

Eligibility Requirements

Lead Safe Phoenix is a program funded by a grant from the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Although there is no cost to participate in the program, the following eligibility requirements must be met:

- Applicants must live in a home constructed prior to 1978.
- There must be a child less than six years of age or a pregnant woman living in the home, or there must be a child less than six years of age who spends a significant amount of time in the home (as defined by HUD).
- The home must be in one of the zip codes identified as being at high-risk for lead poisoning.
