versions were created. Clients had the option to complete the survey online or using the paper made available at Head Start delegate agency sites, senior centers, and family services centers. A total of 1,950 clients and 84 partners participated in the survey. This Section summarizes the results of the surveys with additional discussion of Early Head Start and Head Start survey results included in Section III-4. A complete tabulation of survey responses are included in Appendix I.

The survey first asked clients to select the three greatest strengths of their neighborhoods. Figure 43 lists the top three selections for each client group.⁵⁵

There was a significant amount of agreement regarding neighborhood strengths across the service groups. Each included City services and affordable housing in their top three. As discussed in Section I-5, home prices in Phoenix have dropped significantly in the past few

years, increasing the stock of affordable housing. Early Head Start and Head Start families, perhaps not surprisingly, focused on schools.

Respondents’ positive feeling regarding City services were further evident when they were asked to rate aspects of the HSD service(s) they receive. Using a five-point scale with 1 equal to “not at all satisfied” and 5 equal to “very satisfied”, survey participants were asked to rate the convenience, hours, quality, and availability of their services. Results are displayed in Figure 44.

Each rating for Head Start and Early Head Start averaged more than 4.7, meaning the significant majority of responses were 5’s. Senior centers also scored high ratings, with three of four exceeding 4.5. Family service centers lagged the other service groups, although the scores are still positive overall. The availability and quality of support services at family service centers was the only rating with an average below 4.0.

The survey asked participants whether they or anyone in their household accessed a variety of public services within the past 12 months. In general, individuals receiving services from a senior center accessed a comparatively narrow range of services. Among this group, publicly funded health insurance and nutrition services were most commonly used. Sixty-five (65) percent reported they were Medicare beneficiaries and 27 percent were enrolled in Medicaid/AHCCCS (some respondents have both). Nutrition service usage included congregate meals (66 percent), supplemental nutrition assistance/food stamps (28 percent), and food banks (24 percent). Additionally, 32 percent of this group received Supplemental Security Income (SSI), 18 percent received rental or utility assistance, and 13 percent accessed subsidized housing.

Individuals receiving services from a Family Service Centers generally accessed a larger number of public programs than other groups. The services most frequently used by this group are:

- Supplemental nutrition assistance/food stamps – 82 percent
- Rental/ utility assistance – 46 percent
- Food banks – 41 percent
- Supplemental Security Income – 32 percent
- Cash assistance/TANF – 30 percent
- Job training/job search assistance – 24 percent

- Legal assistance – 21 percent
- Subsidized housing – 20 percent

Survey participants were then asked to note the services they are not currently receiving that would be most helpful to them and their families. Figure 45 summarizes the top three responses by service group.

The most frequently chosen service of need for respondents in each service group was dental care. The second and third most commonly cited need for both Early Head Start and Head Start was child care and English instruction. The second-most chosen service among senior center users was senior center services. It is unclear what these respondents intended as they could be referring to the types of services offered, the number of locations, hours of operation, etc. Senior center attendees were the only group that listed transportation as an unmet need.

When asked about barriers to needed services, most respondents reported they do not meet eligibility requirements, followed by an inability to make copayments and programs that have implemented waiting lists. Individuals receiving services from a Family Service Center were twice as likely as users of other City services to cite transportation as a barrier – possibly because there are fewer physical FSC locations than Head Start sites and senior centers – although it was still not among their top-three issues.

Respondents were also asked to choose the three greatest challenges facing their neighborhoods, as summarized in Figure 46. As with neighborhood strengths, perceptions were similar across service groups. Each group cited a lack of good jobs as a challenge, with three of four groups rating this the most significant issue. Concerns relating to crime, specifically drug use and property crime, were also cited by each group. The Head Start, Early Head Start, and Family Service Center groups mentioned a lack of after-school activities.

HSD partners who participated in the community survey were asked many of the same questions as service users. In a number of cases, their perceptions differ from those of HSD clients.

When asked to rate the three greatest neighborhood strengths, the most common partner responses were City services, strong cultural ties, and public transportation. City services were also in the top three of each of the HSD service groups, but neither of the others was in the clients' top threes. Affordable housing and good schools were often cited by the service groups, but of 13 options, these ranked eighth and tenth, respectively, on the partners' list.

There was more agreement in terms of neighborhood challenges. The top three reported in the partner survey were lack of good jobs, neighborhood blight, and drug use. Though neighborhood blight was not mentioned by many clients, lack of good jobs and drug use were among the most frequent responses in the service groups.

Partners were also asked what they thought were the three most important services for individuals and families. The most common responses were employment assistance/job training, food assistance, and health care/insurance. When asked about barriers to services, partners noted eligibility requirements and waiting lists, as did clients, but partners were more likely to report that transportation was a barrier.

Part III: Head Start, Child Development, and Child Care Programs

A number of studies have demonstrated the benefits of preschool programs in terms of higher educational attainment, income, socioeconomic status, and health insurance coverage, as well as lower rates of justice-system involvement and substance abuse.⁵⁶ In Arizona, there are several publicly funded preschool programs, including Early Head Start, Head Start, and State-funded child care subsidies. These programs, though, fall far short of meeting the need for preschool programs. In fact, American Community Survey data shows that Arizona has the third-lowest proportion of its three and four year-olds enrolled in school.

Section III-1: Background on Arizona Preschool and Child Care Programs

Head Start is the nation's largest preschool program. It was established in 1965 as part of the 'War on Poverty'. Early Head Start was established in 1995. The programs' purpose, as stated in the Head Start Act is to:

...promote the school readiness of low-income children by enhancing their cognitive, social, and emotional development—

(1) in a learning environment that supports children's growth in language, literacy, mathematics, science, social and emotional functioning, creative arts, physical skills, and approaches to learning; and

(2) through the provision to low-income children and their families of health, educational, nutritional, social, and other services that are determined, based on family needs assessments, to be necessary.⁵⁷

Federal regulations generally require 90 percent of participants to be living in families with incomes below the federal poverty level. Head Start provides services to children from three to five years old while Early Head Start serves children from birth through two years of age. Services support the education, nutrition, health, and developmental needs of children as well as assist the families of participating children.

Responsibility for the delivery of Head Start and Early Head Start services in the City of Phoenix is divided across five organizations that are direct grantees of federal funds. In addition to the City, other grantees that serve specified geographic areas that include some portion of the City are Maricopa County, Southwest Human Development, Chicanos Por la Causa, and Crisis Nursery. The City, in turn, has 10 delegate agencies that deliver Head Start services in specified non-overlapping geographic areas. Most delegate agencies have multiple locations. Appendix J includes maps of the City's Head Start and Early Head Start service areas

HSD is funded for 3,090 ‘slots’, effectively the number of children who could be served for a full year. HSD, in turn, assigns these slots to its 10 delegate agencies. The number of children who receive services over the course of a year will generally exceed the number of slots as children who leave the program are replaced by others. The delegate agencies, the number of sites they operate, their assigned number of slots, and the number of children they served in fiscal year 2012 are listed in Figure 47. HSD also has funding for 300 Early Head Start slots.

In addition to the Early Head Start and Head Start programs, there are numerous child care providers located in the delegate agencies’ service areas. The Arizona Department of Health Services (DHS) is responsible for licensing most child care facilities in the State, including centers (facilities providing paid care to five or more children), small group homes (residential locations in which paid care is provided to between five and ten children), and public schools providing child care services, including Head Start providers. As of October 1, 2012, there were a total of 335 DHS-licensed child care providers with capacity for more than 32,000 children in the area covered by the delegate agencies, as summarized in Figure 48.⁵⁸ Additionally, families may receive child care from small family homes with four or fewer children that are certified by the Arizona Department of Economic Security (DES) or non-certified relative providers, but only about 15 percent of families using DES child care subsidies receive care from these provider types.⁵⁹

Provider capacity, however, does not guarantee access for low-income families. According to DES’ 2010 Child Care Market Rate Survey, the median daily cost of center-based child care in Maricopa County is \$40.80 for infants; \$36.74 for one and two year-olds; and \$32.00 for three, four, and five year-olds.⁶⁰ Assuming 21.7 weekdays per month, the median monthly cost ranges from \$695 to \$886. For a family of three living at the poverty level (\$1,591 per month), the cost of center-based child care for a single child is as much as 44 percent to 57 percent of their total earnings. Consequently, low-income families often require assistance in order to access paid child care.

The primary child care assistance program in Arizona has historically been the subsidy program administered by DES. The program generally provides subsidies for children up to twelve years of age in families earning no more than 165 percent of the federal poverty level. As noted in Section II-2, funding for the program has been drastically reduced in recent years and the overall caseload fell 43.5 percent between July 2008 and July 2012. During much of this period, a waiting list has been in effect. Figure 49 notes the number of children under six years of age receiving DES subsidies and the number on the waiting list in each of the delegate agencies' service areas. The table also provides an estimate of the number of these children who are between three and four years of age, assuming an even distribution of ages within the birth to six years group, and the number of children under six years of age on the waiting list.

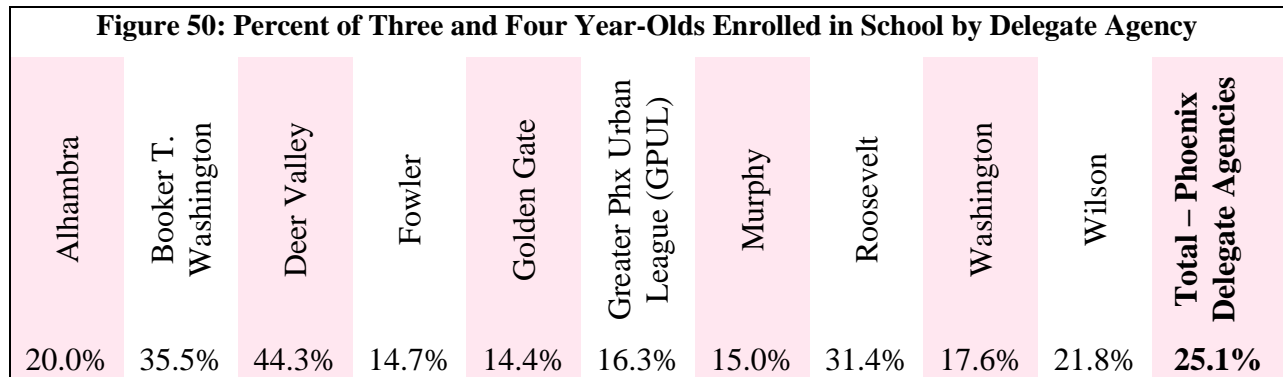
As shown in the table, the Washington service area has the greatest number of young children receiving child care subsidies, followed by Roosevelt and Golden Gate. The table also shows

there were 752 young children on the waiting list for subsidy assistance. However, it is believed this number is an underestimate because the waiting list has been in effect in most months since February 2009, likely discouraging applicants. Additionally, families on the waiting list must periodically reapply, but there is little incentive to do so when they are not receiving assistance, so many do not reapply and are removed from the list.

