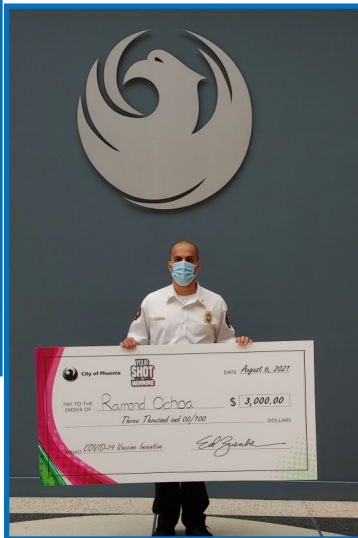
Your Shot at Winning 1st Grand Prize Winners

COVID-19 Testing Update

As of Aug. 11, **employees and household family members** can receive a **Rapid COVID-19 test, which typically produces results in 10-15 minutes while you wait**, at the Assembly Rooms on the first floor of Phoenix City Hall (PCH). The PCH site will replace the Calvin C. Goode Building and Concentra Airport Phoenix Medical Center employee COVID-19 testing locations.

What to Know Before You Schedule an Appointment

Tests are administered on Wednesdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Appointments are required. No walk-ups accepted. This testing is for individuals who are **Not** experiencing COVID-19 symptoms. **If you have any COVID-related symptoms, please do not enter City Hall. Employees with symptoms can [schedule an appointment online for the City of Phoenix Employee Healthcare Clinic](#)**, located at 1 N. Central Avenue.

PCH is located at 200 W. Washington St. in Phoenix (northeast corner of 3rd Ave. and Washington St.).

- ◆ The city will validate up to two hours of parking in the 305 Garage (southwest corner of 3rd Avenue and Washington Street) for employees who don't work downtown.
- ◆ Employees will be required to show a badge to enter PCH.
- ◆ All visitors and employees who don't present a badge will be required to go through the security checkpoint.

City employees are required to schedule all testing appointments by calling 602-534-0693 weekdays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Your six-digit employee identification number is required to confirm the appointment. **To schedule an appointment for a PCR live virus COVID test** at the City of Phoenix Employee Healthcare Clinic, located at 1 N. Central Ave., [visit the clinic website online](#).

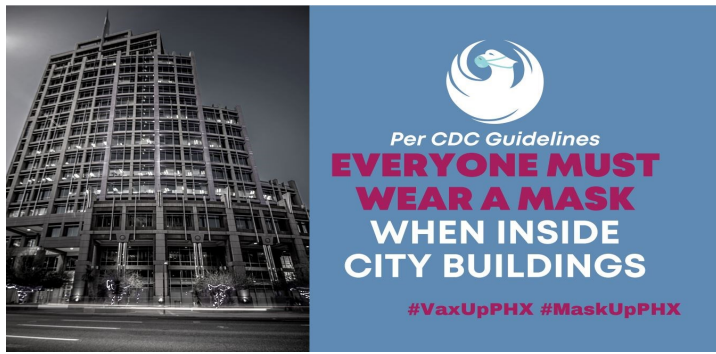
Join the LGBTQ Employee Alliance at Noon on Aug. 19 for Film Discussion about Billie Jean King

Film synopsis:

Billie Jean King is the winner of 39 Grand Slam titles and a major force in changing the cultural landscape. AMERICAN MASTERS looks at the career of the tennis great who never stopped trying to remedy inequality. Perhaps best remembered from "The Battle of the Sexes" match vs. Bobby Riggs on Sept. 20, 1973, her competitiveness on the court was matched by her efforts on behalf of women and the LGBT community, and her commitment to prove there is strength in diversity.

Viewers will see interviews and archival footage, which illustrates the life of a woman whose journey became a battle for equality for all. JOB OF THE WEEK

Event Services Worker \$15.42-18.87/hour

This position performs a wide variety of manual work in support of such activities as conventions, luncheons, commercial exhibitions and theatrical performances at the Phoenix Convention Center and Venues. Duties include setting up and taking down riser seats, portable stages, temporary seating, table arrangements and performing janitorial services. Event Services Workers use equipment such as floor machines, ride-on sweepers and scrubbers, electric carts, along with materials and equipment for cleaning. Work is performed under the supervision of an Event Services Lead and some positions work independently as they gain experience. The Event Services Worker must be able to use graphic instructions such as set-up plans and event specs and communicate in a positive and professional manner with staff and guests. There are multiple positions available, requiring irregular work hours, evenings, and weekends. Employees must be able to work any assigned shift.

Requirements: Must be willing to learn the functions of an Event Services Worker, moving objects weighing up to 50 pounds (less than 20 feet) and available irregular work hours, evenings, and weekends.

“There are almost 50 properties in Phoenix that date back to the 19th century. [Join](#) city of Phoenix Historic Preservation Officer Michelle Dodds as she tells the stories of these historic properties. You will visit the Dougherty - Peterson House (1899), the Rosson House (1895) in Heritage Square, the Evans House (1893) with its unusual "onion" dome, the Jones - Montoya House (1879) the oldest documented house in the city of Phoenix and the

Smurthwaite House (1897), which was moved from 7th St and Fillmore to the Pioneer and Military Memorial Park near the Arizona State Capitol.”
