## Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Renovation, Repair and Painting (RRP) Rule Certification

On March 31, 2008, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued a rule requiring the use of leadsafe practices and other actions aimed at preventing lead poisoning. Under the rule, **beginning on April 22, 2010**, any contracting firm performing renovation, repair and painting projects that disturb lead-based paint in homes, child care facilities, and schools built before 1978 **must be certified** and must follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination. The company must have a certified Renovation Supervisor who may also conduct training for their own company workers. Training for renovation supervisors must be conducted by an EPA accredited training provider. Failure to comply carries a significant penalty.

Since the majority of Neighborhood Services Department (NSD) rehabs occur on properties built prior to 1978, NSD will require all rehab contractors doing business with the department to hold the required EPA certification.