In response to cuts to the DES program, First Things First (FTF) created two ‘scholarship’ programs to subsidize the cost of child care for families of children from birth through five years. The first was the Pre-Kindergarten Scholarship program. Only one of the three regional councils administering FTF spending in Phoenix – the South Phoenix council – directed funding to this program in fiscal year 2012, serving 1,148 children.

Most FTF scholarships funding is now being directed to the Quality First Scholarship program. In fiscal year 2013, each of the three FTF councils in the City allocated funds to the program. Collectively, these councils allocated \$11.4 million to this program. In the first quarter of fiscal year 2013, these three regions reported serving 1,692 children.

Despite these programs, Arizona has one of the lowest rates of school enrollment amongst three and four year-olds. Only 34.2 percent of three and four year-olds are enrolled in preschool, a rate that trails only North Dakota and Nevada. The national average is 47.8 percent. The enrollment rates in the City’s Head Start service areas are even lower, as displayed in Figure 50.



Section III-2: Eligible Population Estimates and Current Service Levels

There are nearly 37,800 children less than five years of age living in poverty in Phoenix. An estimated 60 percent, about 22,700 children, are under three years old and therefore meet the age requirements for Early Head Start. The remaining 15,100 children are three or four years old, or the age of most children served by Head Start. Of these totals, an estimated 12,213 birth-to-three year-olds reside in the City’s Early Head Start service area and 10,658 three and four year-olds live in the areas served by the Human Services Department’s delegate agencies. Given the declining number of Phoenix births between 2008 and 2010 discussed in Section I-3, the number of children eligible for Head Start can reasonably be expected to decline in coming years. This may not significantly impact the demand for services, however, because only a fraction of eligible children are currently able to receive services.

HSD’s 3,090 Head Start slots is equal to only 29.0 percent of all eligible children while the 300 Early Head Start slots represent only 2.4 percent of the estimated 12,295 eligible children. Figure 51 displays the ratio of slots to estimated eligible children by delegate agency.

As shown in the table, Wilson actually has more slots than the estimate of eligible children in its service area. Slots are equal to 83 percent of the estimated number of eligible children in Murphy. At the other end of the spectrum, the slots assigned to Golden Gate are equal to only nine percent of the number of eligible children estimated for its service area. Each of the other delegate agencies has slots equal to between 29 and 53 percent of estimated eligible children in its respective service area.

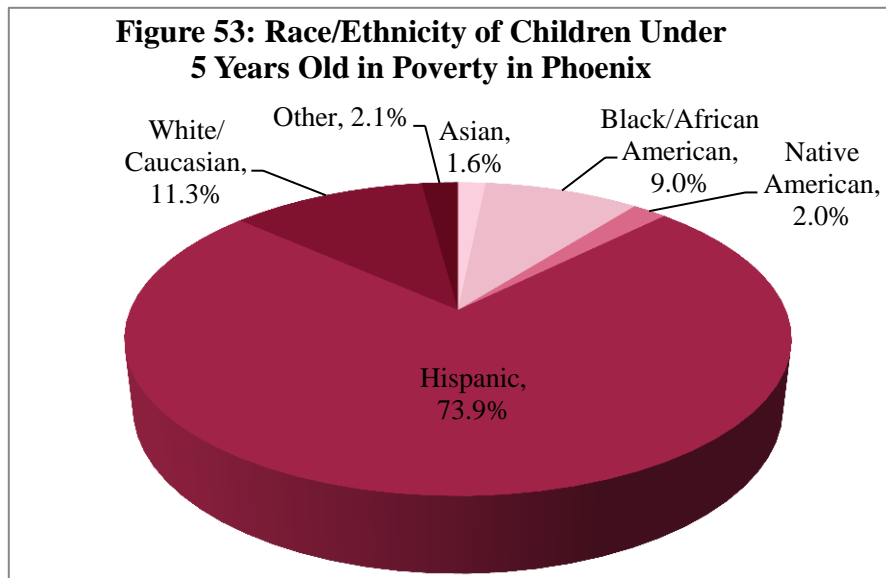
Figure 52: Distance of Head Start Eligible Children from an In-Area Site by Delegate Agency

In general, the number and location of Head Start sites in the delegate agencies’ service areas would appear to facilitate access when slots are available. Based on current site locations, almost two-thirds of eligible children are within one mile of a site and 95 percent are within three miles as illustrated by Figure 52. Only in the Greater Phoenix Urban League service area are more than ten percent of eligible children further than 3 miles from a site.

As illustrated in the demographic overviews of delegate agencies included in Appendix H, nearly half of all households in poverty with children under five years are headed by unmarried females, including nearly 70 percent of such households in the Booker T. Washington and Wilson service areas. In the Murphy service area, almost 60 percent of households in poverty are led by married couples.

In contrast, HSD’s program information reports (PIR) indicate 59 percent of Head Start families and 69 percent of Early Head Start families are two-parent households. These statistics may suggest two-parent families are more likely to participate in Head Start services. However, this conclusion is not certain because the PIR includes both married and unmarried two-parent families, whereas the Census only counts households led by married couples.

Figure 53 displays the racial composition of young children in poverty in the City. Nearly three-quarters of the children under five years old and living in poverty are Hispanic. In only two delegate agency service areas is the proportion of young children in poverty who are Hispanic under 70 percent. The Deer Valley service area is 44.4 percent White, 38.8 percent Hispanic, and 16.8



percent Asian and the Washington service area is 62.8 percent Hispanic, 16.3 percent White, and 11.6 percent Black. In four service areas, at least 10.0 percent of the young children in poverty are Black. Of children participating in Head Start in fiscal year 2012, 80.9 percent were Hispanic, as were 81.7 percent of Early Head Start children. These percentages are somewhat higher than the proportion of young children in poverty who are Hispanic, indicating these families participate in Head Start at a greater rate than families of other racial/ethnic backgrounds.

The Census does not make available other demographic data specific to households with children less than five years of age. Based on the overall population of individuals in poverty discussed in Section II-1 and detailed in Appendix B, it is likely many of the parents in

these homes have low levels of formal education and may struggle with English. PIR and caseload data generally confirms these assumptions. Summaries of select demographic information are included in Figure 54. Additional detail by delegate agency is included in Appendix H.

Section III-3: Children with Disabilities and Other Special Needs Populations

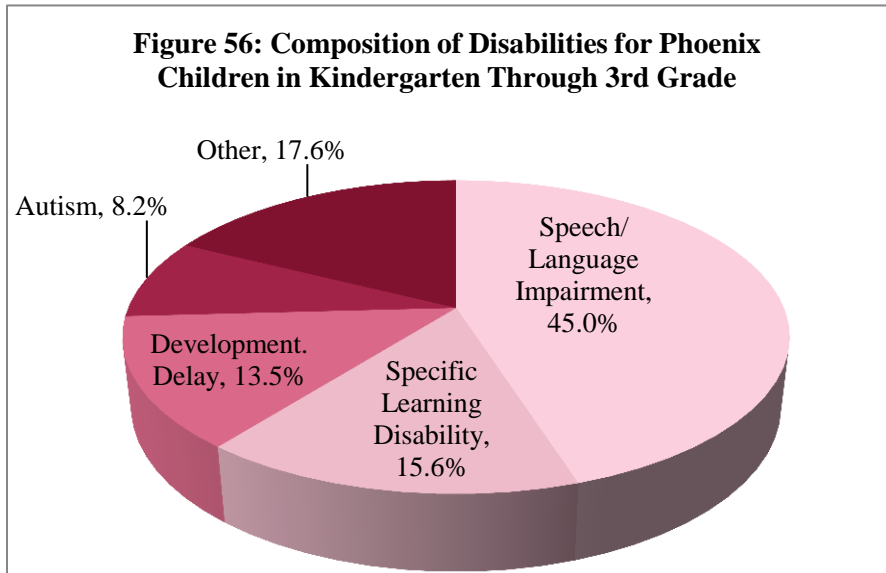
Children with disabilities are a special focus of the Head Start program with the Head Start Act requiring at least ten percent of the children enrolled by each Head Start agency and each delegate agency be children with disabilities.⁶¹

The broadest available information related to disability rates are the special education counts tracked by the Arizona Department of Education. City-wide, there were 6,390 children with disabilities in kindergarten through third grade. As noted previously, children with disabilities are much more likely to attend traditional district schools than charter schools as demonstrated in Figure 55. By district, Tempe (Elementary) had the lowest rate of disabilities within these grades at 3.3 percent and Paradise Valley Unified had the highest rate at 12.1 percent.

Figure 56 summarizes the types of disabilities reported for these children. The most common reported disability is speech/language impairments, accounting for more than 45 percent of all disabilities, followed by specific learning disability, developmental delay, and autism. Other disabilities include intellectual disability, emotional disability, and hearing and vision impairments.

Other programs that serve children with narrower categories of disabilities include Children’s Rehabilitative Services (CRS) administered by AHCCCS and DES’ Arizona Early Intervention Program (AzEIP) and Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD).

CRS provides Medicaid-funded health care services to children and young adults under 21 years of age with serious chronic and disabling conditions such as congenital heart disease and cystic fibrosis. Between fiscal years 2008 and 2012, the average monthly statewide, all-ages caseload increased 22.8 percent, from 6,509 to 7,990.⁶² Prior to fiscal year 2010, the State operated a ‘state-only’ program for about 4,500 children who were not Medicaid eligible, but the program was eliminated that year as part of budget cuts made in response to declining revenues.

AzEIP provides a continuum of developmental services (including physical, occupational, and speech therapy; service coordination; and special instruction) to infants and toddlers under three years of age with, or at risk of, developmental delays or disabilities to promote the child’s development and facilitate the child’s successful engagement in relationships, activities, routines, and events of everyday life. Almost 1,500 Phoenix children were enrolled in July 2012.

DDD provides a variety of habilitative and medical services to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities, including cognitive disabilities, cerebral palsy, and autism. The program served 1,443 children under the age of six years in July 2012, an 8.1 percent increase compared to 1,335 July 2008. The Washington service area has the greatest number of children enrolled with DDD with 368, followed by Golden Gate (257) and Roosevelt (203).

Since the CRS, AzEIP, or DDD programs have specific and somewhat narrow eligibility criteria compared to public schools’ special needs criteria, it is assumed the kindergarten through third grade disability rates provide the best estimate of the potential number of children with disabilities in each service area. The quality of special education data reported by school districts appears to vary so a single, weighted average rate is used for all service areas. Combining the counts of three and four year-olds in poverty presented in Figure 57 with the 8.5 percent disability rate summarized in Figure 55 yields the following estimates of the number of children with disabilities in each delegate agency service area.

