

Do you live in a home

built before 1978 in one of our target zip codes? Does a child under 6 years old or a pregnant woman live in the home, or do you care for a child under 6 years old in the home? Do you meet federal income limits?

The home is tested

for lead-based paint hazards and a lead inspection report is created.

The homeowner is notified if lead is found.

If no lead is found, the case is closed.

Complete and submit

ALL needed application materials including proof of income for household members 18 years and older, and submit photo identification.

If lead is found, a

blood sample is collected from children under 6 years old, and nurse shares health information with adults. A consultant or rehab specialist visits the home and discusses health and safety issues. A plan is created to address lead hazards and minor

safety issues.

Licensed, insured lead contractors bid on the project. Homeowner signs an agreement with the City and a contract with the selected lead contractor. If needed, relocation plans are discussed.

Contractor performs

lead work. Home is retested to confirm lead hazards are cleared.

Previously identified health and safety issues are addressed. Rehab specialist and homeowner verify work is complete.

Homeowner receives

LEAD

SAFE PHOENIX

a report showing identified lead hazards have been addressed.

Nurse schedules a follow-up blood test.

Homeowner is responsible for maintaining a **Lead Safe** home.

Homeowner, rehab

specialist and contractor set a date for lead project to begin. The homeowner is advised to move personal property out of the work area.

If needed, relocation is arranged by program staff.
