Open Enrollment ends Nov. 14

Open Enrollment is underway and ends at 5 p.m. Friday, Nov. 14. During Open Enrollment, you can change your enrollment choice for medical, dental, legal insurance and optional life insurance, enroll in Flexrap for 2015, and add or remove dependents from coverage.

New for 2015: you can enroll in the new Buy-up Vision Plan which offers an annual eye exam for every family member covered at no cost to you and great coverage on eyeglasses or contact lenses each year.

Remember, Flexrap enrollment does not roll forward from year to year so you must enroll in Flexrap by 5 p.m. Nov. 14 to be enrolled in 2015. Open Enrollment changes are made using eCHRIS Self-Service.

Open Enrollment Clinics are held weekdays during Open Enrollment. To view the schedule, visit employee.phoenix.gov/hr/benefits. Employees can visit an Open Enrollment Clinic to get a free flu shot, a free biometric screening and receive assistance with completing the annual online health risk assessment. You'll also receive assistance in making Open Enrollment changes using eCHRIS Self-Service at any Open Enrollment Clinic.

Employees have a one-time opportunity during Open Enrollment to remove ineligible dependents from coverage without penalty. Ineligible dependents include an ex-spouse, a domestic partner who has not been approved as a qualified domestic partner, former stepchildren, common-law spouse and foster children.