Other special needs populations include children experiencing homelessness and refugee children. As noted earlier, there are nearly 14,000 children without homes attending schools in districts and charter providers serving Phoenix and the largest numbers are in the earliest grades. In fiscal year 2012, HSD reported 74 Head Start and 34 Early Head Start participants were homeless. There are nearly 3,000 refugee students enrolled in school districts serving Phoenix, including 621 in kindergarten through third grade. Figure 58 notes the top ten Phoenix area school districts in terms of enrollment of children experiencing homelessness or refugees.

Section III-4: Education, Health, and Nutrition Needs of Head Start Families

Families with young children living in poverty may require assistance in order to meet their education, health, nutrition, and social service needs. Evaluating the services these families currently use offers some insight into these needs, but may not give a complete picture if there are other supports families need but are not receiving for any number of reasons. It is therefore also important to hear directly from families regarding their needs.

A general overview of the major government assistance programs and City-wide caseload figures were included in Section II-3. Figure 59 provides estimates of the number of families with young children that utilize various programs.

The programs listed in the table are not directly comparable to the number of children in poverty because eligibility for Cash Assistance requires incomes below the poverty level, while SNAP and WIC have higher income limits and CPS obviously is not tied to income. However, the caseload levels do provide some perspective on the programs that are important to low-income families. In particular, families rely heavily on nutrition programs, with nearly 52,000 families in the Head Start service areas using WIC and more than 11,000 families receiving SNAP benefits.

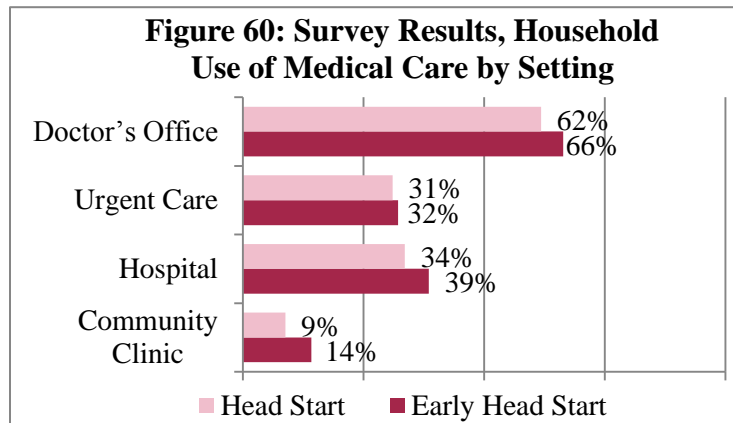

One of the broadest and most important State programs is Medicaid, which provides health care to low-income individuals. However, it is not included in Figure 59 because information regarding enrollees’ ages was not available at any detailed geographic level, making it impossible to derive estimates. As discussed later in this Section, questions regarding AHCCCS enrollment were included in the community survey and more than two-third indicated they rely on AHCCCS for their insurance coverage.

Additional support needs of Early Head Start and Head Start eligible families include child care discussed in Section II-2, disabilities programs reviewed in Section III-3, and services provided through the public school system highlighted in Section I-3.

To hear directly from its clients regarding their needs, HSD conducted a community survey in which it asked families about the services they have used in the past 12 months, as well as assistance they need but are not receiving. The survey results largely validate the trends evident in the caseload data, but also offer a more detailed view.

The survey included a number of questions related to health care services. The first was a section regarding the types and locations of health care services individuals in the household received. Figure 60 summarizes responses to whether anyone in the household received any care from a number of settings. As the chart shows, a majority of respondents reported someone in the household had been to a doctor's office in the past year, while a little less than one-third reported using urgent care. Hospital usage was high, with 34 percent of Head Start families and 39 percent of Early Head Start families reporting someone had used a hospital. Survey participants were not asked for the reason someone used a hospital so it is unclear if these visits were for emergencies or other reasons. In terms of other specified medical care, about 60 percent of Head Start and Early Head Start families reported use of immunizations and dental care, while prenatal care, mental health services, substance abuse treatment, and developmental disability services were each used by fewer than 12 percent of households.



Survey participants were then asked whether there were any health care services either they or their children needed, but did not receive in the past year. Among Head Start families, 18 percent of respondents stated they or a child had untreated health needs while 23 percent of Early Head Start respondents answered similarly. When asked why they or their child did not receive needed health care, most noted a lack of insurance or an inability to afford copayments. Smaller numbers reported a lack of transportation, language barriers, or a distrust of doctors.

The survey also inquired regarding health insurance specifically. About thirty percent of Head Start and Early Head Start respondents reported they did not have health insurance. Of those who were insured, about 80 percent reported they were enrolled in AHCCCS. Fewer than ten percent reported having health insurance through an employer.

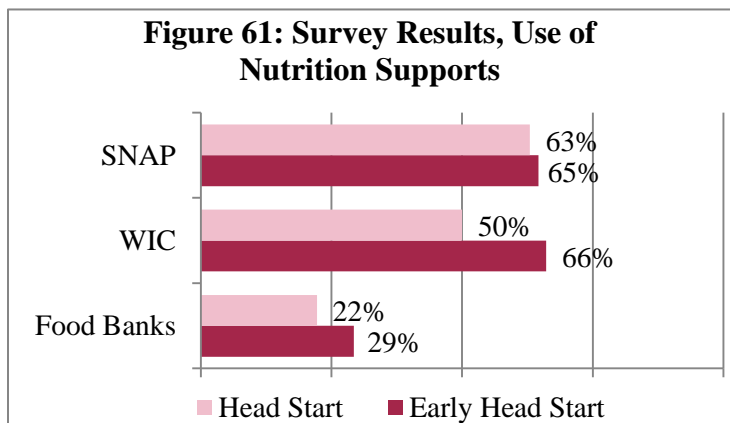
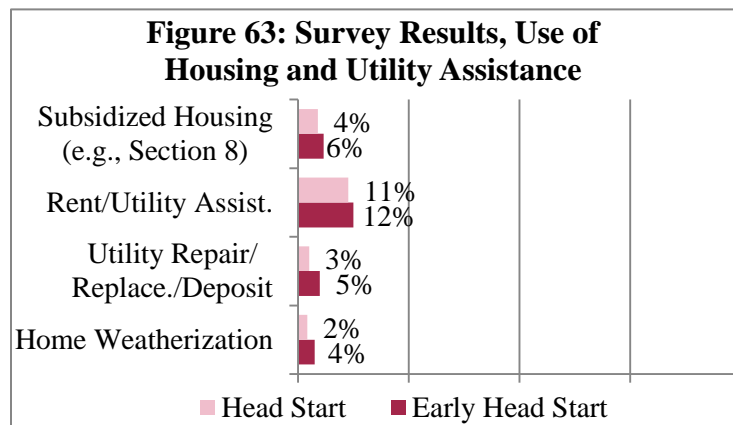
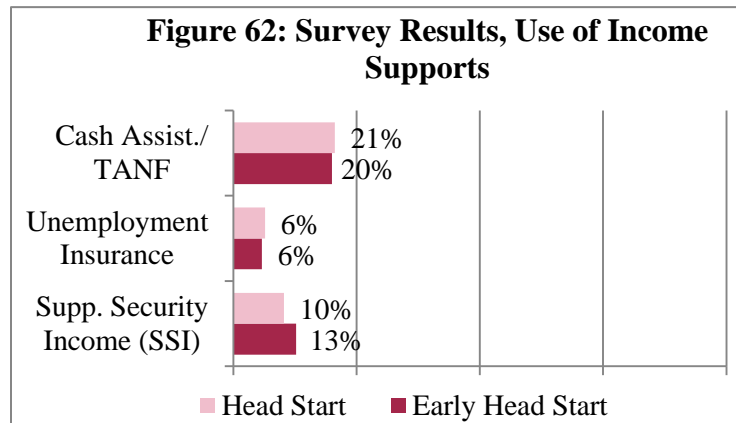


Figure 61 summarizes nutrition supports, which were among the most utilized services. About two-thirds of Early Head Start and Head Start households receive SNAP benefits (food stamps). Additionally, a quarter used a food bank within the past year. Two-thirds of Early Head Start households received WIC, compared to half of Head Start households.

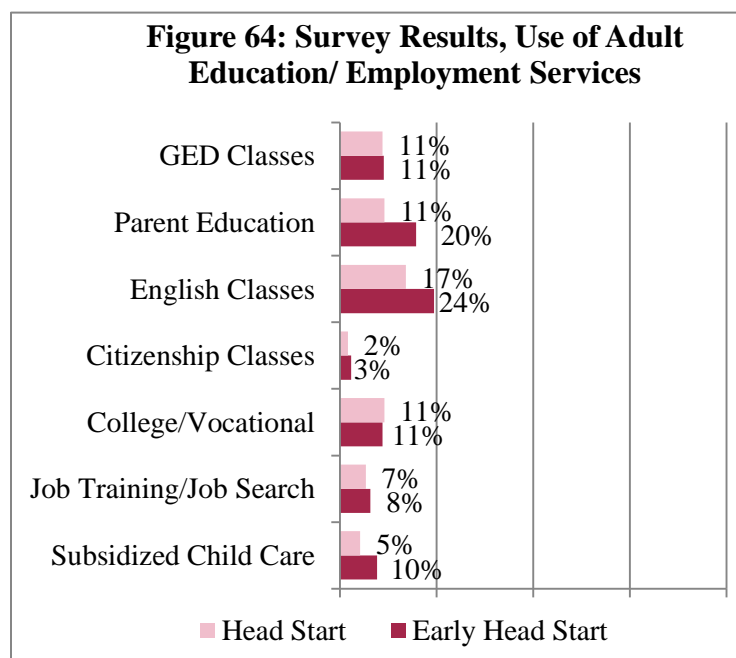
Survey respondents were also asked whether they used specified income support programs within the past year. Results are noted in Figure 62. The chart demonstrates these programs are accessed by relatively small groups of Early Head Start and Head Start families. This comparatively low usage is likely due to eligibility requirements that are more restrictive than AHCCCS, SNAP, or WIC.



There were similarly low reported usage rates of housing and utility assistance as displayed in Figure 63. About 12 percent of Early Head Start and Head Start families received rental or utility assistance in the past year, but no more than six percent reported receiving subsidized housing; assistance from the utility repair, replacement, and deposit (URRD) program; or home weatherization. These programs

have limited resources, which may explain the low rates of utilization.

The survey also included a number of adult education and employment services. Reported usage for these services is noted in Figure 64. Overall use of these services was low. In terms of employment supports, less than 10 percent received job training/ job search assistance or subsidized child care. College or vocational training was utilized by 11 percent of Head Start and Early Head Start families. A little more than 10 percent of both groups accessed GED classes. Among Early Head Start respondents, 20 percent reported that they received parenting education, but it is unknown whether this was instruction separate from Early Head



Start itself. Among the Head Start and Early Head Start families that completed the Spanish version of the survey, 35 percent reported attending English classes.

