## Photo exhibit opens this week at Gallery @ City Hall

"Landscape and Lens: The West Photographed," which reveals the varied approaches modern photographers have taken toward landscape in the West, will open Friday, March 13, at The Gallery @ City Hall.

Drawn from the more than 150 photographs in the Phoenix Municipal Art Collection, the exhibit features 28 works by American photographers, including Robert Adams, Paul Caponigro, William Clift, Chris Colville, Byron Darby, Lee Friedlander, Emmet Gowin, Mark Klett, Skeet McAuley, Anne Noggle, Aaron Siskind, Joel Sternfeld and others.

The works date from the late 1940s through the present. Their subjects range from depictions of the luminous beauty of light and landforms that have long attracted photographers and other artists to the West, to examinations of the increasing human role and impact on the landscape.



The images, in black-and-white and color, represent a variety of traditional and digital photographic printing methods.

The exhibition will remain on view through September 2015. The Gallery @ City Hall is open weekdays from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and is located on the ground floor of City Hall.

Celebrating its 30th anniversary this year, the Phoenix Office of Arts and Culture was established by the City Council in 1985 to advance the growth and development of the city's arts and cultural community.

### **Airport expanding Terminal 3 security checkpoint**

Work has begun at Phoenix Sky Harbor's Terminal 3 to create a world-class traveling experience for airport visitors. The first phase of the program is already underway, and by summer of 2016, travelers will enjoy a larger security checkpoint to help them get to their gates faster in addition to modernized, expanded airline ticket counter space to make check-in more convenient.

Already, the old pedestrian walkway outside of the terminal has been removed, the Pet Park has been relocated and two restaurants and a gift shop pre-security have been closed. A temporary bar has opened pre-security near Paradise Bakery, and food remains available before security 24 hours a day.

More changes are on the way. In April, Spirit and Sun Country airlines will relocate to Terminal 2 and Hawaiian Airlines will move from the south concourse of Terminal 3 to the north concourse.
