

Climate Action Plan (CAP) Approved by Phoenix City Council 2021




Phoenix is aligned with goals of the Paris Agreement to limit temperature increase to 1.5° C.



Accelerated climate change due to human activities.

Climate Change: Greenhouse Gas Effect









How important to you are the following community benefits provided by the implementation of climate solutions?

- 1) Improved air and water quality (77%)
- 2) Leaving a world where future generations can thrive and succeed (76%)
- 3) A more equitable community that addresses climate change for all people living in Phoenix (66%)
- 4) Reduced reliance on fossil fuels (65%)
- 5) Improved health of my family (61%)

2021 Climate Action Plan Greenhouse Gas Emissions Goals

100% carbon neutral electricity by 2030


Community-scale






Long Term Change in GHG Emissions: 2012 to 2020








Long Term Change in GHG Emissions: 2012 to 2020












Long Term Change in GHG Emissions: 2012 to 2020









Meeting Emission Reduction Goal: Emissions 2018 to 2020



- Phoenix Community GHG reduction mid-term goal: 50% below 2018 levels by 2030
- Phoenix community GHG emissions decreased 12.1% from 2018 to 2020.
- 37.9% GHG reduction from 2018 levels by 2030 needed to achieve goal.



Recent Change in GHG Emissions: 2018 to 2020



Community scale

-12.1% Overall GHG Reduction



Emission reductions due largely to retiring of Navajo Generating Station and transition to a less carbon intensive energy grid.

Climate Action Plan Progress



Since 2021, there has been a significant amount of advancement made toward achieving goals

The following are some examples and a few Climate Action Plan goals for reference







2021 Climate Action Plan: Example Goals



- Local Food Systems: All people living in Phoenix will have enough to eat and have access to affordable, healthy, local, and culturally appropriate food.
- Transportation Sector: Increase the community wide use of low carbon fuels (i.e. fuels other than gas and diesel)
- Water: Identify and implement infrastructure projects to ensure water security
- Heat: increase the use of reflective material on projects




Climate Action Plan Progress: Water

2021 Climate Action Plan: Example Goals



- Waste: implement programs to reduce waste, increase the reuse, recycling and recovery of waste materials and promote social and economic value.
- Transportation: reduce single occupant vehicle trips taken to 60% of all trips, through land use and transportation investments that encourage walkable and transit oriented.
- Transportation: accelerate electric vehicle adoption in the community and expand publicly accessible EV charging infrastructure so that 50% of all vehicle sales being electric vehicles by 2030.

Climate Action Plan Progress: Public Works

 Public Works: reroute of recycling/trash collection for more efficiency



Trash and Recycling Day to Change for Most Phoenix Customers

- Public Works signed the plastics pact with the Recycling Partnership and World Wildlife fund to reduce and recycle plastic
- SR85 Landfill gas capture: contract is in place and engineering work is underway with contractor

Climate Action Plan Progress: Transit



 Zero emission and hybrid bus purchase approved by council in 2022

 Bus Rapid Transit (BRT): dedicated lanes, online fares, more frequent service





Climate Action Plan Progress: Sustainability



- City Council approved the Transportation Electrification Action Plan (TEAP) June 2022 in conjunction with Planning and Development
- Energy and Water Saving Projects underway in over 100 City facilities.
- SOLAR for low-income pilot program



City Council Adopts Transportation Electrification Plan

Climate Action Plan Progress: Additional Progress



- City departments collaborating on Monarch habitat creation and protection.
 - 2 acres of monarch habitat on city property in 2022
 - public outreach efforts reached an estimated 183,000 people.



 Other habitat restoration include projects within Rio Reimagined include Rio Salado Oeste and Tres Rios

Climate Action Plan Progress: Additional Progress



- The Office of Heat Response and Mitigation is the first publicly funded local government office focusing on heat
- Planning and Development: walkable urban code

ESG (Environment/Social/Governance) Dashboard: tracks indicators for ESG performance