Lastly, about six percent of Head Start and Early Head Start respondents reported they received legal assistance within the past year. Three percent or less reported that they received homeless or domestic violence shelter or crime victim advocacy services.

After reporting the services they do receive, survey respondents were asked what services they are not currently receiving would be most beneficial to them and their family. Figure 65 summarizes these responses.

Dental care was the service chosen by the greatest number of Head Start and Early Head Start families. As noted, AHCCCS is the source of health care coverage for most of these families. However, AHCCCS generally does not cover dental care for adults, which may explain the prevalence of this response. Child care was the second most frequent response. As discussed in Section II-2, State subsidized child care has decreased markedly in recent years due to budget reductions. English instruction, utility assistance, and health care/insurance round out the five most needed services.

When asked what is preventing them from accessing these services, respondents most frequently cited they do not meet eligibility requirements, which was followed by copayments and waiting lists. Inconvenient hours or a lack of transportation were noted less commonly.

Section III-5: Community Resources

Section II-2 outlined many of the State and City programs intended to meet the needs of individuals and families in need, including those eligible for Early Head Start and Head Start. These services include income supports, health care, nutrition programs, and child care. Government programs represent only one facet of community resources, however. Non-profit and faith-based organizations are also integral components of the human services safety net.

According to the Association of Religion Data Archives, there were 2,299 religious congregations representing 139 religious bodies in Maricopa County in 2010.⁶³ Many of these congregations embrace a service philosophy and, as such, represent opportunities for partnerships with the City's Human Services Department. In fact, HSD actively seeks to build these collaborations.

The City has a 20-member Faith-Based Initiatives Work Group that facilitates communication between the City and faith communities. The Work Group has also planned a series of summits to develop partnerships around specific issues. Topics have included a dialogue on poverty, improving financial education, homelessness, and falls prevention. Current faith-based initiatives include neighborhood transformation, individual and family stability, seniors, an earned income tax credit campaign, heat relief, financial education classes, and the homeless street count.

Arizona 2-1-1's website, <http://www.cir.org>, provides a comprehensive searchable database of social services providers. Categories include adoption and foster care, caregiver services, clothing, disability related services, domestic violence services, education, employment services, family services, financial services, food/meals, health and dental care, home services, housing, legal assistance, mental health and substance abuse treatment, veterans services, refugee services, senior services, transportation, and utility assistance.

Although human services programs have been challenged by the economic recession that has simultaneously increased the number of individuals in need while reducing funding with which to deliver these services, the combination of public and private resources highlighted throughout this assessment constitutes a broad safety net for the community.

Part IV: Partners' Comments on HSD Strengths and Opportunities for Improvement

Excellent. Caring. Dedicated. Knowledgeable. Helpful. Kind. Great. These are some of the words used to describe Human Services Department employees. The virtues of HSD staff were the dominant theme in partners' responses when asked to cite the greatest strengths of the Department's programs.

Quality staff have resulted in quality programs as respondents also variously cited each of HSD's programs and even specific locations as a strength of the Department. In broader terms, a number of partners noted that HSD provides a comprehensive array of supports and programs that are flexible and innovative. Another oft-mentioned strength was the number and effectiveness of collaborations between HSD and its partners and their collective commitment to the individuals they serve.

When asked to suggest opportunities for the improvement of HSD, there were numerous proposals related to very specific issues. These suggestions have a narrower focus than this assessment, but have been separately shared with HSD for review and consideration. More broadly, there were a few areas that were most frequently mentioned. It was the opinion of many respondents that funding for specific services or HSD programs generally was inadequate. Several commenters suggested improvements were needed in communication, including better educating City leadership regarding the importance of HSD programs, increasing outreach to individuals and families in need, and enhancing communication with community partners. Finally, a number of survey participants suggested steps be taken to improve access to transportation, although as noted in Section II-3, this service was not ranked as one of the most pressing issues by service recipients.

Overall, the comments portray a Department with strong management and staff, that effectively and efficiently delivers valuable services to the City's residents, and that is well-positioned to continue to improve.

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Appendix A-I: Community Assessment Demographic Data Overview

Demographic data included in the City of Phoenix Human Services Department's 2013 Community Assessment has been adapted from the Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS) five-year estimates for 2006 through 2010. This Appendix provides a brief overview of the ACS, lists the specific tables used in the Community Assessment, and outlines the methodologies used to map the data and combine race and ethnicity data.

Background

The American Community Survey differs from the decennial Census in several important ways:

- The ACS is an ongoing survey that provides data every year, compared to the Census, which is conducted once per decade
- The ACS collects much more detailed demographic data than the Census, which only gathers data regarding gender, age, race/ethnicity, and home ownership
- The ACS is an estimate based on a sample – about one percent of households are surveyed every year – compared to the Census, which aims to collect data from every household

The first two bullets highlight the primary benefits of the ACS and the reasons it was used in the Community Assessment, its timeliness and the depth of information it provides.

The ACS makes available three different estimate timeframes: one-year, three-year, and five-year. The one-year estimates are obviously the most timely, while the five-year estimates have perhaps the lowest potential sampling error because it incorporates data from five surveys. Importantly, data for individual census tracts are included only in the five-year estimates. In order to provide analyses at a sub-city level (i.e., across urban villages and Head Start service areas), the Community Assessment uses the five-year estimates.

The five-year ACS estimates for 2006 through 2010 will differ from the official 2010 Census counts. However, the totals for the City of Phoenix are very close; the five-year ACS total population estimate for the City is 1,451,389, which is about four-tenths of one percent greater than the official 2010 Census tally of 1,445,632. Given the small variation, the five-year ACS estimates appear reasonable and were not adjusted to comport with the official tally.

ACS Tables Used

ACS data is made available online at factfinder2.census.gov/. The Census Bureau has constructed a number of tables to summarize the data collected in the ACS. Figure A-1 lists the ACS data included in the Community Assessment and the table from which each was adapted.

Summarizing Data by Village/Head Start Service Area

Given the geographic size and diversity of the City, the Community Assessment summarizes demographic and caseload data at sub-City levels. Specifically, this data was reported for the City's urban villages and Head Start service areas. Allocation methodologies were developed in order to provide estimates for these smaller geographic areas.

Dividing the City into smaller areas allows service planning to take into consideration the unique characteristics of the City's neighborhoods. To facilitate this planning and taking advantage of already-defined regions, the Community Assessment details demographic and caseload data within each of the City's 15 urban villages. The villages – and the Planning Committee within each – exist to assist the City in updating the General Plan; defining the future function, density, and character of subareas within the village; and commenting on proposals for new zoning or land use districts. A map outlining the boundaries of these villages is included as Figure 1 in the Community Assessment.

Data was similarly detailed for Early Head Start and Head Start service areas. In most cases, these services areas correspond to the boundaries of a school district or group of school districts¹.

Allocating information provided for census tracts and zip codes required the development of 'keys' to apportion the data. In brief, this process involved:

- Collecting 'shape' files that outline the location boundaries of the geographic areas for analysis (that is, the urban villages and Head Start service areas)²
- Overlaying these shape files with City boundary³, census tract, and zip code shape files
- Further overlaying these files with census block⁴ and city boundary shape files
- Calculating the total population of each zip code or census tract by adding the populations of the census blocks within each zip code or census tract
- Calculating the percentage of the total population of each census tract or zip code that is within the City limits by comparing the populations of the census blocks within the City to the total determined in the previous step
- Calculating the percentage of the City population that is within each urban village or Head Start service area by comparing the populations of the census blocks within the zip code or census tract to the City total determined in the previous step

- Applying these percentages to the census tract and zip code data to allocate the data to urban village and Head Start service areas

An example can make the methodology clearer. In this example, an estimate of the number of service users – based on caseload estimates by zip code – is developed for Example Unified School District (EUSD):

- An overlay analysis shows that all of zip code 12345 is within the city limits
- Another overlay shows a portion, but not all, of zip code 12345 lies within EUSD
- The 12345 zip code is composed of three census blocks
- These census blocks have populations of 30, 40, and 50 individuals, for a total of 120
- Only one of these census blocks – the one with a population of 30 – is in EUSD; thus, 25 percent (30 divided by 120) of any data for zip code 12345 is allocated to EUSD
- There are a total of 20 service users in zip code 12345 so an estimated 5 (20 multiplied by 25 percent) are in the EUSD boundaries

The allocation keys that were created are attached as Appendices A-II through A-V.

The Community Assessment also includes ‘buffer analyses’ to determine the proximity of service locations to eligible individuals. Specifically, these analyses consider the locations of senior centers, family service centers, and Head Start sites and measure the percentage of eligible individuals within one mile and three miles of a location.

For community centers and senior centers, the service location was plotted and one-mile radius circles were drawn around each. The population that was within a covered radius was tallied by census tract. If a census tract was split by the border of the coverage radius, the census tract population was prorated by geographical area, which assumes a constant population density within a census tract. For example, if a census tract had 25 percent of its total land area within the coverage radius, 25 percent of the census tract population was included. This was repeated using a three-mile radius from the service location.

The Head Start analysis was similar, but also had to account for delegate agency boundaries. Children may only attend Head Start delivered by the delegate agency serving that child’s school district. Thus, if a child resides in School District 1, they can only attend Head Start programs delivered by the delegate agency for School District 1, even if they live nearer a Head Start site in School District 2. To account for that requirement, the analysis was conducted separately for each of the 10 delegate agencies, calculating the proportion of children within a one-mile and three-mile radius of a Head Start site within the school district in which they reside.

The Community Assessment also includes the locations of various City resources. Many of these resources are displayed on the map in Appendix J-VIII. Location data was provided by the City.

Race/Ethnicity

Many ACS tables can be filtered by racial group, allowing for analysis of demographic differences across races (e.g., developing the racial distribution for children under five years of age living in poverty). However, for the purposes of the Census, ‘Hispanic/Latino’ is not considered a race. Rather, it is considered an ethnicity and individuals must choose another race, typically White/Caucasian or ‘some other’. In order to develop estimates of racial populations that consider Hispanic/Latino on par with other races, a methodology was developed to adjust the race totals to account for individuals of Hispanic descent.

In brief, the methodology included the following steps:

- Query the demographic variable (e.g., age group) with filters for each race, total individuals of Hispanic descent, individuals of Hispanic descent who identify as White, and individuals of Hispanic descent who identify as some other race
- Treat the total count of individuals of Hispanic descent as its own race category
- Reduce the counts for the White and some other race categories by the number within each racial category that are of Hispanic descent
- Calculate the remaining number of individuals of Hispanic descent (i.e., those who are not White or some other race) and prorate this number across the remaining races based on the City-wide distribution of individuals of Hispanic descent within these races
- Reduce the counts of these races by the prorated number of Hispanic individuals
- Adjust for any resulting negative numbers (i.e., instances in which the prorated number assigned to a race exceeds the number of individuals in that racial category)

This calculation was performed at the census tract level in order to facilitate the detailed geographic analyses included in the Community Assessment.

