NOVEMBER 2014 SPECIAL ELECTION

EARLY VOTING BEGINS

Early voting for the Phoenix Special Election / State General Election begins on Thursday, Oct. 9. In this election, in addition to state offices and issues, registered voters who reside in the City of Phoenix will decide one city proposition. Proposition 487 is an initiative measure proposing an amendment to the Phoenix City Charter related to the city's employee retirement system. The deadline to register to vote in this election is Monday, Oct. 06.

Early Voting by Mail

Phoenix voters who are on the permanent early voting list will be mailed an early ballot by Maricopa County unless they have elected not to receive one for this election. For any voter not on the permanent early voting list who wishes to receive an early ballot by mail, request forms are available online at <https://recorder.maricopa.gov/earlyvoteballotnet/evbrequest.aspx> or by calling Maricopa County Elections at 602-506-1511 no later than 5 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 24, 2014.

Early Voting Locations and Accessible Voting Equipment

Early voting locations will be available in Phoenix and throughout the county for voters to cast an early ballot or exchange a damaged or spoiled early ballot received by mail. Accessible voting devices that permit voters with disabilities to vote independently will be available at these sites.
