



HUD Funding Sources

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

Provides resources to address housing and community development needs that benefit low-and moderate- income indiv

HOME Investment Partnership (HOME)

Creates housing opportunities for low-income households

Federal Programs

Housing Opportunities for Persons with HIV/AIDS (HOPWA)

Provides housing assistance and related support services to those living with HIV/AIDS

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)

Assists individuals and families to regain permanent housing after experiencing a housing crisis or homelessness

Overview of the Consolidated Plan

The Consolidated Plan:

- Assists the City in determining community needs for low- to moderate-income households
- Begins a community-wide dialogue to determine community needs
- Outlines strategy for addressing those needs with federal funds







The Annual Action Plan:


- Created every year

- Summarizes the actions and activities that will be funded in that fiscal year













3rd Virtual Public Hearing on March 30, 2022, to review the Draft Annual Action Plan

Draft Annual Action Plan 30-day comment period ends April 27, 2022

Draft Annual Action Plan will be presented to City Council Subcommittee on May 4, 2022

Draft Annual Action Plan will be presented to City Council on May 11, 2022 for approval

Submission of 2022-2023 Annual Action Plan to HUD will occur in May 2022