This methodology provides a more complete portrayal of the racial/ethnic composition of the City and its neighborhoods than separately reporting race excluding those of Hispanic descent and the count of individuals of Hispanic descent. However, it is imprecise because the ACS separately records race and Hispanic ethnicity requiring assumptions regarding how to assign individuals to a single group. As the methodological description outlines, the analysis effectively counted anyone of Hispanic origin as ‘Hispanic’ rather than whatever race they selected. Given that 92 percent of individuals of Hispanic descent in Phoenix described themselves as White or some other race (and another five percent selected multiple races), this assumption appears reasonable and does not significantly undercount other races.

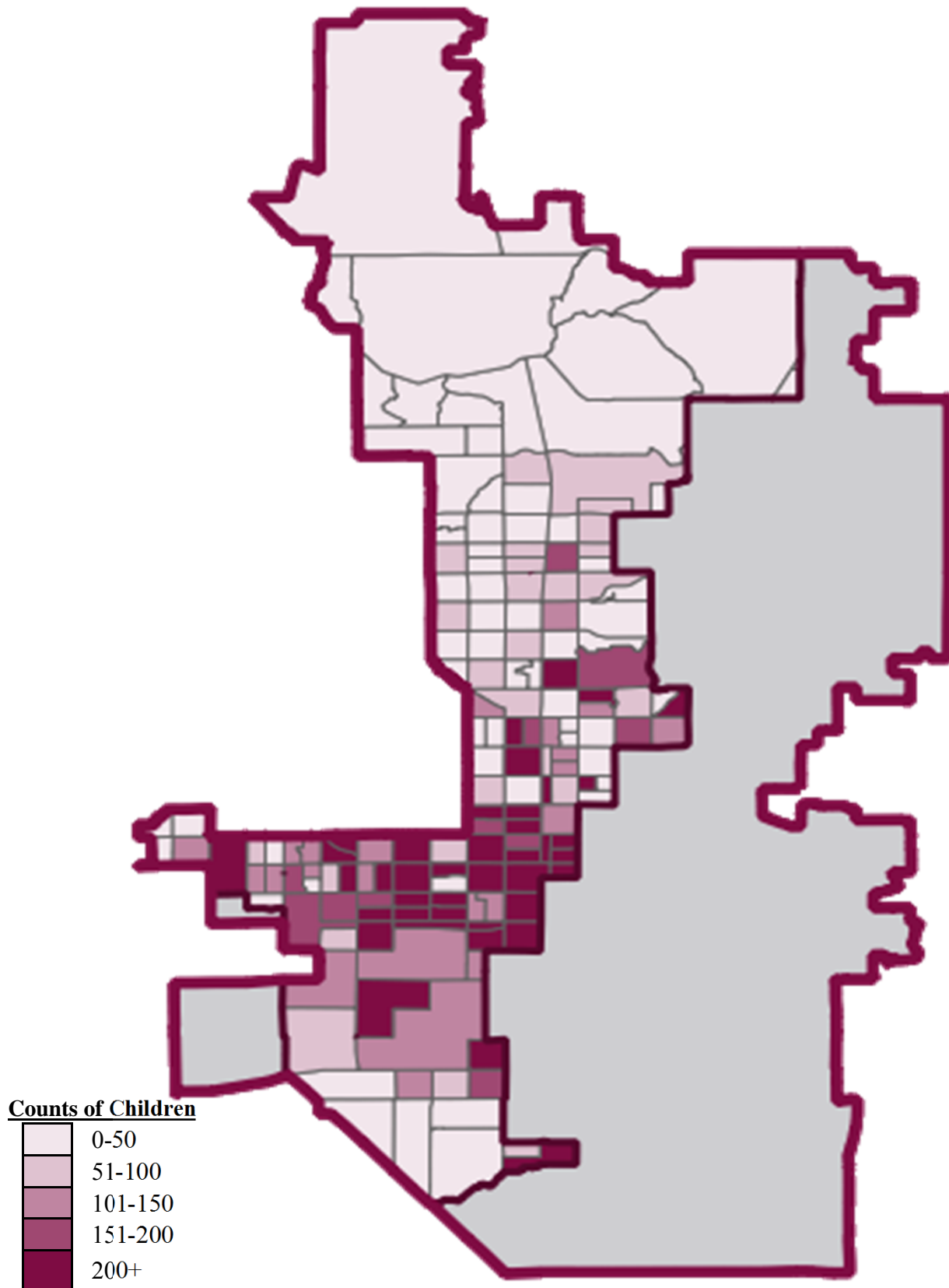

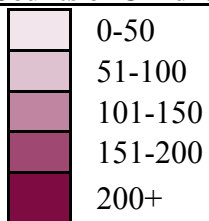

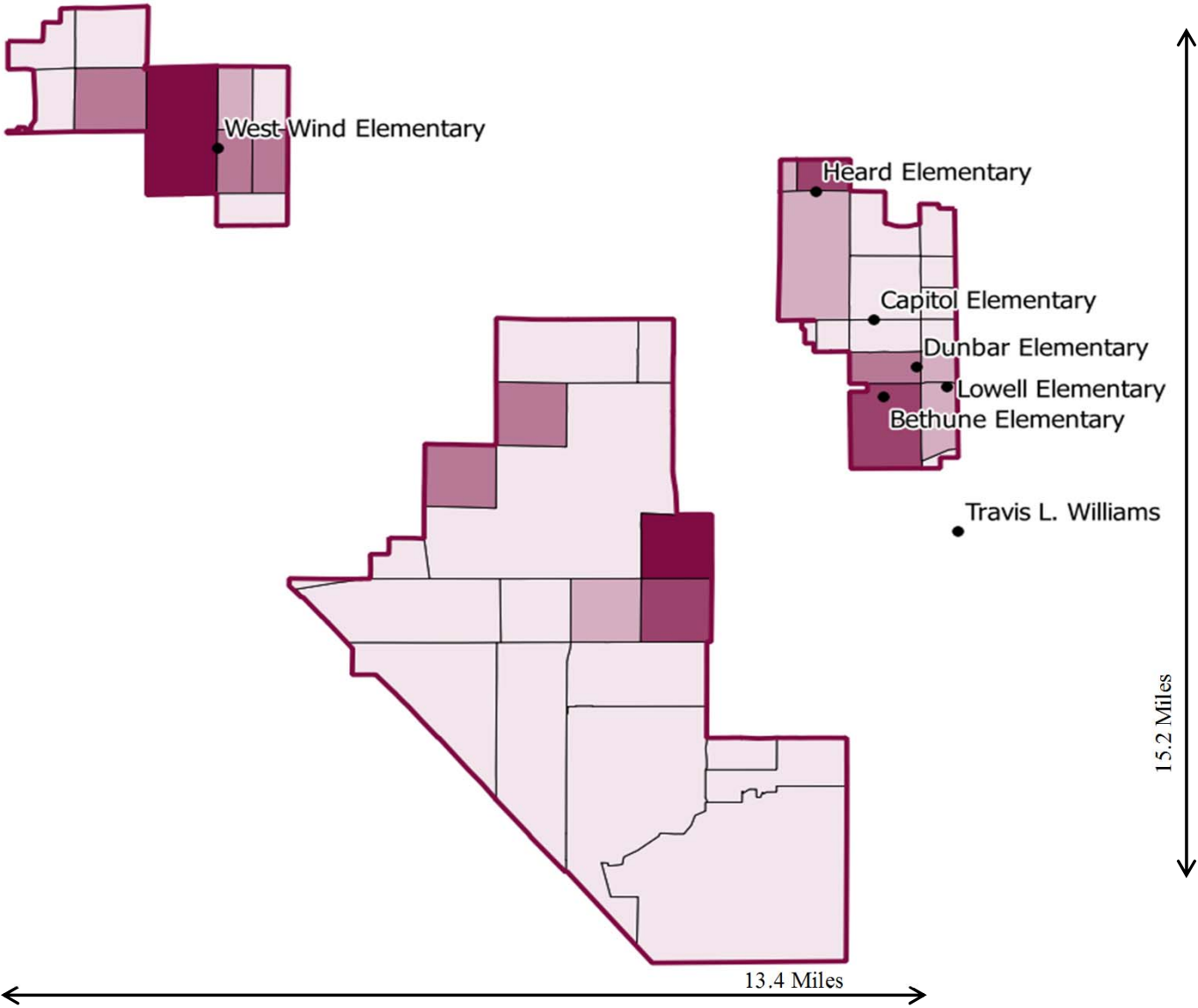

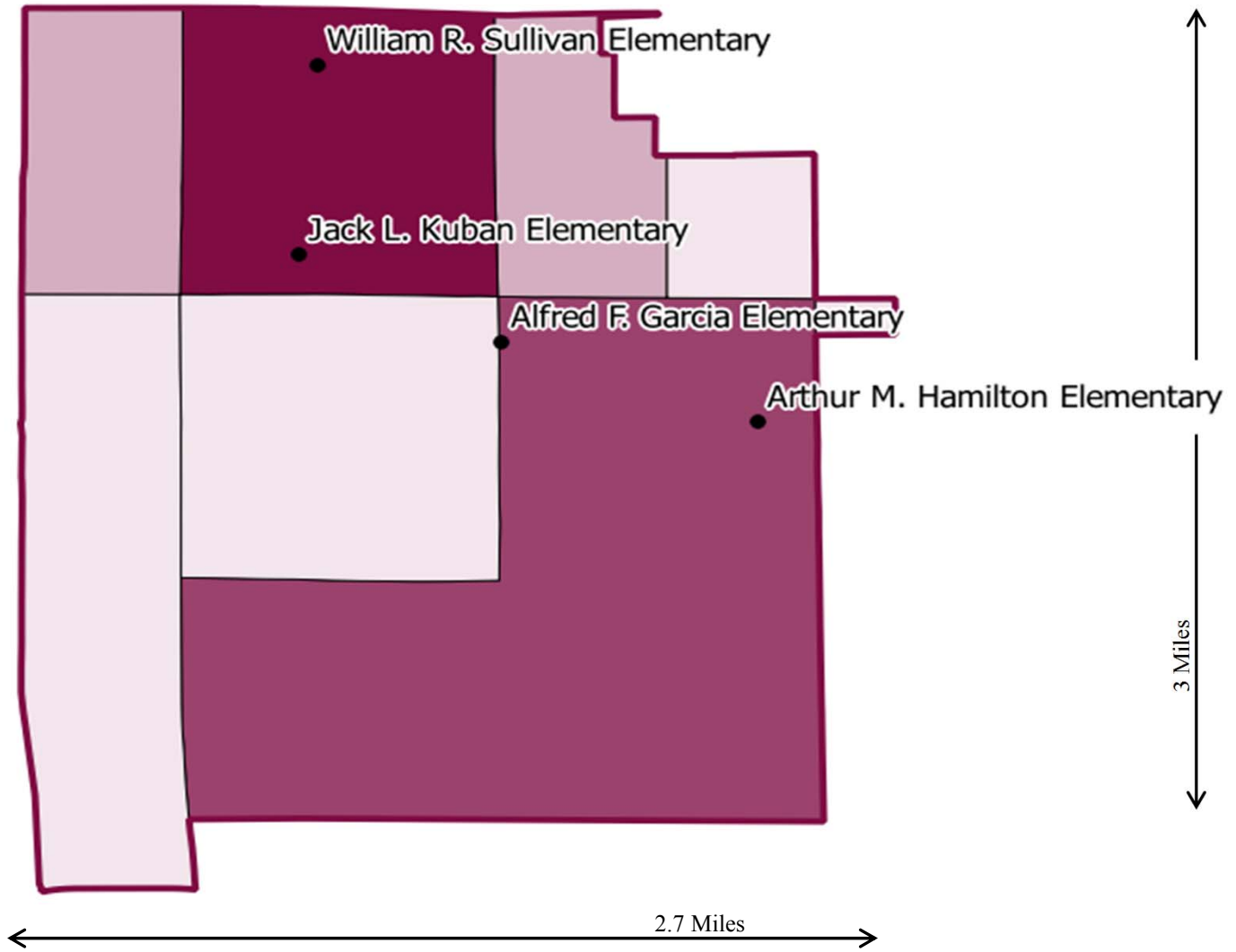

