The ninth annual Phoenix Bike to Work Day is a cycling event held with Maricopa County that highlights the use of bicycles for regular work-day commutes. Bike to Work also supports the city's FitPHX initiative that strives to make Phoenix one of the healthiest cities in the nation.

Participants can join a police-escorted ride from Park Central Mall to CityScape in downtown Phoenix, or they can make their way to Bike to Work events on their own. Registered participants will receive a T-shirt and are eligible to enter a raffle for a variety of prizes. Participants are also invited to a light breakfast from Chloe's Corner. CityScape also will have bicycle racks for guests to park and lock their bikes while they enjoy their breakfast. While supplies last, free bagels will be available to all other "Bike to Work Day" guests visiting CityScape.
