COVID-19 TESTING & VACCINE

Rapid COVID-19 tests are now available at the Assembly Rooms on the first floor of Phoenix City Hall, on Wednesdays from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. Employees must schedule appointments for themselves and household family members by calling 602-534-0693 to receive a rapid test, which typically produces results in 15 minutes while you wait. **No walk-ups accepted.**

Employees with symptoms can schedule an appointment online for the city of Phoenix Employee Healthcare Clinic, at 1 N. Central Ave.

This Friday continues the second round of a special COVID pop-up event for city employees. If you recently received the first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine at one of three job site locations, you are now eligible to receive the second dose/booster. **ANY CITY EMPLOYEE MAY ATTEND. Appointments are encouraged, but walk-ins may be available depending on availability.** Here's where the pop-up events will be, all noon - 5 p.m.:

UPDATE: PAUSE ON FEDERAL VACCINE MANDATE

Last month it was announced that because the City of Phoenix is a Federal contractor, the COVID-19 vaccine would be required for all employees by January 18, 2022 as outlined in Presidential Executive Order 14042. Since then, there have been multiple legal challenges. Tuesday morning, a federal judge issued a nationwide preliminary injunction temporarily halting the COVID-19 vaccine mandate for federal contractors.

While there has not been a final legal decision, **the city is pausing the implementation of this federal vaccine requirement** to allow for more time for the court cases to resolve and to further explore our options regarding implementation of the requirement.

We support the rights of employees to make individual health choices, and we must balance that with the rights of every employee to a safe work environment, as well as with the ability to provide necessary services, some of which are provided through Federal contracts.

We also continue to encourage employees who have a medical or religious reason not to be vaccinated to request a religious or medical accommodation by submitting a completed **religious** or **medical** accommodation form and any required supporting documentation to **vaccine.request@phoenix.gov**. Staff from the Human Resources, Equal Opportunity, and Law departments will continue to evaluate the requests even while implementation is paused.

We will continue to provide updates on the vaccine requirement when there are any new developments. Please reach out to your HR liaison with any questions. Thank you.

HVAC/Mechanical Systems Tech II \$26.13 - \$31.84/hourly

This position is responsible for the oversight of preventative maintenance programs, operation of the building automation systems for occupied space comfort, completing more difficult technical tasks involved in operating, maintaining, overhauling, and repairing a variety of air conditioning, heating, ventilation, refrigeration and other mechanical equipment in one or more city of Phoenix buildings.

The work requires the ability to lead and give technical direction to employees, prioritize work assignments, and operate equipment according to manuals, directions, specifications, or warning signals, and to interpret performance charts and control panels which reflect the efficiency of each piece of equipment in the system. Responsibilities include work in the field supervising and directing Building Equipment Operators I, Building Maintenance Workers, and other maintenance support employees according to general or specific instructions received from a Building Equipment Supervisor.

Requirements: Two year of journey level experience in the operation, repair and maintenance of large modern refrigeration and heating systems.

DID YOU KNOW?

You still have time to complete the two steps to qualify for the Wellness Incentive for 2022, even if you missed the Nov. 12 deadline. **Step 1** - Schedule an appointment to see your Primary Care physician, **Step 2** - Complete your online "Real Age Test" using your biometric data. **Wellness Incentive Amounts:**

- ◆ Receive \$40/month when you **OR** an enrolled spouse/qualified domestic partner (QDP) qualify.
- ◆ Receive \$60/month when you **AND** your enrolled spouse or qualified domestic partner (QDP) qualify.

Everyone is invited to the next LGBTQ film discussion! *All of Us* is an investigation of rising HIV cases among African-American women.

A young doctor in the South Bronx embarks on a project to find out why African-American women are becoming infected with HIV at alarming rates. Dr. Mehret Mandefro takes us into the lives and relationship histories of her patients to find out what social factors are putting them at risk. When she expands her research to include women across boundaries of race, class and country, she discovers a dangerous power imbalance that all heterosexual women face in the bedroom, but rarely discuss. All Of Us is about HIV/AIDS but it is not a tragedy. It is a story of resilience, courage and activism.

On Nov. 23, 30 employees from 14 different departments graduated from the updated Emerging Leader's class, the **Emerging Leaders Experience** or **ELX**. This course is for individual contributors that aspire to take on a supervisory role at the city of Phoenix. It provides leadership concepts and self-awareness activities to support an their development and ongoing effectiveness. The goal is to have a better understanding of the skills and motivation to be in a leader role, while encouraging leadership behaviors as an individual contributor.

In addition to the various activities and guest speakers, the program has been changed to include a new leadership model, Ken Blanchard's *Self-Leadership*®.