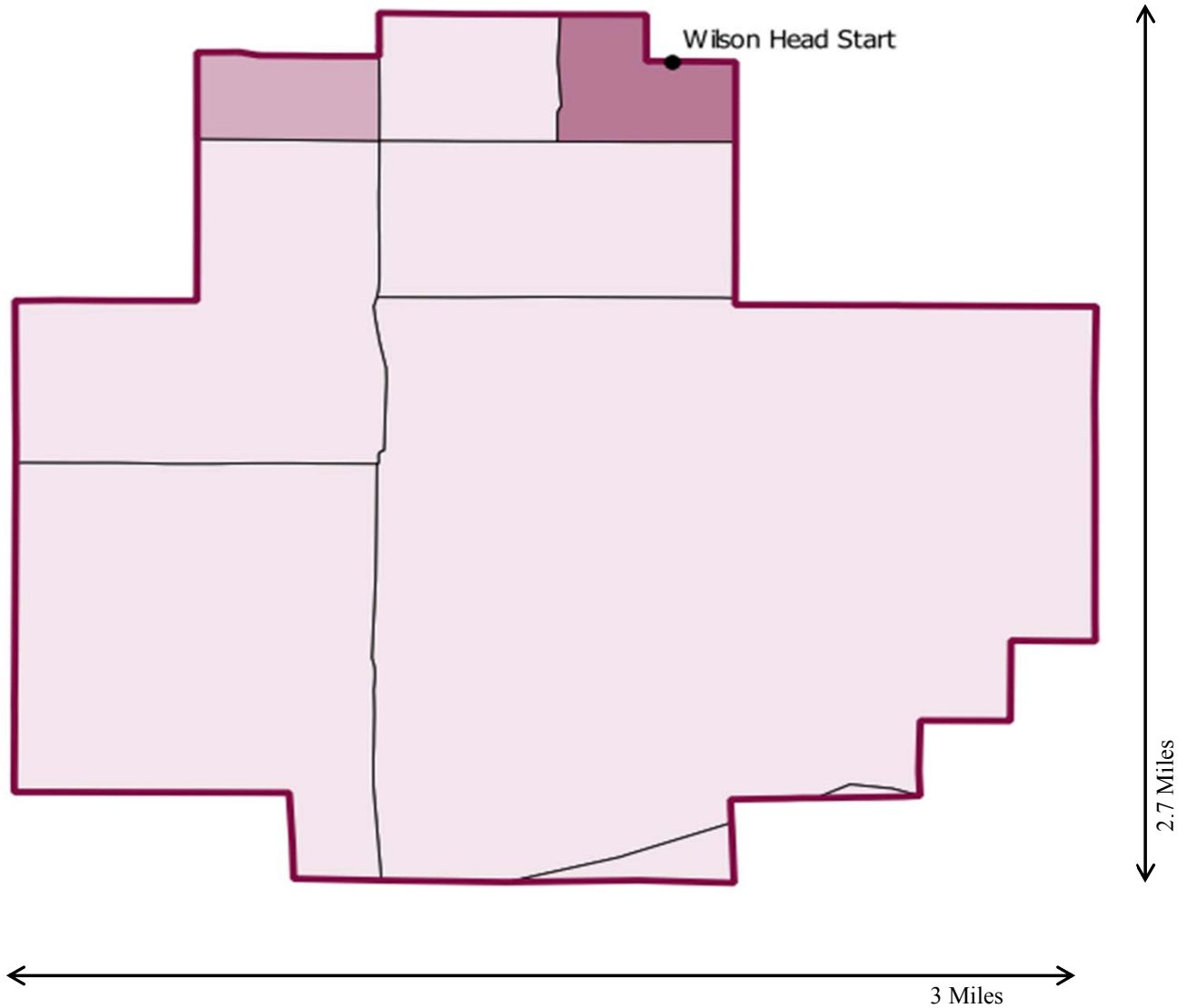

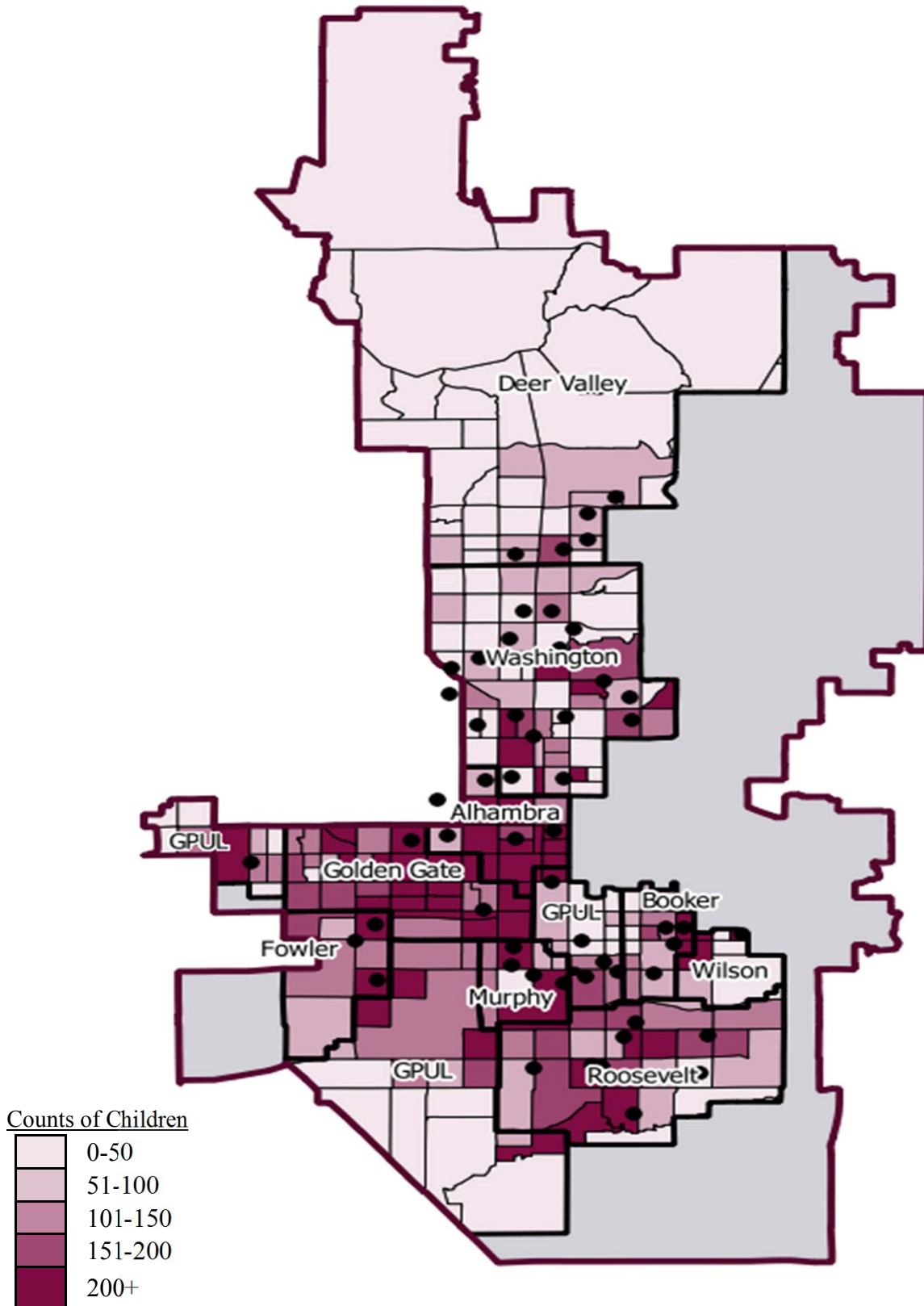

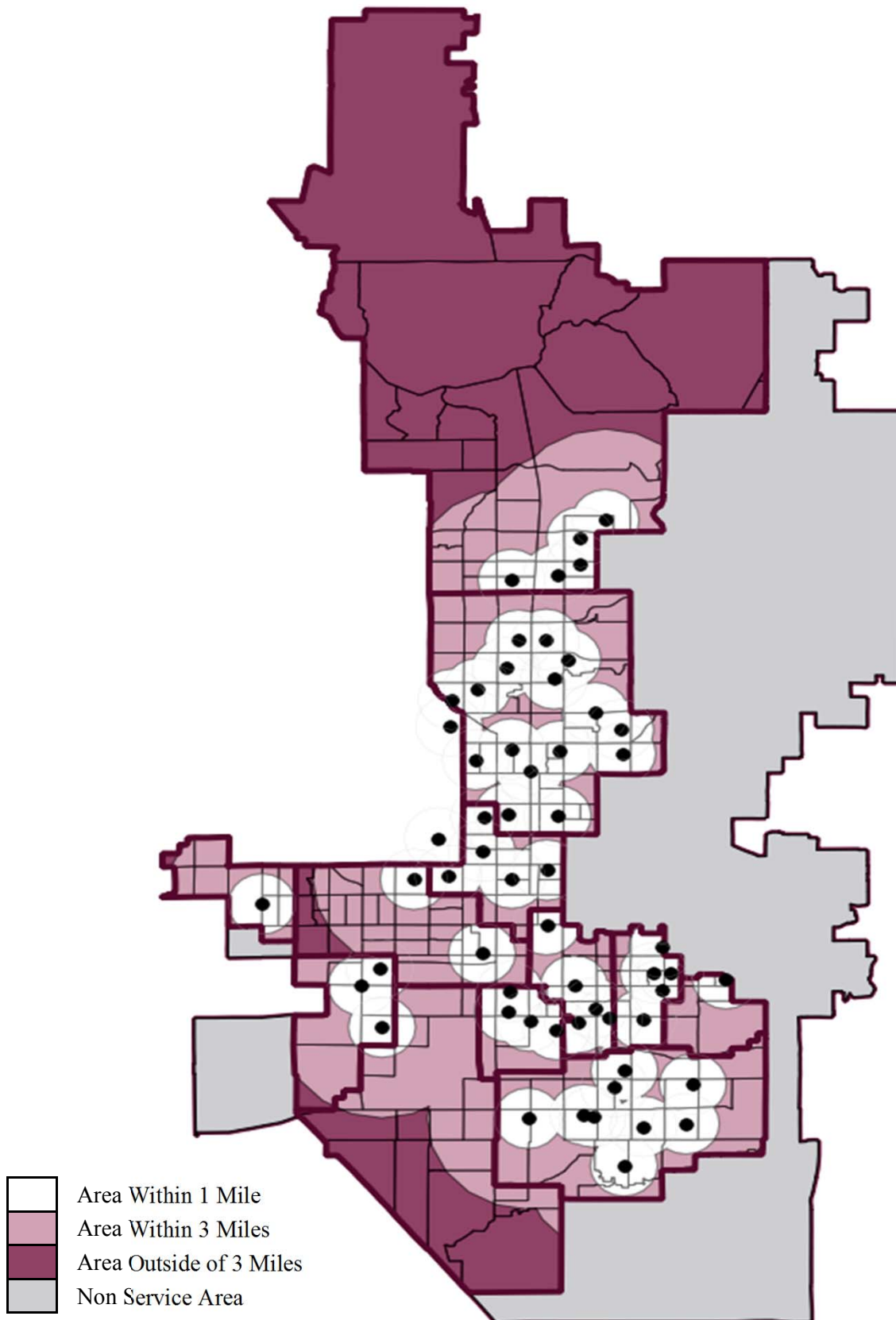

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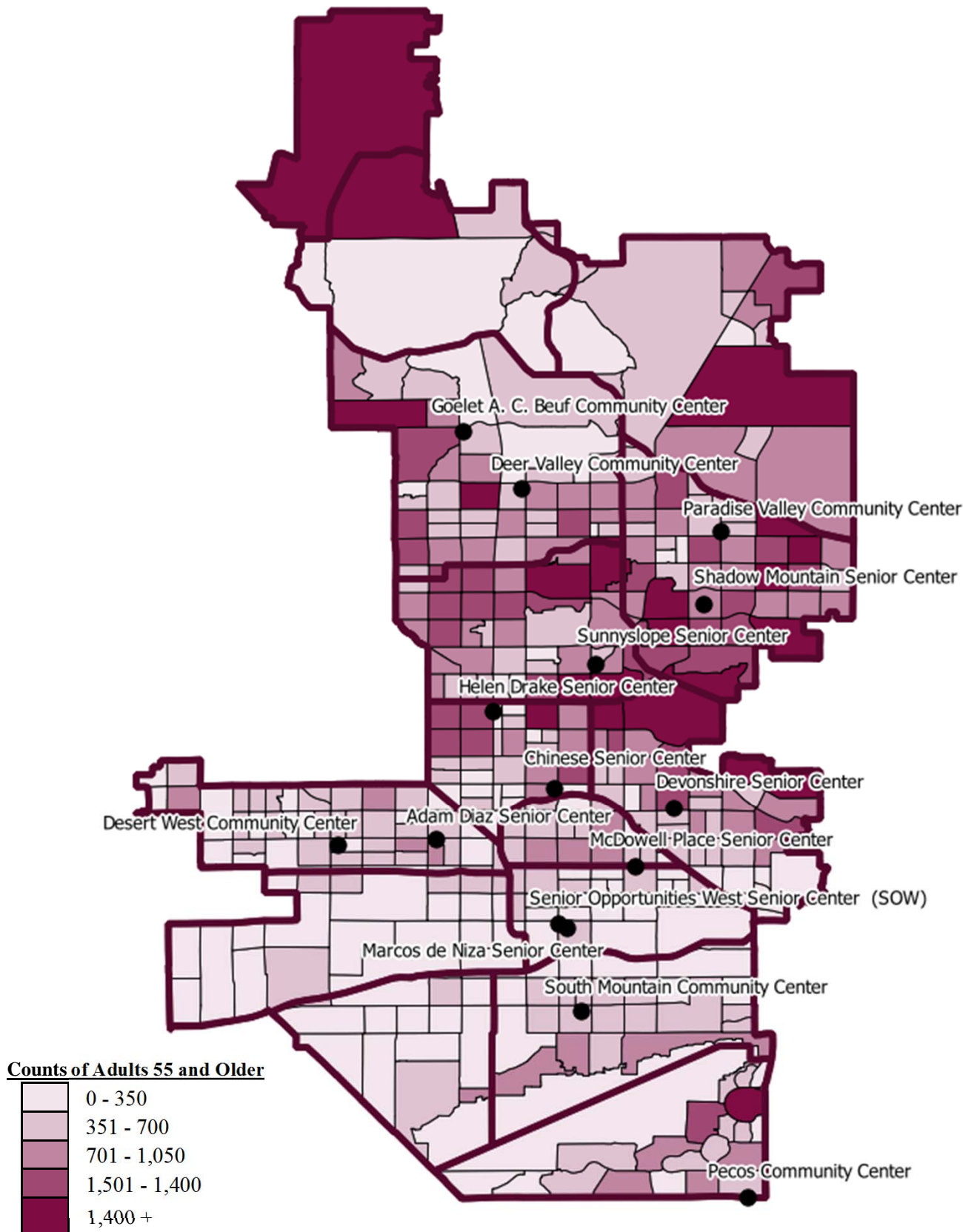
**Appendix J-I: Distribution Of Children Under 5 In Poverty By Census Tract
All Delegate Agencies and Head Start Locations**



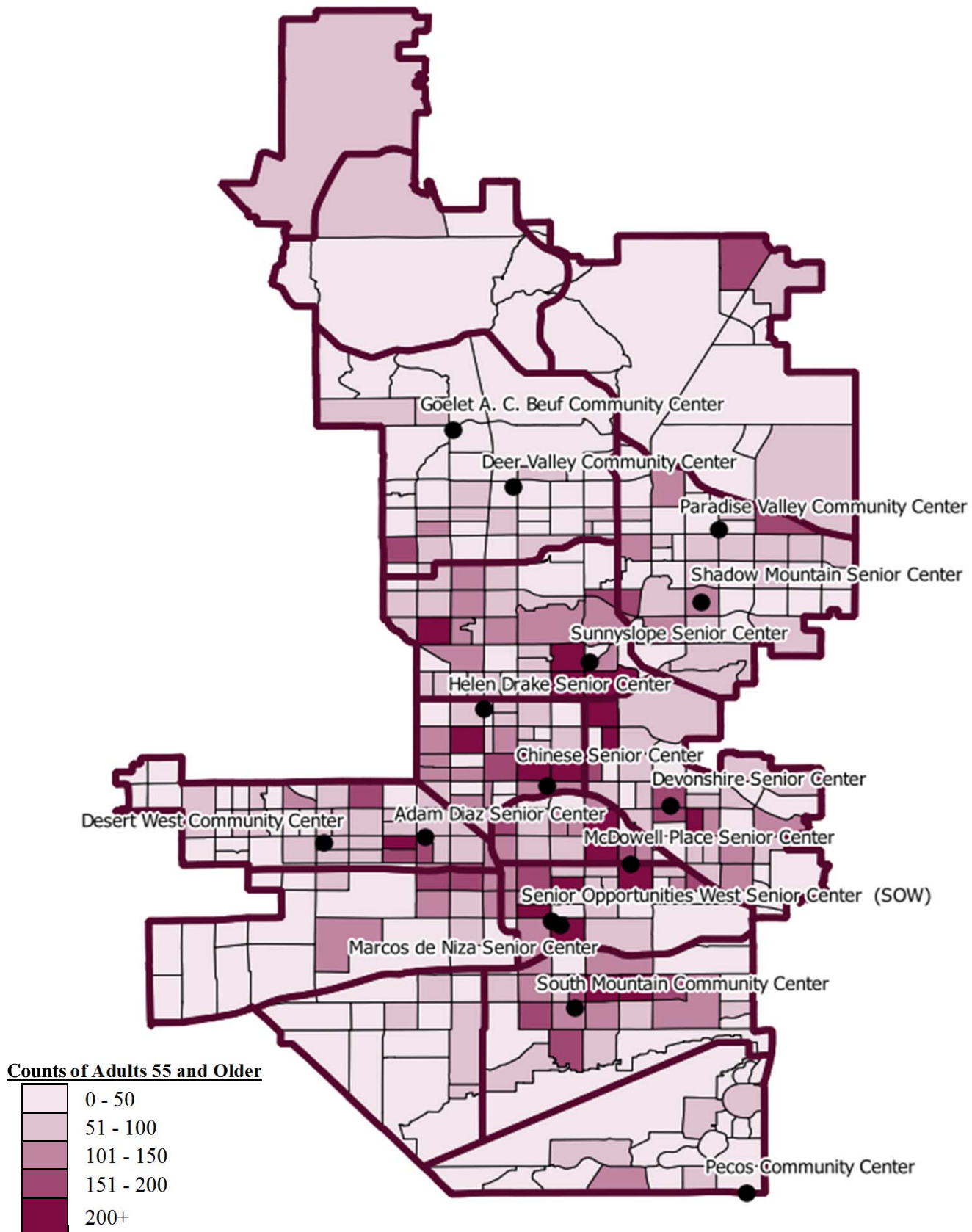
**Appendix J-II: Head Start Service Area Coverage
1 Mile & 3 Mile Diameter Areas from Head Start Locations**



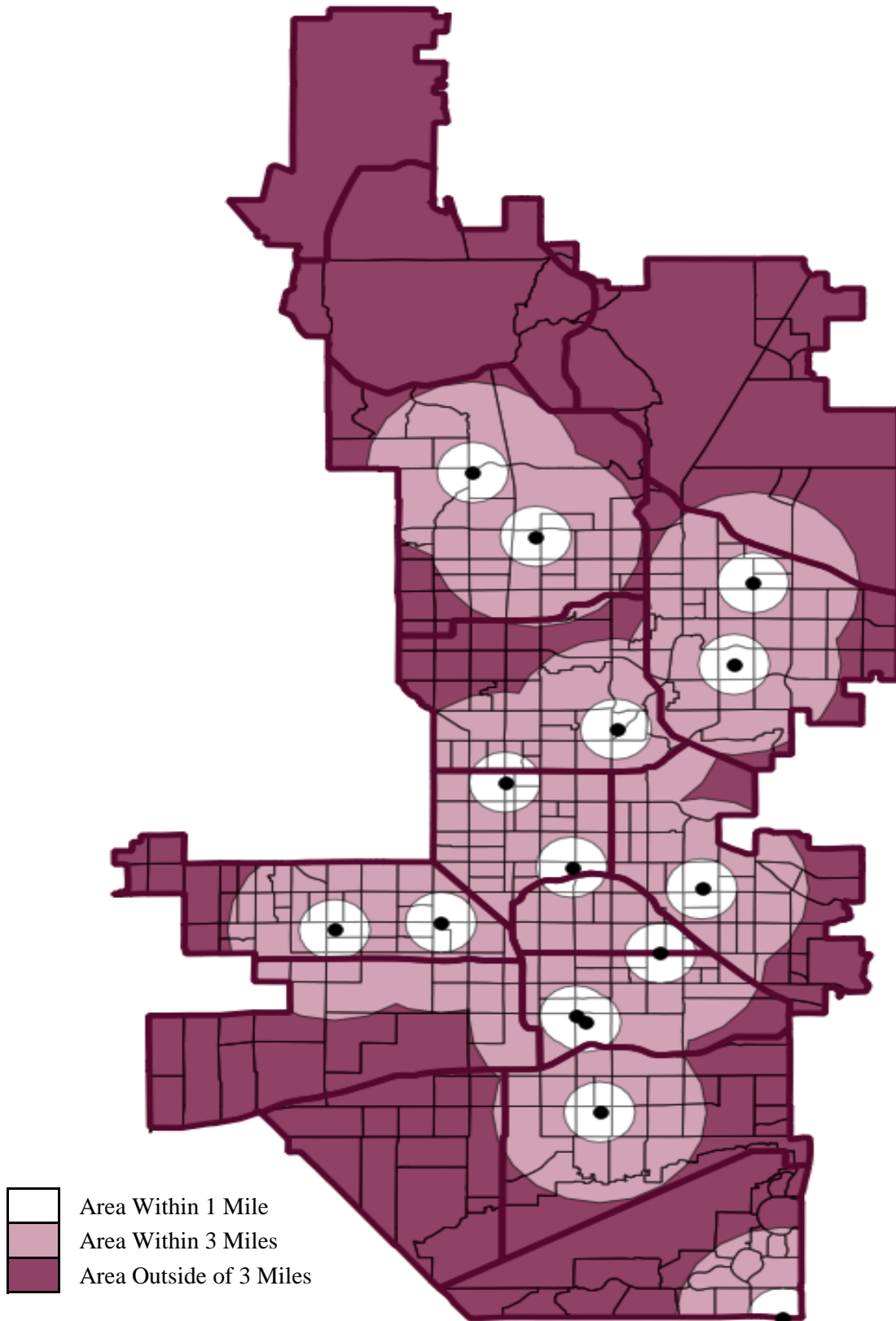
**Appendix J-III: Distribution Of Adults Over 55 By Census Tract
 With Planning Village and Senior Center Locations**



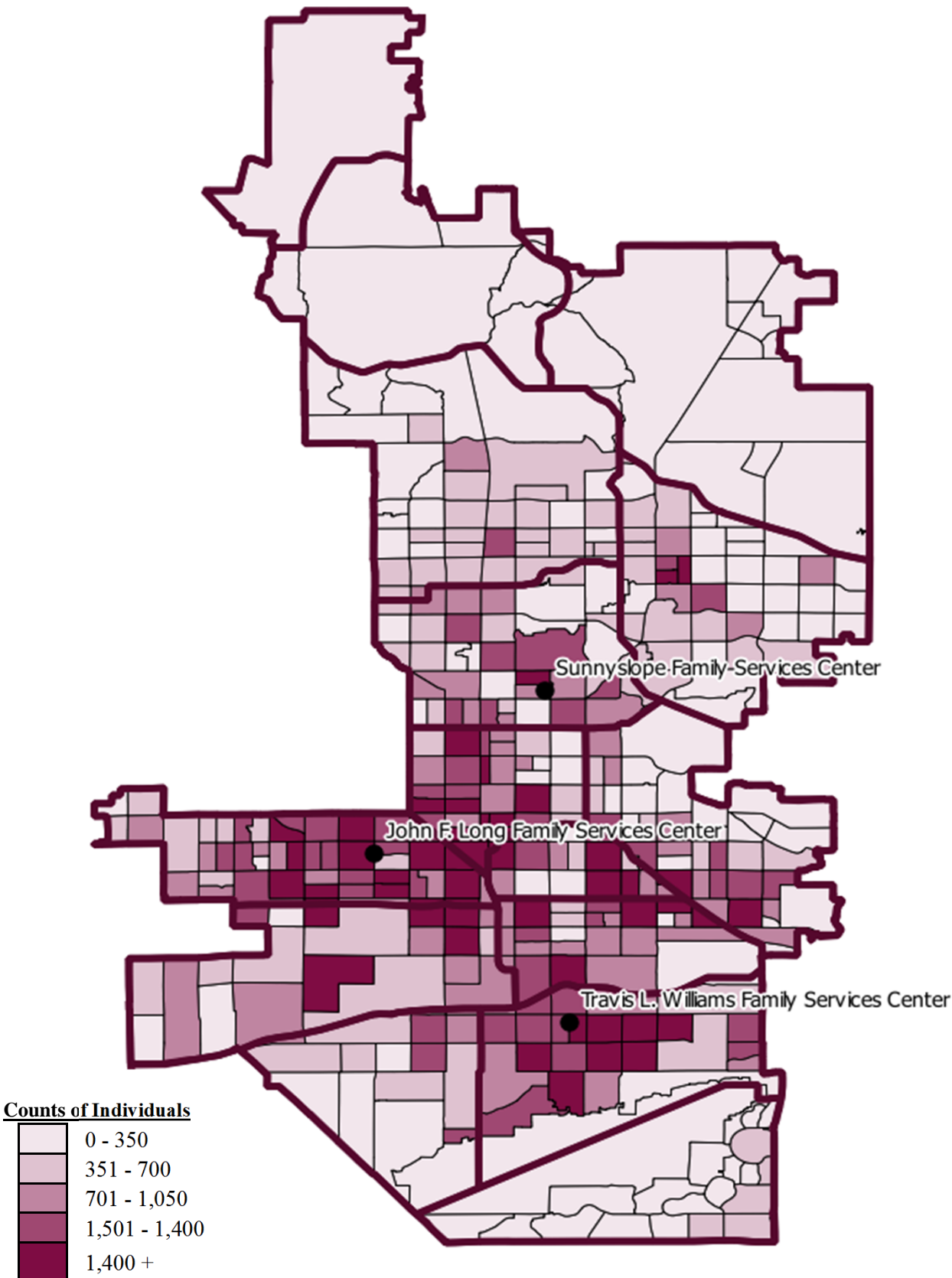
**Appendix J-IV: Distribution Of Adults Over 55 In Poverty By Census Tract
 By Planning Village with Senior Center Locations**



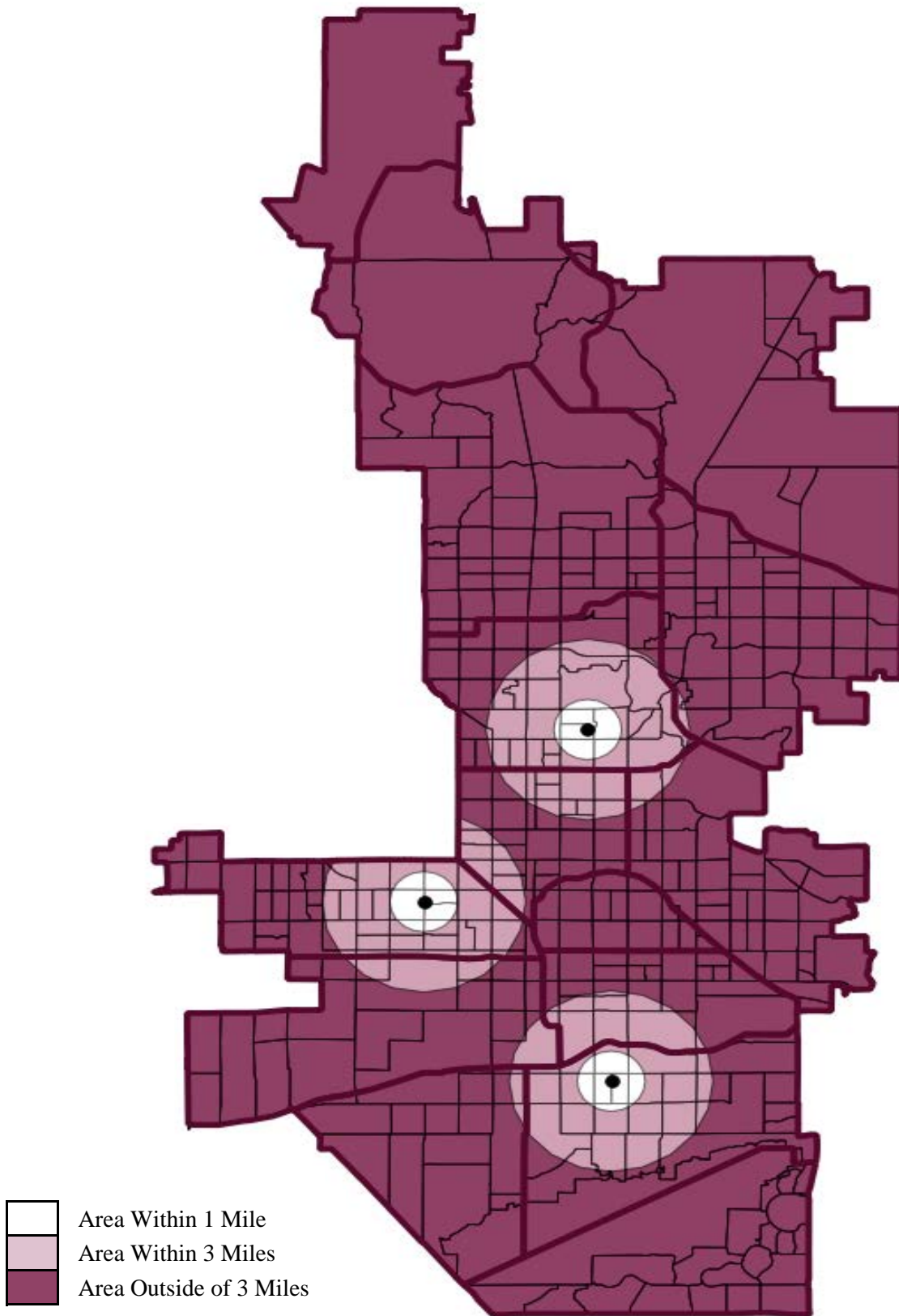
Appendix J-V: Senior Center Service Area Coverage 1 Mile & 3 Mile Diameter Areas from Senior Center Locations
